Football in the country of world champions Brazil is corrupt. It may have remained unknown to the world but for a new law drawn up by their Sports Minister, the legendary Pele, and approved by the government last week. The law seeks to change the way the game is organised in a country known for its prowess in the sport. Primarily aimed at stamping out corruption, the enactment will make football clubs in Brazil more accountable.

FIFA was quick to criticise Pele's move, perhaps for the first time since their love affair began several decades ago, saying that under the new law clubs will have less control over players. Possibly unaware to FIFA such a law or, for certain, its dreaded effect already exists in most of its member-nations.

The Jamaican squad in France '98 may exude an Anglican flavour with six of the players named last Thursday in a squad of 29 currently involved in the English league.

Wimbledon striker Marcus Gayle and Chelsea defender Frank Sinclair join the Portsmouth duo of Paul Hall and Fitzroy Simpson, Derby's Deon Burton and Wimbledon's Robbie Earle.

The squad leaves for Brazil in the new year for a month-long training stint in preparation for the rendezvous in France. Why Brazil? Well, that their coach Rene Simoes is Brazilian is a good enough reason. They play in Group H where the Argentines, the Croats and the Japanese may discover that there is more to the Caribbeans than Reggae.

The seriousness of the big guns can also be comprehended from Argentina's homework. The former world champions have lined up as many as nine friendlies before their journey to France and the one to watch for would be their meeting with title holders Brazil on April 29.

An idea of the amount of money being pumped in by the thirty-two finalists may be gauged from Nigeria's reported offer to ex-England and present Aussie boss (English name for football manager) Terry Venables to coach the Africans for the WC. The Nigerians, pitted with Spain, Paraguay and Bulgaria in the "Group of Death", wanted to pay Mr. Venables half a million pounds in basic salary for two months. With bonuses he could cash as much as two million.

There is already criticism that teams will have to travel a lot more than in any other previous WC. The hosts have defended the itinerary that they want people all over France to see as many teams as possible.

In the group matches, no team plays in the same stadium twice. Venues extend from the edges of the Mediterranean to the Atlantic Ocean and the English Channel.

The opening ceremony and match (Brazil vs. Scotland), the second semi-final (July 8) and the final (July 12) will be played in France's new national stadium, the 80,000-seater Stade de France in St. Denis near Paris, built specifically for the World Cup finals. Paris's other WC venue, the Parc des Princes, where the third place play-off will be held (July 11), can hold 49,500 spectators.

Stade Velodrome in Marseille, venue of the first semi-final (July 7), is the second largest stadium with a capacity of 60,000. It will also be host to four group games, one second-round match and one quarter-final. The other stadiums are much smaller with capacity ranging from 35,500 (Stade de la Mosson, Montpellier) to 44,000 (Stade de Gerland, Lyons).

Wide television coverage may however compensate for petite arenas.

In the group matches, Brazil can be seen in action, besides St. Denis, at Stade de la Beaujoire, Nantes (capacity 40,000) and Marseilles. Hosts France will feature at Marseilles, Lyons and St. Denis. England make group appearances at Marseilles, Felix-Bollaert, Lens (capacity 42,000) and Stadium Municipal, Toulouse (capacity 37,000). Argentina will play at Parc des Princes, Parc Lescur, Bordeaux (capacity 36,500) and Toulouse. Holland will find themselves at Saint-Denis, Marseilles and Stade Geoffroy-Guichard, Saint-Etienne (capacity 36,000). The other favourites, vintage Germany, make their debut at Parc des Princes and will also face opposition at Lens and Montpellier.

The barrage of words for England is abating, possibly because the outcome according to most Englishmen was a foregone conclusion. Former England manager, Bobby Robson, was presumably their spokesman last week when he modestly summarised all their emotions in "England have a good chance". A fan of current England manager, Glen Hoddle, Bobby has opened a new volume for local discussion by proclaiming that the ageing Paul Gascoigne (Rangers and England) will make an impact in France '98 as he did in Italy '90. Gazza's former boss was staking a lot because, according to him, Gazza was the "best player in the '90 tournament".

The Scots, who according to many would rather see England lose any day of the year, appear to be unwittingly picking up the favourite English pastime - unrestrained self-glorification. Although not strong enough on paper and having to deal with Brazil, Norway and Morocco in Group A, the patriotism came out in ex-international Dennis Law when he announced, almost suppressing a laugh, that Scotland will qualify for the last sixteen. You never can tell because what matters is the performance of a team on the day, but his claim is as laughable as ours of a position in the last eight of the next World Cup - cricket, that is.

Saudis secure Parreira

RIYADH, Dec 17: Carlos Alberto Parreira, who led Brazil to their record fourth World Cup title, signed on Tuesday to coach Saudi Arabia through the 1998 World Cup, reports AP.

The value of the one-year contract was not disclosed but Saudi officials, speaking on condition of anonymity, said it was worth three million dollars.

With Saudi federation deputy chairman Prince Sultan bin Fahd looking on, Parreira signed the contract at a ceremony in the presence of reporters.

"I'm very pleased to be given this opportunity to take Saudi Arabia to the finals and through determination and hard work, we will achieve good results come June," Parreira said.

One detail remains to be cleared. Parreira still has one year remaining on a two-year deal to coach the New York-New Jersey MetroStars of the United States Major League Soccer.

Reached at the club's headquarters in Secaucus, New Jersey, MetroStars general manager Charlie Stillitano said the Saudi federation and the club have not yet reached a final agreement to release Parreira from his contract.

European Cup draws finalised

GENEVA, Dec 17: The quarterfinals of Europe's three major cup competitions had a clear German accent after Wednesday's draw, reports AP.

In the most prestigious of the three cups - the European Cup - three German teams are still in the race and Bayern Munich and defending champions Borussia Dortmund were drawn to face each other.

The other German side Bayer Leverkusen drew Real Madrid - one of the favourites. Juventus, runner-up last season and champions in 1996, are up against Dynamo Kiev, one of the most impressive clubs in the Champions' League.

Manchester United, another of the favourites, seemed to get a favorable draw with French league side AS Monaco.

The two legs of the European Cup quarterfinals are on March 4 and 18. The UEFA Cup is on March 3 and 17 with the Cup Winners' Cup set for March 5 and 18.
