## Winter clothes distributed in 22 districts

The government has distributed a large number of winter clothes from the Prime Minister's Relief Fund in 22 districts battered by the current cold spell, reports UNB.

The clothes were distributed in Panchagarh, Thakurgaon, Dinajpur, Nilphamari, Lalmonirhat, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Kurigram, Bogra, Joypurhat, Naogaon, Nawabganj, Rajshahi, Natore, Sirajganj, Pabna, Sherpur, Jamalpur, Mymensingh, Netrakona, Sunamganj and Sylhet.

Meanwhile, the Disaster Management and Relief Ministry yesterday allocated 1,650 quilts for the cold-hit people in 10 northern districts.

The blankets allocated included 300 pieces for Dinajpur, 200 each for Rangpur, Kurigram, Rajshahi and Jessore districts, 150 pieces for Gaibandha and 100 pieces each for Panchagarh, Thakurgaon, Lalmonirhat and Nilphamari districts.

Earlier, the Ministry distributed 10,500 quilts.

## Supply of fertilisers satisfactory

The supply and prices of fertilisers are satisfactory in the country, the consultative committee of the Agriculture Ministry was informed yesterday, reports BSS.

Commerce and Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed and Food and Agriculture Minister Begum Motia Chowdhury attended the meeting of the consultative committee on distribution of fertilisers held in the conference room of the Agriculture Ministry with the committee chairman and former adviser to the caretaker government A M Anisuzzaman in the chair.

The meeting was informed that the government had finalised import of 50 thousand tonnes of fertilisers to meet the demand of the current boro season.

The meeting discussed quality and supply of di-amonia phosphate (DAP) fertiliser and termite DIT as a modern and helpful fertiliser with a combination of urea and phosphate for protecting the fertility of soil.

The government has already taken initiatives for importing 50 thousand tonnes of DAP fertiliser. Besides, 25 thousand tonnes of DAP fertilisers has already reached the buffer stocks in different parts of the country, the meeting was told.

Officials of the agriculture extension directorate and Bangladesh Fertilisers Association (BFA) have been instructed to encourage the farmers to use DAP fertiliser. The meeting also urged them to take necessary measures for speedy distribution of the imported DAP fertiliser.

The meeting was attended by Suranjit Sengupta, MP, Mohammad Tajul Islam Chowdhury, MP, Agriculture Secretary Dr A M M Shawkot Ali, Commerce Secretary K M Izazul Haque, Industries Secretary Alamgir Farook Chowdhury and Energy Secretary Dr Towfique-e-Elahi Chowdhury.

## 'Museums to be people's centre in 21st century'

Bangladesh National Museum organised a lecture on 'Museums in 21st century' yesterday at its Children's Auditorium.

Dr Henry Glassie, Professor of Folklore and Folk Art, University of Bloomington, Indiana, USA, was the main speaker, says a press release.

Prof Glassie said that due to the widening educational responsibilities, museums in the 21st century would require an expansion in coverage, which will lead to shift in collection, procedures to direct ethnographic work, and in exhibition procedures to the presentation of live performances. In this context, the museums will become a people's centre.

Prof Glassie, after visits over ten years, has written a volume, titled Art and Life in Bangladesh published by the Indiana University Press, which will be published in Bangladesh by the Bangla Academy.
