and 4000 nurses as part of its programme to make health care facilities available to all people of the country, reports BSS.

"We want to reach medicare facilities to all our citizens, including those living in the remote areas," she said at a function held at Shaheed Suhrawardy Hospital to inaugurate the raising of existing 75 beds to 300 beds.

Sheikh Hasina said health service institutions and infrastructures are being expanded to make full utilisation of these doctors and nurses.

The inaugural function was also addressed by Health and Family Welfare Minister Salah Uddin Yusuf, State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Prof. Mamanullah, Health Secretary Mohammad Ali and director of the hospital Prof M A Zaman.

Sheikh Hasina said at least one nutrition expert would be appointed in each hospital in the country to look into the nutrition problem of the people.

The Prime Minister regretted that the programmes undertaken by father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in the health sector were not implemented. Had it been implemented the condition in the health sector would have been different now, she added.

Sheikh Hasina unveiled the plaque and went round various sections of the hospital.

Int'l Day for the Disabled today

The inaugural ceremony of International Day for the Disabled and the second South Asian Conference of Community-based Rehabilitation Network for the Disabled will be held today at Osmany Memorial auditorium in the city, reports BSS.

The Ministry of Social Welfare and the National Forum of Organisations Working with the Disabled have organised the conference.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is expected to be the chief guest at the ceremony.

Different non-governmental organisations have also planned various programmes including rally, discussion and cultural functions to highlight the significance of the day.

President, PM's messages

Meanwhile, President Shabuddin Ahmed has emphasised on proper education and training for the disabled to make them self-reliant.

"We have got responsibilities towards them like our other family members," said the President in a message yesterday on the eve of the International Disabled Day.

In a separate message, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina wished overall well-being of the disabled.

2 killed in road accidents**By Staff Correspondent**

Two persons were killed in separate accidents in city's Demra area yesterday.

Police said, Salahuddin, 22, a truck driver, was fatally injured as his truck collided with another truck near Shampur on Dhaka-Narayanganj Road at about 4:15 am.

Salahuddin was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) immediately where doctors on duty declared him dead.

In another incident, Ripon, 20, a scooter driver, was killed as a passenger bus hit his scooter from back when it was standing at Postagola tempo stoppage at about 8:30 am, police said.

Ripon, son of Saifqul Alam, died on the spot. Demra police seized both of the killer vehicles but could not arrest any of the drivers.

'Nat'l conservation strategy' awaiting cabinet approval

Speakers at a national workshop yesterday called for formulation of a national wetland policy with an institutional framework for management of wetland resources, reports BSS.

The workshop was presided over by Joint Secretary of Environment Ministry K M Ehsanul Haq and addressed, among others, by former minister A Z M Obaidullah Khan and Manjur Hannan Khan.

Haq said a national conservation strategy (NCS) is now awaiting cabinet approval. As a signatory to the Ramsar Convention, Bangladesh is committed to sustainable development of wetland and Tangail haor management plan, aimed at improving the management of floodplain lake system in the north-eastern part of the country, he added.

Tk 2cr allocated for providing legal aid to poor: Khasru

Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru yesterday said the government has allocated Tk two crore for providing legal aid to the country's justice-seeking poor, reports UNB.

Khasru said this at the first meeting of the recently formed high-powered National Legal Aid Committee on supervision and observation of the activities of 64 district legal aid committees.

The Law Minister said the money was allocated to defray the case expenditure of poor people and a Legal Aid Committee has already been formed in each district of the country.
