

Tests becoming obsolete?

Two lacklustre and drawn Test matches between India and Sri Lanka have brought into sharp focus the question whether the fiveday cricket encounters have

become an anachronism. Often described as "organised loafing", the tradition of the five-day game, which the purists among cricket lovers still defend valiantly, comes under strain every time a series fails to produce results. The current Test series between India and Sri Lanka has lent itself to somewhat uncharitable scrutiny precisely for that reason.

The Sri Lankans' international reputation as great oneday cricket entertainers has not helped the matters on both sides of the divide. The purists argue that the primary purpose of Test cricket is not spectator interest. They believe it is for the connoisseurs and "not anyone who can distinguish a bat from a pad", as one of them says it. But the modernists say the Test cricket is too "ponderous and insipid for modern times" and reject it as "obsolete."

A former Indian Test player, who does not want to be named and believes both the one-day and five-day games have their distinct places, says "Even the five-day game should be played with the spirit of the one-day game. One cannot afford to ignore spectator interest. After all someone has to pay for the connoisseurs too. It is like champagne and beer. Both are drunk for different reasons and different moods. There is room for both.'

What the modernists find particularly galling is the first Test match at Chandigarh where the Sri Lankans played a painfully defensive game. "Arjuna Ranatunga's tactics to bowl almost 140 overs with an old and soft ball and very often far down the leg stump may have been Sri Lanka's interests.

but it was certainly not in the interest of the five-day game," a senior Mumbai-based cricket

commentator said. Even Ranjit Fernando, the Sri Lankan commentator, was quoted by Indian newspapers as saying that "Personally I do not appreciate the negative tactics the Lankans employed when they bowled the leg stump line".

But he said Ranatunga was consciously trying to avoid a defeat. There are those who hold the Indians equally responsible. Former Indian captain Dilip Vengsarkar said since the Lankans had made their intentions clear the Indian players should have adapted themselves to the situation. He said they could have used the sweep shot more effectively.

Beyond these finer details of the game for the ordinary spectator the Test series so far has been dull. Crowds at Chandigarh and Nagpur were disconcertingly low. A television commentator travelling with the team said privately," think both the teams have forgotten that there are ordinary people who come to see the game. This is particularly true of the Sri Lankans who have such a flattering image as a oneday side. No one expects them to play the Test cricket like the one-day game, but they could at least stop being so defensive."

The commentator particularly said it did not appear as if the Sri Lankans were playing to their much-talked about plan to become world beaters in Test cricket by the turn of the century under "Project 2000."

Some circketers believe that the Test versus one-day debate is overplayed. They say the whole question boils down to whether cricketers worldwide can reorient the five-day game keeping in mind pressures of modern living on spectator time." May be the International Cricket Council can work out ways in which Test cricket becomes more than just a connoisseur's delight. Even if a Test match ends in a draw, it should have enough entertainment for ordinary spectators. No one expects cricketers to be strictly entertainers, but no one wants them to bore spectators either, says one former player.

A leading advertiser during major one-day playoffs says "Test cricket has lost its appeal because it does not guarantee a critical minimum spectator support. We are much better of in the one-day game because a result is guaranteed, enter-tainment is guaranteed and spectator interest is guaranteed We see the one-day game as a natural progression for the Test cricket. There no point resist-

Abhijit Desai, a Mumbaibased "cricket fanatic", sums up the ordinary spectator's expectations of the game." I do not care if it is the five-days or oneday as long as cricketers play for a result. Let us face it cricket can no longer be a game played on a rare sunny day in an English county played by two dozen players and cheered by half a dozen retired Englishmen. It has to guarantee entertainment."
