Children's park in bad shape

BHOLA, Dec 22: Children of the district town are being deprived of recreation facilities as the only children park here is lying abandoned for long due to lack of proper maintenance, reports UNB.

The park, situated near the district court house, two km off the district town, now turned into a cattle grazing field. The children cannot go to the park, reports UNB. Local people alleged that authorities are yet to take any decision to transfer the park to the downtown. They urged the authorities to take immediate steps to shift the park and start its renovation work for the convenience of the children.

Wheat distributed under VGD programme

KISHOREGANJ, Dec 22: A total of 4,630 metric tons of wheat was distributed under the vulnerable group development (VGD) programme in the district during the first five months of the current fiscal year, reports BSS.

According to an official source, the wheat was distributed free of cost among 12,862 card-holders of 105 unions under 13 thanas. Each card-holder receives about 30 kg of wheat every month.

Cultivation of fodder being promoted

TANGAIL, Dec 22: The Livestock Department will sell 3,630kg maize and 60 kg oat seeds to the farmers of the district to promote cultivation of fodder, reports UNB.

An official source said the seed is being sold from all the thana livestock offices. Meanwhile, the Livestock Department has imparted training to the farmers on cultivation of improved variety of fodders.

Pest-attack on IRRRI-Boro seed-bed

MADARIPUR, Dec 22: IRRRI-Boro cultivation in the district may be hampered seriously in the current season as the seed-beds have been attacked by pests, reports UNB.

The farmers said pesticides available in the markets are not effective on the pests and seedlings on a vast tract of land have already been damaged. The seed-beds become yellowish within 24 hours of the attack. Farmers expressed concern at the widespread pest attack on the seed-beds and said the target of cultivation would not be achieved in the district in the current season if immediate measures are not taken by the Agriculture Extension Department.

Smuggled goods seized

RAJSHAHI, Dec 22: Bangladesh Rifles in separate raids seized smuggled goods worth over Tk 25.26 crore from August to November this year from different border areas of the district, reports UNB.

The contraband items included Indian saree, sugar, salt, eggs, silk yarn, cattle, pulses, brass, touch-stone, statues, motor parts, gold, phensidyl, heroin and cosmetics. BDR sources said 58 people were rounded up and 1,207 cases were filed with the police during the period. The seized goods were deposited with the Customs godown.

Housewife beaten to death

NARSINGDI, Dec 22: A young housewife was allegedly beaten to death by her husband at a village in Rajshahi thana of the district on Sunday for dowry, reports UNB.

The victim was identified as Josna Begum, 20, daughter of Abdul Rahman of village Gazarikandi in the thana. According to police, Zillur Rahman of the village married Josna Begum one year back and he used to torture her to bring Tk 20,000 from her parents as dowry money. On the fateful day, he picked up a quarrel with her and at one stage beat her to death. Police recovered the body and sent it to Narsingdi sadar hospital for autopsy.

Massive winter crops farming scheme

BARISAL, Dec 22: A total of 3,67,879 hectares have been brought under different varieties of winter crops 11 southern districts under Barisal Agriculture Extension Zone (BAEZ) in the current season, reports BSS.

The districts are: Barisal, Jhalakati, Bhola, Pirojpur, Patuakhali, Barguna, Faridpur, Gopalganj, Madaripur, Rajbari and Shariatpur. According to an official source, the target of production of these crops has been fixed at 4,55,910 metric tons. The crop-wise break-up is as follows: potato, 12,154 hectares, groundnut 12,100 hectares, lentil 67,850 hectares, gram 85,500 hectares, mug 54,400 hectares, mashkaila 5,100 hectares, pea 6,770 hectares, arhar 225 hectares, khesari 93,100 hectares, chillies 40,000 hectares, turmeric 1,300 hectares and various vegetables 39,400 hectares.

Efforts on to improve poor women's lot

NETRAKONA, Dec 22: The State Minister for Religious Affairs Moulana Mohammad Nurul Islam said that the present government under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was putting on its best efforts for improving the socio-economic condition of the downtrodden people especially the distressed women, reports BSS.

Referring to different development programmes taken by the government for rehabilitation of the unemployed women, he said the government is trying to uphold the rights of the womenfolk. The minister was inaugurating the Netrakona district unit office of a national level non-government woman organisation styled 'Jibon Sangram Seswachabi Dusto Mahila Kalyan Samity' at court road here.

Clashes foil V-Day programme

SHERPUR, Dec 22: The Victory Day programme here was foiled due to clashes between two rival groups of young people over a trifling matter on Tuesday, reports UNB.

The district administration organised a Victory Day march and a physical display at Shaheed Dargah Ali Pura ground on the day. Witnesses said two rival groups of youths locked in clashes over the parking of a bicycle in the ground when the programme started. A youth was beaten up mercilessly by the rival group during the clashes and he was rushed to Sherpur sadar hospital. The feuding groups at one stage dismantled the podium resulting in the foiling of the programme.

Jamuna erosion renders 30,000 people homeless

PABNA, Dec 22: More than 30,000 people of nine unions in Bera thana of the district have been rendered homeless following massive erosion of the mighty river Jamuna during the last two years, reports UNB.

Local people said at least 30 villages have so far been washed away by the river. A total of 12 people died in the incidents of erosion. The river also devoured about 10,000 homesteads and 14 educational institutions of the locality.

The worst-hit villages are: Ramkrishnanagar, Phitpnagar, Moricha, Chilmari, Khalishkandi, Boalia, ARIA, Ganopoti, Madhupur, Khanpura, Jadhupur, Nayanpur, Bijoyganj, Raksha, Ranigram, Raghunathpur, Dhala and Daulatpur.

The erosion of the Jamuna have caused serious damages to life and property in the biggest Bera thana.

Cold wave in Kishoreganj

Dense fog created an intolerable weather condition which forced most people to remain in their houses. Many people are being attacked with cold related diseases, a hospital source said.

Scarcity of water in Pabna

PABNA, Dec 22: Scarcity of drinking water is prevailing in the district as a number of tubewells remained out of order for long, reports UNB.

Public health officials said out of over 15,000 tubewells in nine thanas of the district 254 went out of order.

Local people complained that the concerned authorities are yet to take any measure to repair those tubewells.

As a result, people in those areas are facing much difficulties in collecting pure water which compelled them to use contaminated water from the rivers and ponds.

Workshop in Rajshahi

Superstition major obstacle to fight leprosy

RAJSHAHI, Dec 22: About 80,000 people have been suffering from leprosy in Bangladesh. Though the disease is now considered to be the least infectious and completely curable at all stages with available modern multi-drug therapy, leprosy is still a major health hazard in Bangladesh. This is only for unconsciousness and superstitions of people.

These were observed in an one-day long workshop in Media Action for Elimination of Leprosy in Bangladesh by 2000 AD held at Rajshahi Parjatan 201 conference room on Dec 20.

Organised by the TB and Leprosy Control Services in Bangladesh and sponsored by the Government of Bangladesh and World Health Organisation (WHO), the workshop was addressed by Dr AKM Ahsan Ali Project Director of Further Development of TB & Leprosy Control Services as the chief guest, Dr Mukhlesur Rahman, Superintendent of TB Hospital, Rajshahi and Dr Nazib Wadood, President of Rajshahi City Press Club as special guests. Rajshahi Civil Surgeon Dr. Nazrul Islam presided over the inaugural session.

Dr. AKM Ahsan Ali presented a synopsis of goal, objectives and strategies of National Leprosy Elimination Programme and Dr. Lutfar Rahman Talukder, WHO National Consultant (Leprosy) on 'What should the Community know about leprosy and the role of media'.

Among others, Dr. Jalaluddin, Assistant Director

(Leprosy), Dr. Kazi Belayet WHO Consultant (Leprosy), Rajshahi Division, Dr. Erwin Cooreman, Field Director, Danien Foundation, Rajshahi and Dr. Wasim Hossain, Senior Consultant, TB Clinic, Rajshahi spoke on different aspects of leprosy.

The speakers said leprosy is caused by infection of Mycobacterium Leprosi that is spread by droplets of upper respiratory tract during sneezing. Early signs of the disease is manifested by a pale or red skin patch with loss of sensation and sweating or presence of nodules or thickening of skin or thickening of peripheral nerves.

Over 99 per cent of population have natural immunity or resistance against the disease and only 15 per cent leprosy patients are infectious. The disease is not a result of curse nor a hereditary one and 100 per cent cases are curable at all stages. Deformities already caused by the disease at the last stage can also be repaired to a little extent by expensive reconstructive surgery. Bangladesh has very effective treatment facilities available free of costs at 600 treatment centres including all the 460 government Thana Health complexes, 130 district towns and municipalities and 37 treatment centres in four metropolitan cities and NGO clinics.

Bangladesh is one of 10 countries jointly contributing 90 per cent of the leprosy case load of the globe and with an estimated 80,000 cases. Bangladesh is one among six most endemic countries for leprosy and his the third highest estimated leprosy case-load in terms of absolute numbers.

Dr. AKM Ahsan Ali informed that a total of 55,350 cases of leprosy had been registered in the country from January 1993 to Dec 1996 and 34,445 of the total had been cured during that period. From 1985 to 1996, a total of 70,063 patients had been declared cured, he said.

To find out the obstacles to elimination programme of leprosy, experts observed that superstitions, unconsciousness and stigma were making the infected people to remain hidden and unidentified. As for example, they said only about 39 per cent of the detected leprosy cases came to take treatment voluntarily.

The National Leprosy Elimination Programme inception from 1993 has fixed targets to detect over 85 per cent of the estimated cases to provide multi-drug therapy to all 100 per cent registered cases and achieve over 85 per cent cure rate and to reduce deformity rate among newly detected cases to less than 5 per cent from 21.4 per cent by 2000 AD.

The government already trained up medical professionals up to the grass-root level, the workshop was informed and urged the media people to highlight the facts related to leprosy to make the people conscious, fearless and eager to receive treatment voluntarily.

The participants consolidated some suggestions for growing consciousness of the people.

Banana production declines

NARSINGDI, Dec 22: Despite bright prospect of banana cultivation in the district, the production of this highly food valued crop has decreased during the last few years, reports UNB.

Recurrent natural calamities like, flood, drought and tornado, lack of patronisation and motivational work have been attributed to the reduction of banana production in the district.

Official sources said popular varieties of banana including Sagar, Sabri, Chapa, Humal and Cara-bandar were used to be produced on 38,000 acres of land in six thanas of the district, but it has come down to 25,000 acres of land at present.

Growers said many of them have already shifted to other crops and seasonal vegetables cultivation as they sustained loss in banana cultivation.

They also told that with proper initiative and patronisation from the government they could earn Tk 20,000 to 23,000 by investing only 15,000 on per acre land.

Mentionable that following a limited motivational programme, about 56 marginal growers were encouraged to plant high yielding banana which helped slight increase of its production in some areas.

According to experts, banana cultivation has a bright prospect considering its multipurpose use. The banana plants can be used in making bags, packaging materials and mats.

They also said if the cultivation is properly encouraged, a

good number of unemployed youths could take up the occupation of banana cultivation in the district.

Many fallow lands and water-logged areas of the district could be brought under banana cultivation if proper steps are

taken by the authority concerned, they added.

The growers said if financial and technological assistance are provided by the government they can produce export quality banana of different varieties in the district.

Scarcity of water

Acute scarcity of pure drinking water is causing serious problems in rural areas of Kushtia district.

The existing number of tubewells in six thanas are quite inadequate to meet the demand of the people. According to a report a large number of tubewells are lying out of order for the last two years causing untold sufferings in the villages. Innumerable number of tubewells are out of order due to the damage in filter pipe beneath the earth, leakage in the pipe and more tubewells are lying out of order for want of spare parts.

Besides, upper portion of many tubewells of good quality were stolen. Reliable sources said adequate funds were needed urgently for resinking and the tubewells. Moreover, due to scarcity of pure drinking water people have to depend on kutchha wells and tanks for drinking water. As a result various water borne diseases are spreading in rural areas of the district.

Beggars on rise in Barguna

BARGUNA, Dec 22: The number of beggars is increasing in the thana and district headquarters causing concern among the social leaders, reports UNB.

There has been a continuous influx of beggars, both male and female, from the remote rural areas over the last few months, they said.

According to an estimate over 10,000 destitute people have gathered at the urban centres within the last couple of years in search of job to maintain their livelihood. But finding no other way out they were compelled to take up begging for their survival.

Acute food crisis and unemployment in the dry season have compelled the landless and marginal farmers to seek jobs in the urban areas and a majority of them resorted to begging due to shortage of job opportunities, said a social worker.
