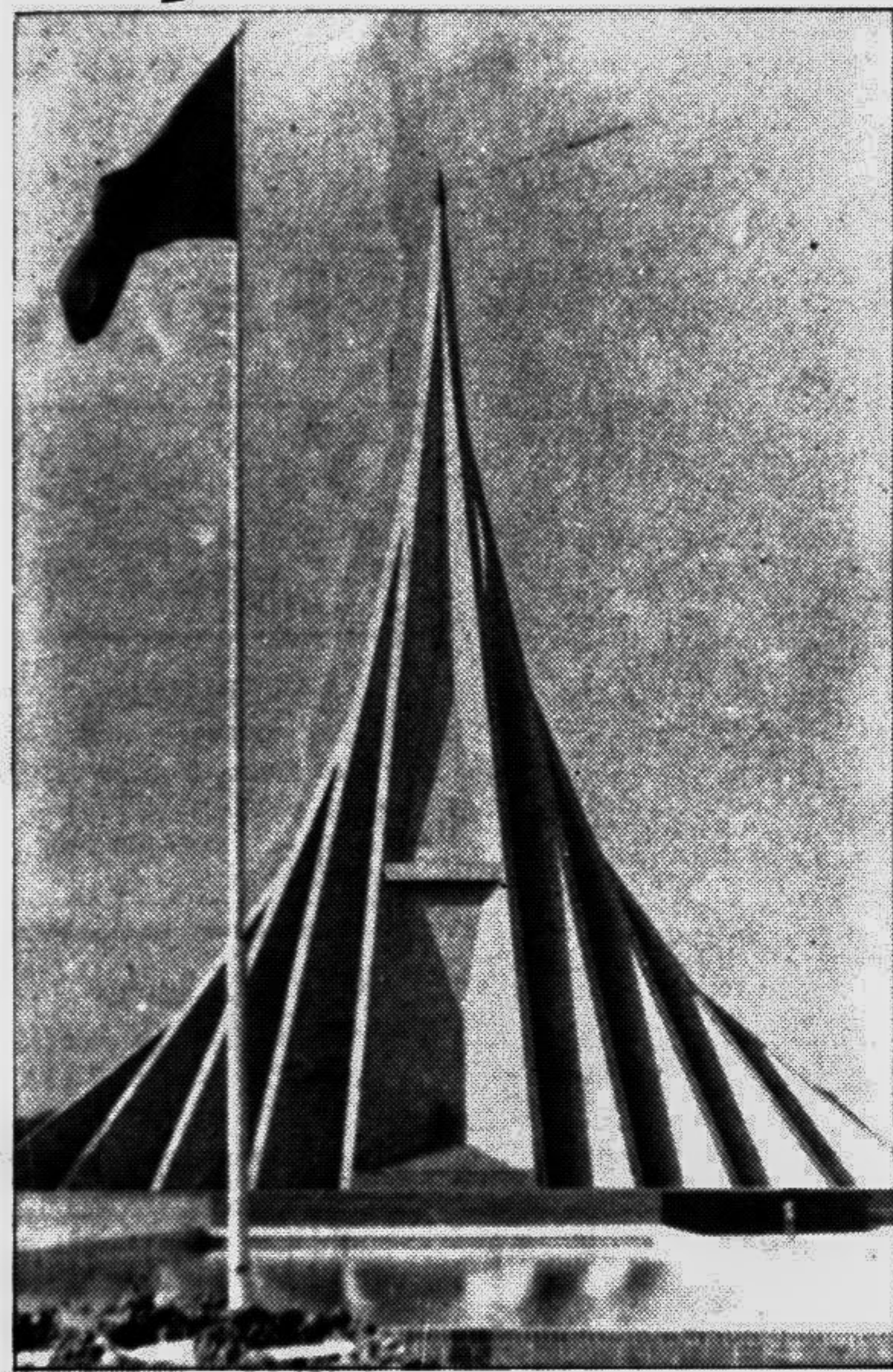

## Vow to uphold spirit of Liberation War

The nation celebrates the Victory Day tomorrow with a renewed pledge to build the country with the spirit of Liberation War.

The people of Bangladesh achieved victory on December 16, 1971 after a nine-month bloody war against the Pakistani occupation forces for liberating the motherland. Millions sacrificed their lives in the war for the long cherished independence.

Ninety-three thousand Pakistani soldiers surrendered to the joint forces of Bangladesh's freedom fighters — Mukti Bahini — and the Eastern Command of Indian Army that day at the historic Race Course Maidan (now Suhrawardy Uddyan) in the city.

This year the Victory Day coincides with the Silver Jubilee of the country's Constitution that came into force in 1972. Celebration of the Day will begin in a novel way this time, with the blowing of whistles by all train engines across the country at midnight tonight.

On the eve of the Day, President Shahabuddin Ahmed and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina gave separate messages paying rich tributes to martyrs of Liberation War.

In his message, the President stressed the need for concerted efforts of the patriotic people irrespective of party and opinion to resolve national crisis and lead the country towards prosperity.

He said the people now expect integrity and understanding as the guideline for national politics instead of clash and See Page 12 Col 2

## PM calls upon freedom fighters

## Resist conspirators

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called upon the freedom fighters to resist those trying to destroy the spirit and values of independence and liberation war, reports UNB.

"There is no room for conspirators in the country. Freedom fighters will resist whoever will try to divide the nation and undermine the spirit of liberation war," she said while addressing a grand rally of the freedom fighters at Paltan Maidan in the afternoon.

Hasina said, "The people of the country will no longer allow anyone to plot any conspiracy against independence and liberation war."

Father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman gave the nation political freedom and now the only objective of the ruling party is to ensure economic freedom of the commonman, she said.

Freedom fighters from all over the country gathered at the Paltan Maidan and the whole area was swamped with banners, posters and festoons.

Veteran freedom fighters, youths and a large number of women also joined the rally, organised by Bangladesh Mukti Joddha Sangsad Kendriya Command Council ahead of the Victory Day.

The Prime Minister said her government wants to build up a poverty, hunger and exploitation-free 'Sonar Bangla' as dreamt by the father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and is taking steps to attain the objective.

"Once you fought at the call of Bangabandhu to free the nation, now you'll have to fight again to free the nation from the curse of poverty and hunger," she told the freedom fighters.

The Prime Minister said the freedom fighters remained neglected for last 21 years, they were denied their due rights and respect. Now the pro-liberation forces have come to power and taken a number of steps for the welfare of the freedom fighters.

About the success of her government, Hasina said it has succeeded in solving the long-standing problems and signed the Ganges water sharing treaty with India and an accord with the tribal leaders to restore See Page 12 Col 4

## Over 100 hurt: Army on alert: Sec 144 imposed BDR firing kills 2 in Khagrachhari

CHITTAGONG, Dec 14: At least two persons were killed when BDR opened fire on agitating supporters of Parbatya Sarbadalla Oikya Parishad (PSOP) at Matiranga in Khagrachhari today.

Over 100 others including 45 police personnel were injured in a series of clashes between the PSOP supporters and on-duty police and BDR, sources said.

The dead were identified as Zakir Hossain (15) and Abdur Rasul (40).

Among the injured, most of

them bullet-hit, 16 people were brought to Chittagong Medical College Hospital while the rest were admitted to the local health complex.

Police and local sources said the trouble began at around 10 am when several thousand of supporters of PSOP demonstrated at Matiranga Bazar protesting the arrest of two BNP activists — Abu Yusuf and Md Faruk.

Police said those two BNP men were arrested last night from Matiranga on charge of instigation and other illegal

activities against the CHT peace accord.

At about 11 am, the demonstrators marched to gherao the Matiranga thana office demanding release of the arrested activists. When police intercepted, the clash erupted, police and local people said.

The clash marked by gun-fires and pelting of brickbats continued for three hours, police said.

Police initially fired rubber bullets to disperse the demonstrators who attacked the Matiranga thana office. See Page 12 Col 7

## 2 more Naogaon BDR firing victims die

RAJSHAHI, Dec 14: Two more persons who were injured in BDR firing yesterday afternoon at Sreerampur village near Sutirhar in Manda thana of Naogaon district succumbed to injuries on way to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital last night.

They were identified as Mozammel and Sushil.

The incident occurred when a BDR vehicle was attacked at Sreerampur on Naogaon-Rajshahi Highway by the angry villagers who blocked vehicular traffic following a road accident that left a 9-year-old girl killed in the morning.

At one stage, the BDR personnel opened fire to disperse the villagers killing a man on the spot. He was later identified as Harun.

## Tributes to martyred intellectuals

The nation yesterday paid glowing tributes to the intellectuals who were martyred only two days ahead of the victory in the War of Liberation.

On December 14, 1971, many of the country's most gifted sons were picked up from their residences by local collaborators of the Pakistani occupation forces and butchered with the evil motive of turning the emerging nation intellectually bankrupt.

In the city yesterday, all roads led to the Martyred Intellectuals Memorial at Mirpur and Rayerbazar mass grave.

Grief-stricken people in their thousands blocked there to pay their respect to the martyrs.

They placed wreaths by lining

up in long queues.

Prime Minister and Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina, flanked by party colleagues, garlanded the portrait of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman early yesterday morning at Bangabandhu Bhaban in the city.

Later at around 7 am, the Prime Minister placed wreaths at the Memorial, at Mirpur in homage to the martyred intellectuals. Bugle played the last post and a smartly turned out contingent of the army gave a gun salute as the premier laid wreaths and stood in solemn silence there for a few minutes.

## Oct 14 abortive flight to NY 13 Biman, Civil Aviation staff held responsible

Negligence to duty by 13 staff members of the Biman and the Civil Aviation Authority was responsible for the return of Biman's October 14 New York flight about three hours after its take-off from Dhaka, a probe report says.

Biman's BG-011 flight (Dhaka-Delhi-Brussels-New York) came back because of an on-going exercise of Indian Air Force in Delhi.

There is no well-defined guideline on responsibilities of the staff at Biman's operations control, the probe report of the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism says.

Operation of the abortive flight ignoring a 'very urgent' NOTAM (notice to airman) mes-

sage from Delhi about the exercise caused a financial loss of Tk 6.34 lakh.

On October 14, the captain of the BG-011 flight and others concerned ignored the NOTAM message as none of them reported to the operations centre for pre-flight briefing, the report said.

Senior officials of the Biman and the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) said as per rules, all the crew were supposed to get flight plan and briefing from the operations centre about one hour before the take-off.

The crew of the flight did not 'sincerely scan' the papers of the flight plan which, accord- See Page 12 Col 1

They put up the barricade on Thursday night.

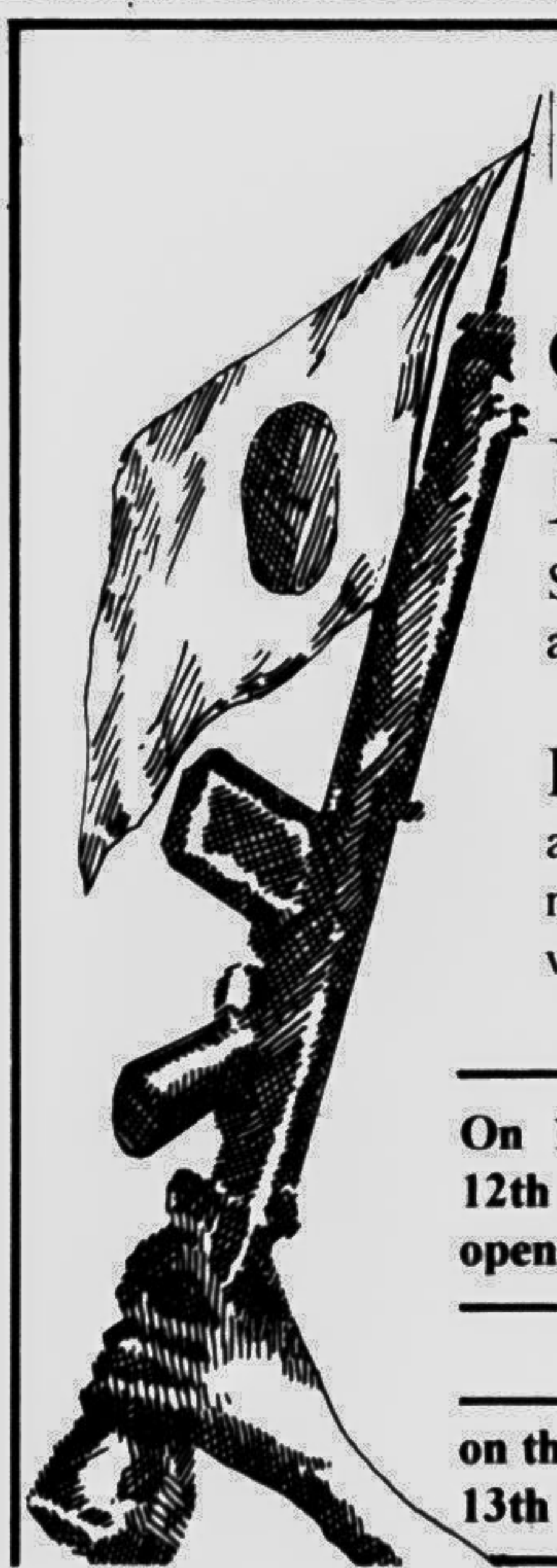
They have called a day-long strike on the campus followed by a gherao of the Vice Chancellor's office today to realise their eight-point demand.

The demands include removal of the truck stand from Aminbazar and arrest and punishment of the persons involved in the attack on a JU bus on Thursday night which left at least 50 students injured. The programmes was announced at a press conference at the Dairy Farm Gate of the university which was also participated by leaders of student fronts of all political parties.
