NEW DELHI, Dec 24: Australia reached the women's World Cup cricket final here to day after a tense 19-run win over hosts India, reports AFP.

Pacewoman Cathryn Fitzpatrick took three wickets for 18 off seven overs to take the player-of-the-match award after Australia, put in, reached 66 without loss only to collapse to 123 for seven of their 32 overs.

India, however, could only make 104 for nine in reply. Four of their batswomen were run out. The only resistance came from Chandrakanta Ahir. who scored 48 off 73 balls. The game had to be cut back

from 40 overs due to fog. Australia, who have won the tournament three times, will play either New Zealand or holders England, who play the second semifinal in Madras on

Adams beats Short

GRONINGEN. Netherlands Dec 24: Englishman Michael Adams looks best placed to reach the final of the FIDE World Chess Championship after a win with white Tuesday over compatriot Nigel Short, reports AP.

The other semifinal was a lacklustre 40-minute draw in 15 moves between the favourite here, Indian Viswanathan Anand (Elo rating 2765), and Boris Gelfand (2695), of Belarus,

who was playing white. Short left the playing hall after a game lasting more than four hours without comment to the press, but Adams revealed his surprise that Short had rejected his offer of a draw around the 20th move.

Short (2660) played an unexpectedly fierce attack with black, sacrificing a rook for a knight and pawn on move 31 to help him push up a queenside pawn formation.

But Adams (2680) withstood the assault and advanced his own pawn to a threatening position on e6 causing Short, without compensation for his material disadvantage, to resign on move 41.


Adams said he was convinced that Short had missed several chances of lines of play leading to a draw.

'Solidarity Through Sports'

In 1969, Brazil's internationally renowned football star, Edson Arantes de Nascimento, better known as Pele, dedicated his one-thousandth goal to the world's children. Now, as Brazil's minister of sports, the man considered the best player-of-the-century is making one of his long-cherished dreams come true: to help Brazil's poorest and most deprived youngsters.

The football star's innovative programme, "Solidarity Through Sports," was launched earlier this year in Rio de Janeiro. It is intended to show children living in poverty some of the paths to a better life. "I've never-understood why

Brazil didn't support these types of projects before. I owe everything I am, and everything I have, to sports." Pele told the weekly magazine Veja recently. Pele himself comes from an impoverished family.

The football legend's goal is to build a string of Olympic villages in different parts of the country, where children can participate in various sports. receive medical attention, learn about nutrition and be encouraged to attend their local schools. Current plans call for implementation in 10 Brazilian states, with facilities for 350,000 children.

Already, in the state of Rio de Janeiro, five Olympic villages have opened to serve the children of some of the poorest and most violent slums. Children in these areas often know more about the local drugbaron than any sports hero.

While the central and state governments contribute most of the funds for the US \$25 million programme, local municipalities maintain the villages. Each has a football pitch, an athletics track, and in indoor gymnasium, as well as a health care clinic, dining areas and gardens. Some villages even have showy innovation such as athletics tracks covered with taraflex, a synthetic material similar to that used for the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games. ment efforts to promote sports for the poor. They argue that sports can be used by the politically and economically powerful to promote escapism, and distract underprivileged Brazilians from thinking too hard about the harsh realities of their lives. During the worst years of

world football championships were frequently held when the government wanted to pull public attention away from bouts of torture and repression. But ironically, now that the

Brazil's military dictatorships,

country is savouring the sweet taste of democracy, sports are highlighting the social problems and inequalities that exist in this vast South American nation. Brazil recently lost its bid to

be the host city for the 2004 Olympic Games because of its uneven and sporadic social development. Among the reasons for opting to fix the venue of the Games in Argentina instead. are Brazil's high levels of pollution, poor roads, and widespread violent crime. Those with experience in us-

ing sports to help poor children point out that games by themselves aren't complete solution. Many children also need other skills. But these can be provided once a child begins attending a sports programme.

"Only one per cent of the disadvantaged children who enter into projects of this type become top-ranking athletes." says Eduardo Duarte Silva, who is launching an album of inexpensive post cards called "Craques do Mundo" to teach children how to play football. "That's why all these pro-

grammes should be equipped with schools and health and nutrition services so that the remaining 99 per cent have the basic support to find other alternatives in life."

Pele's project is not a new idea. An existing array of smaller programmes like Silva's has made sports an important component of many private social efforts to help the poor. Most of these are not

tunded by the government. however, and lack the scope of Solidarity Through Sports. The Sao Martinho Associa-

tion, for example, conducts a special programme to rehabilitate young offenders through an agreement with the Maracana football stadium. In this worldrenowned arena, these adolescents sell ice-cream and soft drinks on the days when there are football games. On off days, they practice sports and attend literacy courses.



According to Roberto dos Santos, the association's coordinator, this initiative has posted several positive results. Both confrontations between the adolescents and the police and the number of arrests have fallen by over 90 per cent. Another is called "Sur-

favela." Created by the champion surfer Berzo, it instructs

children on how to surf and to maintain their surfboards. It works in tandem with the Noble Art of Boxing Academy, where a team composed of well-known boxing trainers teaches exercises and boxing techniques.

"Our objective is to have an exchange between the "slopes" and the "asphalt," says Claudio da Silva Coelho, one of the trainers. The description explains the social union between the most privileged — those who live in residential districts with asphalt roads - and the poor who live in favelas, or slums, built on the steep slopes that ring the city of Rio de Janeiro.

Middle class teenagers pay monthly fees to learn surfing and boxing. The money is sufficient to, in turn, enable those who live in the favelas to attend the classes for free. A plaque bearing the names of all the boxing champions who have come out of the favelas is hung with immense pride at the entrance to the academy.

According to Berzo, the socialisation process involved in "elite" sports such as surfing helps to raise the self-esteem of the children and teenagers who participate in the project. Berze himself began his career as a poor shoe-shiner in the wealthy beachside district of Ipanema, before he began to learn boxing. Later, he switched to surfing, and rose to the top of the sport.

"Black children from the favelas believe they can never get into surfing, a sport where the majority of practitioners are white and come from middle or upper class homes," he explains.

Football, however, remains the sport that is most likely to attract favela children into development programmes. This sport, along with popular TV soap operas and the annual carnival, is a national obsession. Pele says that once the villages scheme is rolling, his next plan is to take three levels of children and adolescents from the favelas to France. They will participate in a parallel tournament to the 1998 World Cup.
