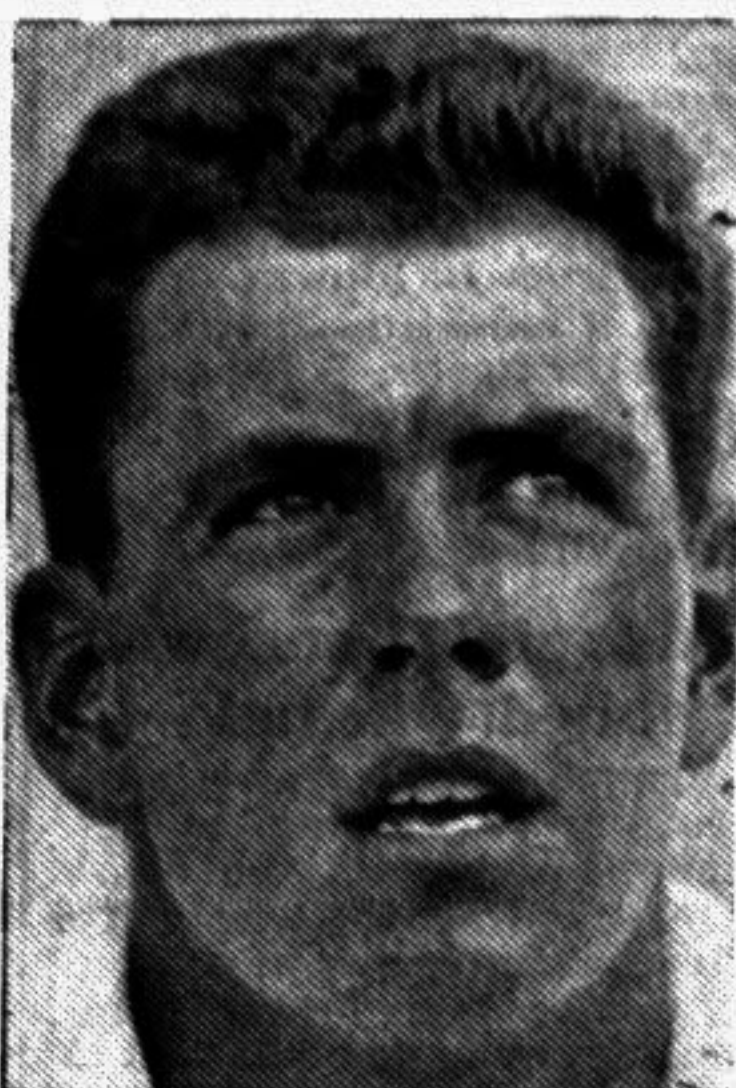

**McEnroe best among seniors**

LONDON, Dec 8: John McEnroe took the ATP Senior Tour of Champions' title in London's Albert Hall on Sunday but not before one of his trademark tirades of old, reports Reuters.

The fiery American, who opted for a navy-blue T-shirt and black trainers over the traditional tennis whites, beat France's Henri Leconte 6-2, 3-6, 10-5 (correct) in the tie-break.

Trailing 3-5 in the second set, the 38-year-old reminded spectators of another of his traits, his ability to ruffle officials and opponents by arguing against decision.

He disputed an official's call of out on his first service at 15-30 by climbing over the net and putting a ball down on the line. After the umpire refused McEnroe's demand to overrule the call, he turned to the official and said: "You are full of s...".

**Super duo's vintage show**

South Africa coach Mario Zagallo praised Romario and Bebeto, who have teamed together less frequently since 1994.

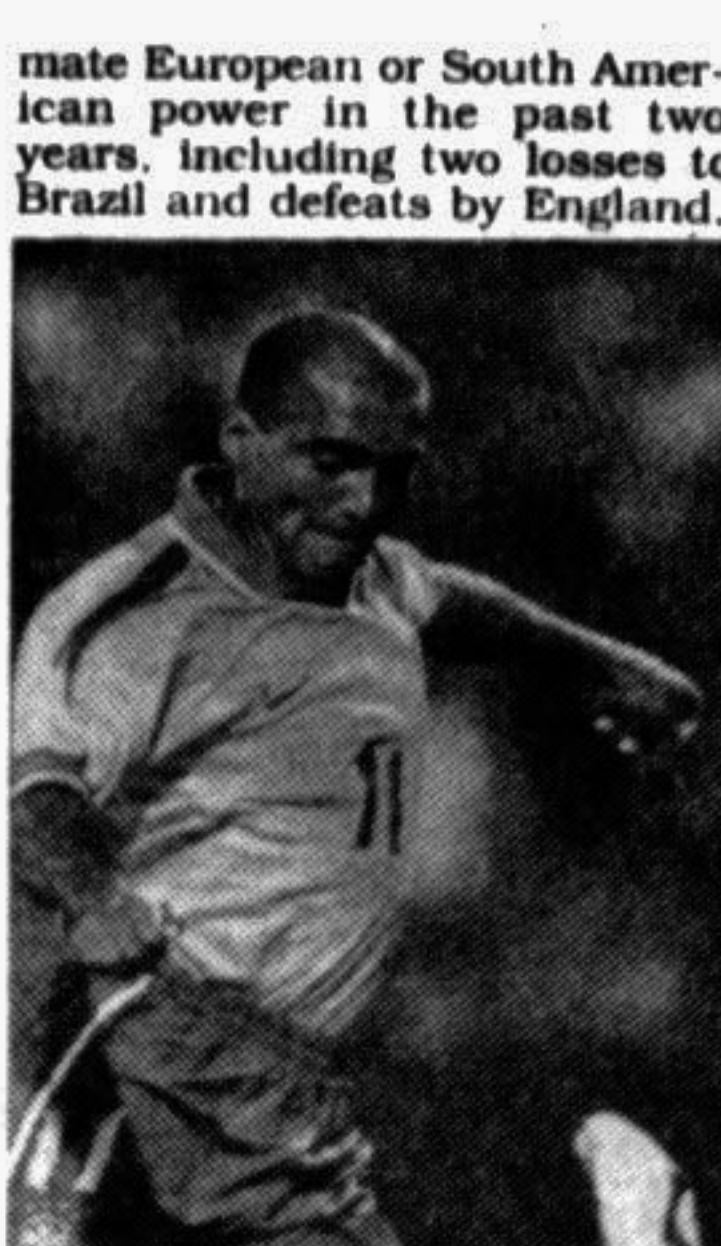
Rising stars such as Ronaldo, who missed the match due to games for Inter Milan on Saturday and Tuesday, have crowded the lineup and given Zagallo a problem of too much talent.

Romario said he enjoyed pairing with Bebeto, but the most important thing was the victory. Brazil's fourth straight on its world tour after triumphs over Mexico, South Korea and Japan.

"I think I showed what I can do," the swift forward said of his chances of playing a significant role on next year's World Cup squad. "I'm going to continue to work hard to make the team. I know we have a lot of good players."

For South Africa who qualified for the finals for the first time since they returned to international arena in 1992 after being banned two decades because of apartheid, it was another defeat to a world soccer power.

Despite a strong record in Africa, including an African Nations' Cup triumph in 1995, they have yet to defeat a legitimate European or South American power in the past two years, including two losses to Brazil and defeats by England.

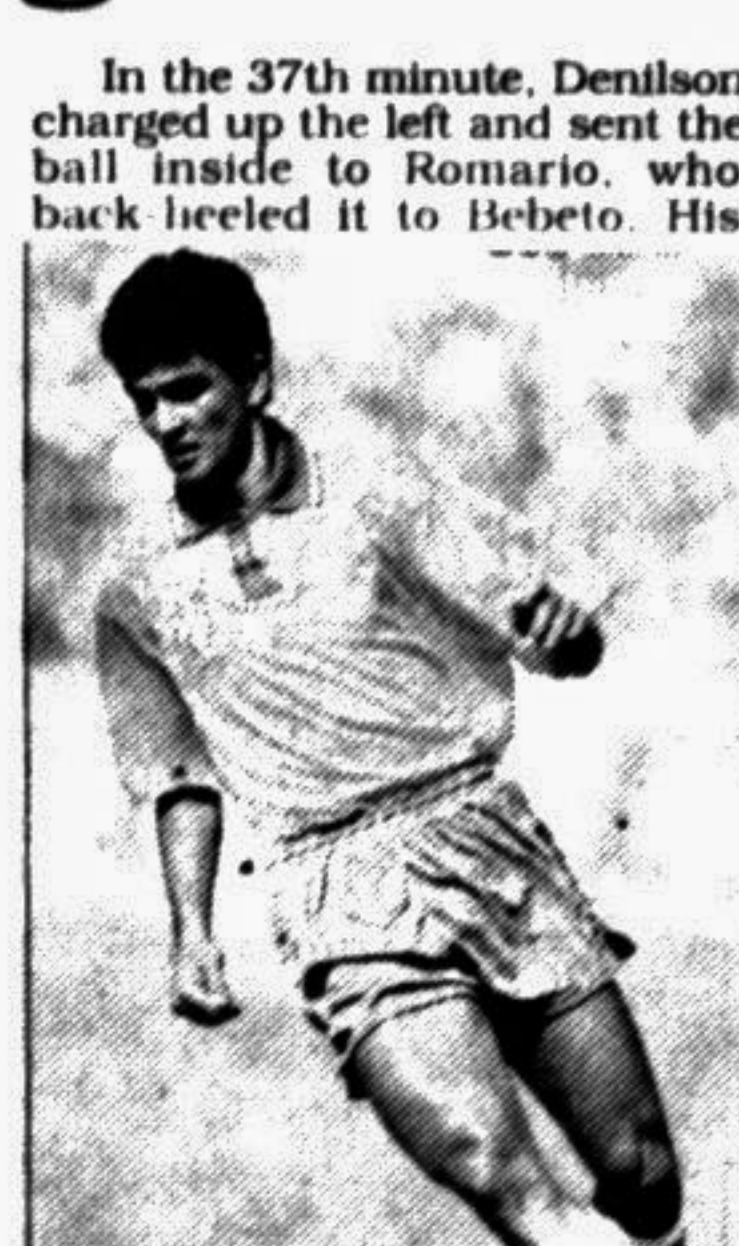
France, Germany and Holland. "We deserved to have a draw as I believe we had them under tremendous pressure in the second half," said South African coach Clive Barker. "Another five minutes and I am sure we would've got a result."

Brazil used a four-man mid-field in the first half Sunday, led by Denilson and Dunga, the captain, with Romario and Bebeto relying on their quickness to break into the South African zone.

It paid off quickly, with Romario taking a long pass from Dunga on the right side and chipping a shot over charging goalkeeper Andre Arendse to score in the 10th minute.

Barker insisted the play was offside, though Romario appeared inside when Dunga made the pass.

Brazil controlled much of the play, registering five shots to three in the first half and getting the only three corners awarded.

first shot went off South Africa's captain Lucas Radebe, but Bebeto got it back and easily beat Arendse in close for a 2-0 lead.

The quicker Brazilians constantly prevented any serious scoring chances until Mkhalele, who came on in the 52nd minute for Willem Jackson, charged down the left side and popped the ball inside.

Brendan Augustine outjumped towering defender Junior Baiano to get it back to Mkhalele, who scored easily past goalkeeper Dida.

Asked his assessment of South Africa, Zagallo said he thought Barker a squad could advance from Group C, where they face hosts France, Denmark and Saudi Arabia.

"My point of view, not only mine but that of many people, is that the African continent is definitely getting better," he said. "It's very good soccer... I think it is growing tremendously."

**European soccer scene**

LONDON, Dec 8 (Reuters): Ajax Amsterdam and Kaiserslautern left little doubt at the weekend that they both intend to be number ones at Christmas.

While title races hotted up elsewhere, with Juventus closing in on Inter Milan in Italy and Barcelona knocking Real Madrid off the top in Spain, the championship contest in the Netherlands and Germany cooled.

In the case of Ajax, a credibility gap emerged as total football gave way to total domination. Their 1-0 home win against Roda JC Kerkrade, sealed with a 10th minute Tijani Babangida goal, was one of their least impressive of the season yet it stretched their overall league lead to a massive 15 points.

Ajax have now won 17 out of 18 league games this season, drawing the other one against Roda in October, and were helped further by their closest rivals PSV Eindhoven losing 4-1 at Willem II Tilburg.

Kaiserslautern meanwhile beat second-placed Bayern Munich 2-0 on Friday to open a seven-point lead.

**ITALY**  
Champions Juventus beat Lazio 2-1 on Saturday with two goals from Alessandro Del Piero that cut the gap at the top of Serie A to two points.

Leaders Inter Milan had Brazilian striker Ronaldo back on the scoresheet with a ninth minute goal against Sampdoria but that match ended in a 1-1 draw.

Equal third placed Roma and Udinese also kept in the hunt, three points behind Juventus, with home wins against Atalanta Bergamo and Bologna respectively.

German striker Oliver Bierhoff scored twice for Udinese in a 4-3 win. Bologna played the last half hour with 10 men after Michele Paramatti was sent off.

**ENGLAND**  
Chelsea dealt Tottenham Hotspur their heaviest home

defeat in 62 years, winning 6-1 to maintain their challenge to leaders Manchester United.

United beat Liverpool 3-1 at Anfield, two of the goals scored by Andy Cole, to stay three points clear of second-placed Chelsea — who were also drawn as their first opponents in the FA Cup draw on Sunday.

Blackburn Rovers were a point behind Chelsea in third place thanks to a 3-1 win at home to Bolton.

At the bottom of the league, Everton ended a run of five successive defeats with a draw at Leeds, whose former great Billy Bremner died on Sunday.

**GERMANY**  
Kaiserslautern were sitting comfortably at the top after beating second-placed Bayern 2-0 but third-placed VfB Stuttgart moved to within three points of Bayern with a 3-1 win at TSV 1860 Munich.

**SPAIN**  
Barcelona emerged from a

month-long crisis to knock Real Madrid off the top of the league in Spain.

The Catalans beat Real Zaragoza 2-1 in their best game of the season under former Ajax coach Louis Van Gaal while Real Oviedo in for a late Realiser and drew 1-1.

**FRANCE**  
Monaco and Metz stayed deadlocked at the top of the league with Paris St Germain a point behind.

Striker David Trezeguet kept Monaco on top on goal difference with a late goal in a 2-1 win over Olympique Lyon, who had taken an early lead, while Metz beat Chateauroux 2-0. PSG beat Cannes 1-0 away.

Monaco and Metz are both unbeaten in six games. PSG were reduced to 10 men in the 85th minute when defender Eric Rabesandratana was sent off but Ral scored the winner two minutes later.

**Hingis stoops to Huber**

FRANKFURT, Dec 8: Anke Huber of Germany battled five sets for an upset of favourite and World No. 1 Martina Hingis in the final of the first Masters of Champions tennis tournament Sunday, reports AP.

The match, Huber's only tournament win this season, started off as expected with the 17-year-old Hingis rushing off to a 6-2 first set win.

Huber pulled even taking the second set 6-3, with Hingis bouncing back with a 6-2 third set, and Huber winning the fourth with the identical result as Hingis appeared to be tiring.

Then the battle started. Hingis held her serve in the first game of the fifth set, then broke Huber's serve in the second game at zero, with the help of one of many net rollers in the match, and a double-fault by Huber.

But the 23-year-old Huber, who has dropped from No. 6 in world rankings to 14 this season, got a rebreak against Hingis in the third game then held her own serve to tie the last set at 2-2.

Both women held their services to go to 5-5, with the volleys getting longer and the crowd loudly applauding as the two chased down shots that seemed impossible to return.

But the young Swiss star tired and in the 11th game and with the help of yet another net roller, Huber broke Hingis' service to pull ahead 6-5.

Hingis fought to come back in the last game going ahead 30-0, but Huber recovered to win the set 7-5, the match and a purse of 675,000 marks (\$91,000 dollars).

Hingis, who ends the 1997 season with 79 matches won against only six losses, got 575,000 marks (\$24,858 dollars) as the runner-up.

No world ranking points were awarded for this 2.75 million marks (1.6 million dollars) tournament.

**Confederations Cup Barker names squad**

JOHANNESBURG, Dec 8: Ajax Amsterdam forward Benedict McCarthy, who missed South Africa's 2-1 defeat to Brazil on Sunday, was dropped from the squad playing in this week's Confederations Cup tournament in Saudi Arabia, reports AP.

Coach Clive Barker, paring the side down to the 20 players allowed, also left off striker Shaun Bartlett, defenders Pierre Issa, Brian Sebopole and Alex Bapela and goalkeeper Mark Anderson.

Only Bartlett and McCarthy were considered possible starters or substitutes in the eight-nation tournament that includes world champion Brazil, the Czech Republic, Uruguay, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates and Australia.

Barker said Bartlett fell victim to a numbers crunch as he opted for veterans Phill Masigina of Bari and Mark Williams with youngsters Brendan Augustine and Pollen Ndianya up front.

Augustine, a second-half substitute against Brazil, out-leaped towering defender Junior Baiano to head the ball to Helman Mkhalele for South Africa's lone goal Sunday.

Masinga is South Africa's leading goal scorer, while Williams scored both goals in the 2-0 victory over Tunisia in 1995 that clinched the African Nations Cup.

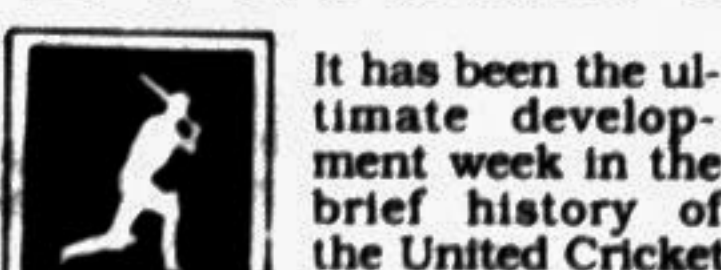
McCarthy has come under criticism from Barker for staying with Ajax Amsterdam instead of coming home for international matches.

**Proteas smile under new sun**

It has been the ultimate development week in the brief history of the United Cricket Board of South Africa. Black cricket has had its moments in the past, notably when Basil d'Oliveira was called up for his England Test match debut and when Omar Henry was picked first for the World Cup squad in 1992 and then later for his Test match debut against India.

But surely neither of these events can claim the significance of what has happened around South Africa in the course of the last 10 days in November. D'Oliveira and Henry were players who prevailed over enormous odds and obstacles to achieve the highest honours the game has to offer; what has happened now is the clearest evidence possible that black cricket is about to explode into one of the most exciting revolutions the game has

erased a provincial record that had stood for more than 70 years.

Then another 20-year-old, Lungile (Loots) Bosman, who hails from Galeshewe township, Kimberley, celebrated his first-class debut by making 96 for Griquas against Free State at Springbok Park. Had he made another four runs, he would have become the youngest player since 19-year-old Jonty Rhodes in 1988 to score a first-class century on debut.

Bosman's innings — he is incidentally a Xhosa — included a Griqua record, fifth-wicket standard of more than 200 with local dominee Piet Barnard that erased a provincial record that was almost as old as the Eastern Province one.

"It has been a week of enormous significance for South African cricket," said UCB managing director Ali Bacher. "The most important thing is that it is going to provide so much hope for the many aspiring cricketers in our townships. They have seen what can be achieved and nothing will stop the momentum now."

"Perhaps this does also show that the UCB's development programmes are working. Both Toyana and Bosman are the products of regional academies of excellence organised by Conrad Hunt, former vice-captain of the West Indies and chief development coach of the UCB."

"I couldn't quite put my finger on it when I first saw Bosman play," Hunt recalled. "But I felt at the time there was something special about him. I am not saying that he has anything like the same talent but he plays the game with a style and with a lateness of stroke that is reminiscent of the great Frank Worrell."

"On the strength of what I had seen back in 1995, we immediately included him in the South African team for the Zone Six development tournament in Tanzania and he was nominated for this year's Plascon Academy in Johannesburg."

Bosman is a righthanded batsman with an attacking outlook and he complements this with medium-pace seamers.

"He struggled when he first came to the academy," said Bacher. "But he provided the justification of holding the academy course over a period of several months. He just needed to build up his confidence. That came when the

**Moody gets a surprise call**

MELBOURNE, Dec 8: Veteran Tom Moody won a surprising recall to Australia's limited-overs team Monday for Tuesday's match against South Africa at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, reports AP.

The West Australian and Warwickshire captain last played an international match on Jan 12, scoring 46 off six overs against the West Indies.

The 32-year-old's call up was surprising considering the selectors' attitude of bringing young players into the lineup this season.

"I don't think I'm too old," Moody said Monday. "I think I've got plenty of cricket to play... I still feel fit enough and keen enough to represent and do well for my country."

"I think I'm in the peak of my career now so I feel I can offer some good years of cricket ahead."

Moody will replace paceman Glenn McGrath, who suffered a stomach muscle injury in Sunday's thrilling three-wicket win over New Zealand at Adelaide Oval.

His crisp, powerful hitting and nagging seamers, shape as valuable commodities against the tough South African team.

Moody scored a brilliant 110 in the current Sheffield Shield match against Tasmania in Perth, in front of national chairman of selectors Trevor Horns.

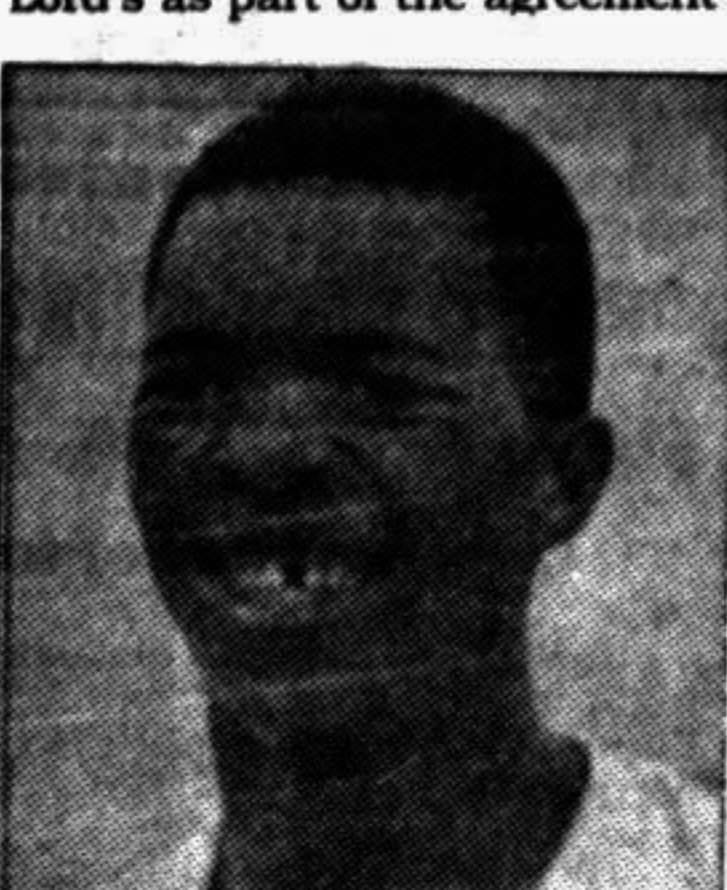
He has played one-day internationals, scoring 766 runs at 23.93 and taking 21 wickets at 40.66.
