

During last 15 months LGRD Ministry constructs 21,875 km rural road, 2,600 bridges

LGRD Ministry has constructed 21,875 km rural metalled road, 2,600 bridges and developed 300 bazaars and planted trees on sides of 1500 km roads during the last 15 months in the rural areas of the country, reports BSS.

The ministry also launched a 320 crore taka micro-credit distribution programme among the rural poor emphasising the rural women community for self employment generation and uplift of their socio economic status.

The rural infrastructure development work done by the ministry will further help to create new job opportunities in the rural areas and gear up rural trade, business and other activities.

This was disclosed at a high level meeting on rural infrastructure development and poverty alleviation programme held at the Local Government Ministry conference room yesterday.

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman presided over the meeting. State Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury (Maya), Local Government Division Secretary AHM Abdul Hye and Rural Development and Cooperatives Secretary Sayed Marjib Morshed were present. Among others chief engineer LGED, chief engineer DPHE, DG BRDB, cooperatives registrar and the heads of the other concerned development agencies attended the meeting.

The meeting was informed that 34936 different types of tubewells were sunk in rural areas of the country during the

time of present government and 201913 sanitary latrine were distributed in the rural areas to motivate the rural people in national sanitation programme and supply of safe drinking water to the village people.

Speaking on the occasion Zillur Rahman directed the concerned officials to integrate the various development activities and complete the development projects particularly the foreign aided ones in time. The government took the decision quickly in undertaking and implementing the projects in time," he added.

Zillur Rahman also asked the concerned agencies to ensure that the micro-credits go to the persons who deserved the loans and stressed the need for setting up of agro-based small and cottage industries for self-employment of the rural poor and rapid growth of the rural economy.

Zillur Rahman said, "The government wants to create dynamism in the rural economy by increasing the purchasing capacity of the rural people and income generating activities in the rural areas through constructing strong rural infrastructure."

He said the desired national economic uplift would not be possible without making the rural people self-reliant without increasing the buying capacity of the rural poor people.

He also said the government wants to strengthen the rural economy in the interest of rural people and to stop the influx of rural people to urban areas.

935 refugees of 185 families return home from Tripura

A total of 935 tribal refugees of 185 families returned home from exile in Indian state of Tripura yesterday, the fourth day of the sixth phase of repatriation through Ramgarh border point, officials said in Khagrachhari yesterday, reports BSS.

With this 3,895 tribal refugees of 756 families have returned home from the Kathachhari refugee camp of Tripura in four days in the current phase resumed on January 1.

Officials said the repatriation will continue until the last refugee is returned.

Eight hundred forty-four tribal refugees of one hundred eighty-six families are scheduled to return home today, according to repatriation schedule.

According to a government commitment, the repatriated tribal refugees immediately after reporting to the reception centre, are being sent to their respective destinations providing them with three months of free ration, Taka 21,000 in cash and other incentives including government sponsored transports to reach their homes.

Hajj training begins Jan 10

A three-day training programme for the intending Hajj pilgrims will be organised from January 10 at Dampara Madrasa mosque in Chittagong, reports UNB.

The course, organised by Tahfi-e-Haramaine Parishad Bangladesh will be free of cost, said a press release.

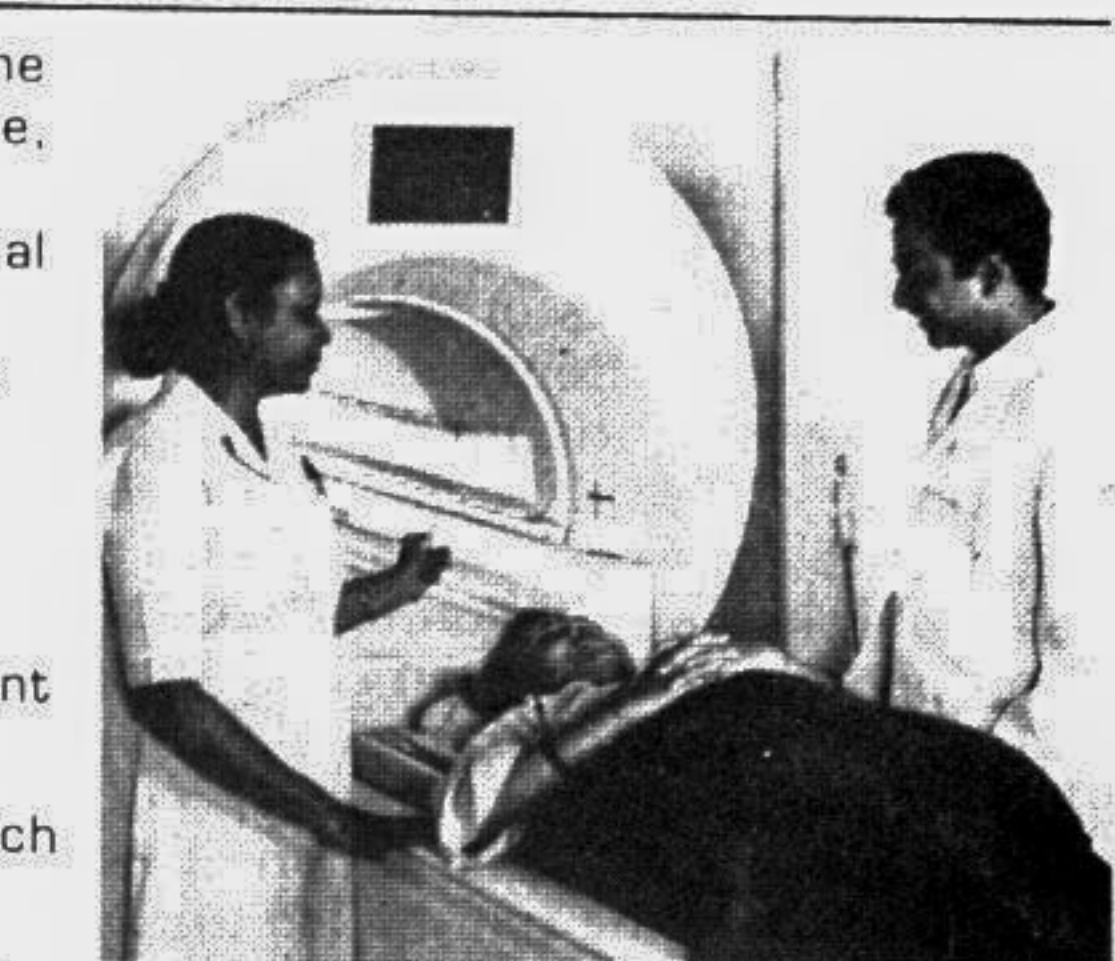

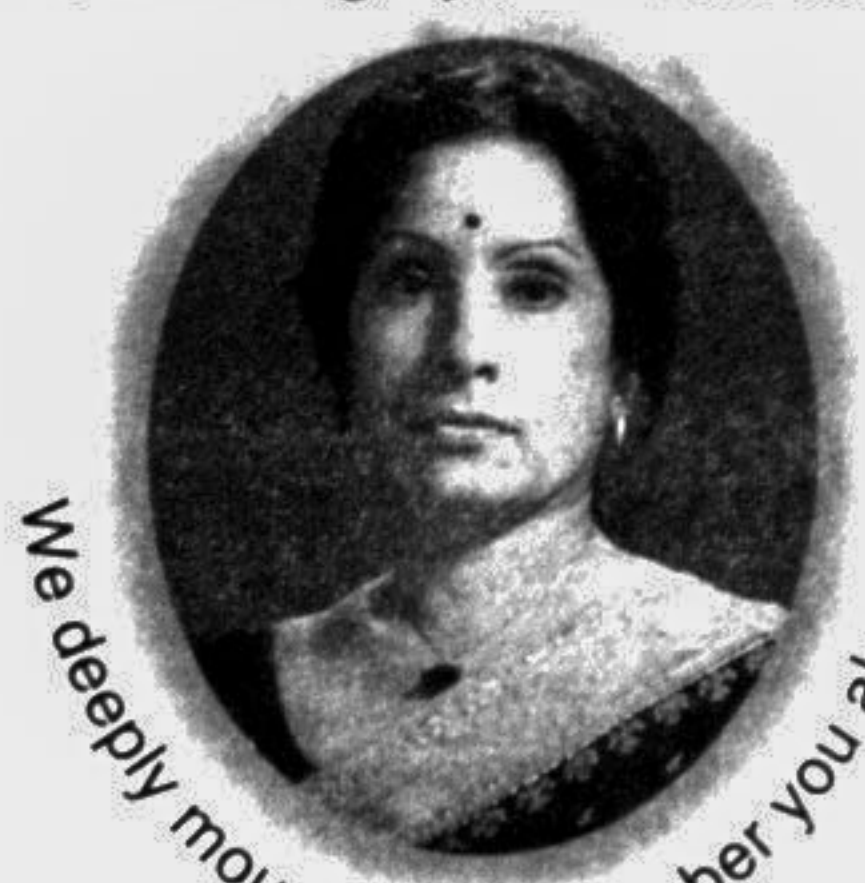

Weather is likely to prevail dry and cold over the country in the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.

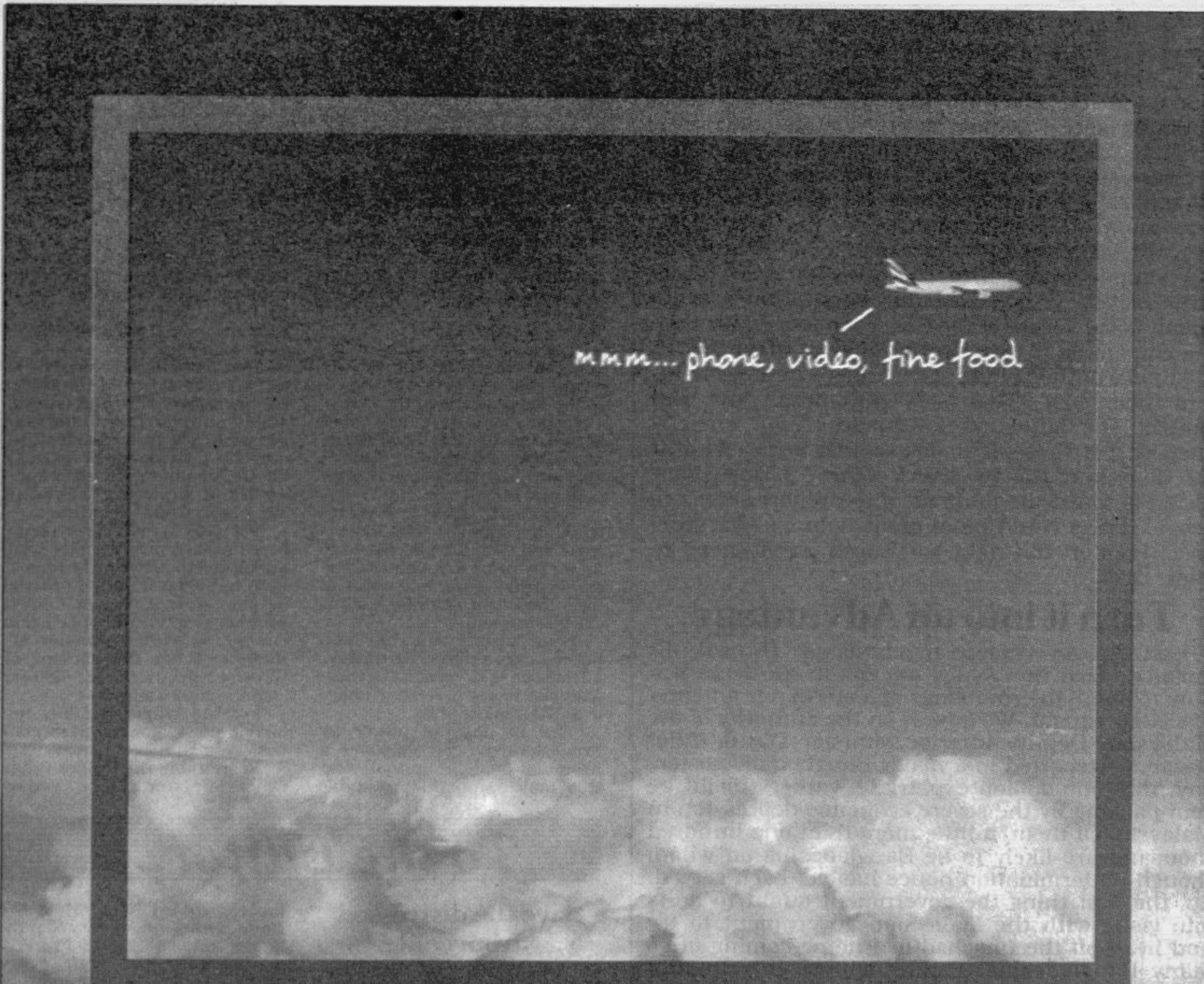
Met Office said, night temperature across the country may rise in next two days, but little change is expected after the next five days.
