GUANGZHOU, China, Dec 14: Liu Ailing scored twice to lead the hosts China to their sixth consecutive Asian women's football championship title with a 2-0 victory over North Korea today, reports AFP.

Earlier in the day, Japan won the consolation match against Chinese Taipei 2-0 to clinch third place and the final berth in the 1999 women's World Cup, to be played in the United States.


