NID observed in Ctg, Khulna, Rajshahi

CHITTAGONG, Dec 7: The fourth National Immunization Day-97 (NID) was observed in the city today with a call for eradicating polio from the country by the year 2000, reports BSS.

Chittagong City Mayor Alhaj ABD Mabiuddin Chowdhury formally inaugurated the day at Emmon hospital by administering a dose of polio to a child, a City Corporation press release said.

The NID programmes will also be conducted in different parts of the city tomorrow.

Some three lakh children under the age of five will be fed polio vaccine and high powered Vitamin A capsule to make the programmes a grand success as many as 6,000 volunteers have been deployed to conduct the immunization programmes through one thousand centres in 41 wards of the City Corporation.

Khulna

KHULNA, Dec 7: The fourth National Immunization Day (NID) was observed here as elsewhere in the country with about eighty thousand children registered under five years within City Corporation area for feeding of polio vaccine aimed at eradicating the scourge of polio disease from the country by the year 2000, reports BSS.

Today's programme began with Mayor of Khulna City Corporation Shaikh Tayebur Rahman formally feeding children polio vaccine at the city's corporation school premises. At least three hundred fifty centres were opened in thirty

one corporation wards to facilitate children to get vaccinated and vitamin A capsules. About two thousand volunteers worked to make the programme successful.

Rajshahi

RAJSHAHI, Dec 7: First round of the 4th national immunisation programme was observed at the divisional headquarters today despite harsh called by main opposition BNP and its six allies, reports BSS.

Rajshahi City Mayor Mizanur Rahman Minu formally opened the day at a function held at local Bhubomoh Park.

The authority concerned opened 330 centres in 30 wards of the city to feed two doses of polio vaccine to about 55,000 children below 5 years and vitamin A capsule.

Despite harsh, a large number of parents fed their children polio vaccine and vitamin A capsule with the objective to eradicate polio virus from the country by the year 2000.

The second round of the immunisation programme will be held on January 18.

Torturing of maid

Main accused yet to be arrested

The police Sub-Inspector's wife accused of torturing a 10-year-old maid at their house in city's Motijheel thana compound on Thursday, is yet to be arrested.

Motijheel police said they had searched different parts of the city to arrest Runa Akhter, wife of SI Shamim of Sutrapur thana. Besides, a police team was also sent to the home-town of Runa in Khulna.

The maid, Mahmuda Akhter Alias Mahi, sustained serious injuries when Runa allegedly beat her up and poured hot water on her body.

Runa, mother of a baby girl, became angry after the maid messed up with domestic work in the morning.

Motijheel police said they filed a case under the Women and Children Repression Control Act of 1995 on the day of the incident although it was reported that police were initially reluctant to file the case.

The maid is now under treatment at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Meanwhile, the Home Minister yesterday directed the Police Headquarters to probe into some reported irregularities in the Motijheel thana.

The minister visited the thana on Saturday in connection with the torture of the maid, ministry sources said.

It said Naik Md Yunus was wounded at Jurain rail gate area, Constable Md Babar Ali near Ghati Bus Terminal and Sub-Inspector Abdul Momin at Kazi Alauddin Road.

Several other police personnel received minor injuries, the release added.

Home Minister Rafiqul Islam visited the injured police personnel at Rajbari Police Hospital yesterday afternoon. Inspector General of Police Mohammad Ismail Hossain, DMP Police Commissioner AFM Mahmud Al Farid and other senior police officials were also present.

Police said one Shamin was wounded by a bomb hurled by BNP activists at Alubazar at 4 am and Shuba at North-South Road at 4:30 am, while the pickets damaged a BRTC bus which reached Fulbari crossing from Gopalganj at 4:30 am, even before the start of the hartal hours.
