Bangladesh-HK tie today

Favourites Bangladesh under-20 cricket team will begin their second round campaign in the World Youth Cup Asian qualifiers when they face hosts Hong Kong today.

Bangladesh Group One champions in the first round with wins unbeaten against Thailand, Malaysia and Nepal, will face Papua New Guinea tomorrow in their last game.

Today's other fixture sees Nepal, who finished second behind Bangladesh, meeting PNG. Both Hong Kong and PNG qualified as champions and runners up of the other group coming ahead of Fiji and Sin-

gapore. Top two finishers will contest the December 7 final.

Dravid's another near miss

BOMBAY, Dec 3: Indian batsmen staved off an early Sri Lankan challenge today to move to a commaning 247 for three by close of the opening day's play in the third and final Test here, reports AFP.

Sri Lankan skipper Arjuna Ranatunga's decision to give India first strike on a seaming wicket paid off initially when Nayan Mongia was bowled in the second over by Pramoday Wickremasinghe.

Another success followed before lunch as Navjot Sidhu was caught trying to hit spinner Kumara Dharmasena over deep mid-on, after belting him for three fours in the previous over, Sidhu made 35.

Rahul Dravid, who made 92 in the second Test at Nagpur, fell once again for 93, but helped India consolidate with a 150-run stand for the third wicket with Saurav Ganguly (92 not out).

Sachin Tendulkar, the Indian captain struggling to find his form, came at the fall of Dravid's wicket and was unbeaten on eight from 61 balls.

Dravid and Ganguly pulled India out of the woods by batting through the afternoon session to post the century stand in 142 minutes off 33 overs.

Sri Lankan coach Bruce Yardley conceded his team had let India off the hook. Dravid, whose innings was

studded with 15 fours, put on 50 for the second wicket with Sidhu, before snatching the initiative in Ganguly's com-Dravid was caught in the

slips trying to drive Ranatunga, falling in the 90s for the fourth time in his 18-Test career. He had made 95 on his debut against England at Lord's last year.

Ganguly, with 218 runs under his belt in the previous two Tests -- including a 99 at Nagpur - justified his promotion to number four ahead of his captain with another elegant knock.



Pakistan clinch the series

Hosts grind Windies down



Resuming at the revised total of 100 for six. West Indies were bowled out for 139 in their second innings in 52 minutes. Pakistan scored a mammoth 471 in reply to the West Indies' first innings total of 303.

This was Pakistan's first home series win against West Indies in 39 years. Pakistan's only other Test series win against them at home was in 1958-59.

West Indies manager Clive Lloyd said the team's performance had been "terrible" and a massive inquiry started after they had lost the first Test at Peshawar also by an innings and 19 runs. They last lost two consecutive Tests by an innings against England in 1957.

"Yes we are quite relieved to beat the Caribbeans after so many years. We really worked hard," said a smiling Pakistan captain Wasim Akram.

Akram's counterpart Courtney Walsh was dejected after his team's second successive loss by such a huge margin.

"We didn't play well as a team. Our batsmen struggle in both the Tests, while bowlers couldn't find the breakthroughs when it mattered," commented a gloomy Walsh. "They (Pakistan) didn't give us a chance and full credit goes to them for beating us convincingly."



Royal honour for Pele

LONDON, Dec 3: Pele, the Brazilian soccer king widely considered the game's greatest living exponent, received an honorary knighthood from Britain's Queen Elizabeth at Buckingham Palace on Wednesday, reports AFP.

The man recently voted by Britons the greatest footballer of all time was made a Knight Commander of the British Empire during a private ceremony at the Palace.

Pele, 57, now Brazil's Sports Minister, can use the letters KBE after his name but cannot use the courtesy title Sir, since the award is honorary.

Such knighthoods are given to recognise the achievements of people from non-British or Commonwealth countries, previous recipients include Irish singer Bob Geldof.

The former Brazilian international — real name Edson Arantes do Nascimento - is currently in Britain with Brazil's President Fernando Hanriques Cardoso who is on a state visit.

Like Cardoso, Pele is staying at the Palace, as guest of the Queen and Prince Philip throughout the four-day visit.

Pele's KBE insignia includes a blue cross on a red ribbon to be worn around his neck, and a gold and silver star for his left breast pocket.

Later today Pele visited Chelsea football club in London where he watched local youngsters training at a local community scheme.

Celebration in Islamic way

TEHRAN, Dec 3 (AP/AFP): Iran's 1998 World Cup qualifying soccer team was given a hero's welcome by 70,000 hysterical, flag-waving fans, including 5,000 women.

Thousands of young Iranian women forced their way into Tehran's huge Azadi Stadium in defiance of the authorities to attend an official welcoming ceremony for the national football team.

The women, dressed in the scarves and black robes or long coats mandatory in the Islamic Republic, surprised the stadium guards and stormed the gates after being turned away on their first attempt, witnesses said.

The official Iranian news agency IRNA estimated the number of women spectators some of whom were carrying the Iranian flag and accompanied by children, at around 5,000. They sat in a separate section from the men.

In a statement carried on Iranian television earlier Tuesday, the National Football Federation asked women to stay away from the welcome party "to safeguard Islam's dignity." Strict Islamic laws, followed in Iran, prohibit mingling of the

IRNA said the Iranian players arrived at Tehran's Mehrabad airport from Dubai and we were flown by helicopter to the Azadi Stadium.

Iran to part with Vierra?

TEHRAN, Dec 3: Brazilian coach Valdier "Badu" Vierra who masterminded the Iranian football team's incredible recovery to reach next year's World Cup finals, may be replaced, the head of Iran's football federation said today.

Daryush Mostafavi, quoted by newspapers, said Vierra may go back to coaching the country's Olympic team for the 2000 Sydney Games, a job the Brazilian was given before being hastily appointed as national coach following Iran's humiliating 2-0 defeat by Qatar in a qualifier last month.

The Iranian official said his federation was considering several international coaches, including Argentina's Carlos Bilardo, former Mexico coach Bora Milutinovic and Johan Cruyff of Holland. Vierra, 53, is a first profes-

sional coach hired by Iran to train the national team since the 1979 Islamic revolution. But several newspapers, eu-

phoric over Iran's surprise qualification ahead of Australia, have criticised the federation for seeking to replace Vierra, who was widely credited here for the victory.

also decided to ensure that none of the five African countries qualified for the finals should be in the same group.

The decision could prove fatal for England. It is now possi-ble that England could find themselves in a group made up of Brazil, Nigeria and Croatia.

England coach Glenn Hoddle said it was not a shock that England had missed out on a place as one of the top eight seeds - and even claimed it could be an advantage to face a powerful team in the group matches.

The England coach said: "I am not surprised as I felt we wouldn't be one of the top seeds,

but I am a shade disappointed.
"But if we do get Germany or Brazil we wouldn't have to play them again until the final. There are two teams which qualify from each group so in many ways it might be an advantage. I am sure other coaches won't be too happy hav-

ing England in their group."

Hoddle added: "The main thing is that we have moved on from four years ago. We have come a long way from then, we are now sixth in the World rankings and lets hope the momentum keeps growing."

Thursday's draw will be carried out in four stages. 1: The eight seeds will be

drawn to see which group they will head. It has already been decided that Brazil will top group A and France group C. 2: Eight of the nine remaining European qualifiers will be drawn.

3: The five African finalists. South Africa, Cameroon, Morocco, Nigeria, Tunisia and the three CONCACAF countries, Jamaica, United States and Mexico will be drawn. 4: The remaining qualifiers,

Chile, Colombia, Paraguay, Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Japan, Iran and the remaining European team not picked in the second stage of the draw.

Sampson stays same

MARSEILLE, France, Dec 3: Steve Sampson learned Tuesday he will coach the United States through the World Cup, and the Americans found out they could draw a first-round group that might include Germany. England and Colombia, or they could get lucky and draw Romania, Scotland and South Korea, reports AP.

- In seeding the seams for Thursday's World Cup draw, the FIFA World Cup organizing committee determined the United States won't have an African opponent in the first round. That means the United States could be in a very strong

group or a very weak one. But Sampson, who took over from Bora Milutinovic on April 14, 1995, definitely will be in charge.

"We are very confident that he and his players are up to the challenge ahead," US Soccer Federation president Alan Rothenberg said.

As the Americans struggled in qualifying for the 32-team tournament, which runs from June 10-July 12, Rothenberg refused to say whether he would exercise Sampson's 1998 op-
