Of the respondents, 88.5 per cent said that it was impossible to get quick and fair judgement from the court without "money or influence", while 55.3 per cent said they made payment for bribe.

Seventy-one per cent alleged that police deliberately delayed sending cases to the court while 49.5 per cent said they made "prior arrangement" with police for disposal of their cases. Seventy-four per cent said

they used "extra-regular method" for admission of their children into schools. Donation was the usual 'extra-regular method', followed by political influence and private tu-

"One out of five households believe that unethical practice exist in the admission procedure," the survey report said.

Thirty per cent of the respondents claimed that they got their electricity bills reduced through "arrangement" with meter readers while 47 per cent said they reduced their holdings tax on houses and property through "arrangement" with municipal staff on payment of
