'BNP propaganda designed to sever CHT from mainland'

A group of eminent citizens in a joint statement yesterday said the opposition parties launched the 'destructive' movement against the CHT as part of their conspiracies to turn Bangladesh into a 'second

Pakistan', reports UNB.
"The conspiracy is designed
by Pakistan intelligence agency to obstruct country's socio-economic development and destroy its image aboard," said 550 citizens in their statement.

The citizens, in this regard, categorically mentioned that the Constitution was not violated by signing of the agree-ment, rather the propaganda of BNP and its allies is designed to sever the Chittagong Hill Tracts from the mainland.

"The accord is signed in conformity with Section 9, 11, 26, 28, 42, 59 and 60 of the Constitution and also international human rights declaration," they said expressing their concern that "fascist and communal political parties oppos-ing the treaty are trying to push the country towards a civil

"None will allow any de-structive programme that provokes civil war," the citizens

Former ambassador Mannaf dies



Maj Gen (Retd) Abdul Mannaf, a former senior defence personnel and an ambassador passed away in the early

hours of yesterday at the Combined Military Hospital in the city. He was 59, reports BSS.

Gen Mannaf, a graduate of Dhaka University, was com-missioned as an officer in the Pakistan Armoured Corps (Cavalry) in 1958 and was a member of the Special Services Group (Commando). He partici-pated in the Runn of Kutch war and also in the Indo-Pak war in 1965. Gen Mannaf had his training in UK, USA and Germany, a press release said.

Mannaf served as country's ambassador to the Philippines. Thailand and High Commissioner to Australia.

The deceased was the son of late Abdur Rahim Khan and late Zubaida Khanum. He left behind his wife Hasna Mannaf
