

Visualizing Japanese Perspective of Environment and Sustainable Development

TOKYO has just played host to the World Conference on Climate Change. The outcome of the conference itself has drawn eye-brows internationally; yet as Tokyo has once again come to the limelight of the global environmental politics there has been a renewal of international interest on the vision of Japan on issues such as environment and sustainable development. Japan's experience in environment and sustainable development is of critical importance in the context of international co-operation, especially because Japan has emerged as the leading donor-country globally and, despite its own more recent economic troubles and slow-down, it remains committed with major support towards both a friendlier environment and sustainable development.

The challenges that arise on the eve of the new century, especially in areas such as environment and development, the world faces the need for enlightened responses. There has been a widely felt need for international leadership that is both proactive and inspired, not simply reactive or functional; for, as there is a generally shared consensus, a neighbourhood without leadership is a neighbourhood endangered. The world does indeed need a credible and sustained leadership, and as a donor-superpower Japan is well-placed to offer such a leadership.

As a developing country, Bangladesh seeks international co-operation to confront its environmental challenges and ensure its sustainable development. A relatively resource poor country in terms of natural endowment, Bangladesh, like Japan in the earlier era, faces enormous challenges of development and, again like Japan, is riddled with environmental constraints of various types. But Japan is known to have confronted both the challenges and constraints with fortitude and foresightedness. Hence its role model seems to feature importantly in the international search for sound environmental planning and sustainable development.

Japan itself is also committed to both sound economic development and environmental assistance. It emphasizes balanced environmental and developmental goals, with both long and short-term strategies to combat environmental degradation and to adopt economically and technologically sound measures to enhance efficiency in development and to reduce pollution or emissions of harmful gases.

However, like many other aspects of Japanese life, Japan's environment policy is often misperceived and is viewed negatively, though Tokyo has been taking a very responsive and forward-looking stance toward environmental problems, as is demonstrated by what it

has been doing in this field and the sense of importance and urgency that has been manifested in Japan both at the level of public opinion as well as in government official policy on the issues of environment and development. These include the "New Earth" action programme that seeks to recreate "A Green Planet for the 21st Century," an "Action Programme to Arrest Global Warming" and the "Long-term Outlook for Energy Supply and Demand."

Tokyo is known to lead the world in certain areas of environmental management, but its predicament in the environmental field must be seen in the same light as any other developed or developing society: being torn between the requirements of a developed economy and a healthy environment.

The difference between Japan and other countries is only in the magnitude and polarity of changes in development and environment, in the element of co-operation agreed between the government and the private sector. But as is seen in Tokyo, en-

vironmental problems are also closely linked with other problems, such as North-South problems, East-East problems, population problems, food problems, international trade frictions, and other problems. Tokyo views that expanded human activities have begun to come up on constraints upon a closed global system and lose a degree of freedom and flexibility so far allowed to some extent to each country.

The international community clamours for Japan as an economic superpower to take its share of responsibility for the global environment. Slowly but steadily Japan has begun to respond to this pressure so as to secure its place in world affairs, and as the world's leading donor nation it is expected that in the coming years Japan would assume a leadership role to address the issue of global environment. Japan may perhaps serve both as an example or warning as well as a source of inspiration and funding. Its miraculous economic recovery and spectacular growth in the post-Second World War era had

been undeniably at great social and environmental cost. But then Japan has also been coping later with this development-cum-environmental dilemma. This should provide other developing economies to learn from the Japanese experience in their appraisal how to consider carefully their balance of economic and environmental priorities. Tokyo has indeed shown its keen desire to play its part as an international player in solving global environmental problems that cause international tension.

While Japan's official policy currently is to offer "contributions to the globe — a national goal" what are the official acts, agencies, elements of cooperation between the public organs and private sectors? How does Japan view the concept of sustainable development or how does it seek to find an appropriate balance between development and environment? What is the role of media and the public opinion toward global environmental issues, including gas emissions from the CFCs, endangered species, at-

mospheric pollution, desertification, deforestation and tropical rainforest issues and funding for environment-friendly projects? What role does Japan envision on development planning and environmental problems, globally and regionally, at the multilateral and bilateral levels?

It is known that Tokyo has successfully hosted the Conference on the Global Environment and Human Response towards Sustainable Development as well as the more recently held one on Global Climate Change. It has also made operational plans to provide environment-related aid to developing countries. In a world that is sharply divided over targets and time-tables on how much to rein over the industrial nations' emissions of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases linked to global warming, Japan has already pledged to "work hard to build consensus."

Obviously, Japan's own experiences of development planning and environmental management need to be placed in their proper context. It is

known that Japan features importantly in regional and sub-regional planning for environmental management and sustainable development, studies on its role model in both these spheres in the developing countries of Asia have been scanty. Therefore, understanding Japan in greater depth on the entire spectrum of Japanese environmental experience and its policy on sustainable development would be extremely useful for the Asian countries like Bangladesh.

More specifically, the conceptual perspectives on environment and sustainable development has to be explored and an appropriate framework of analysis for cooperative relationships between Japan and its Asian neighbours has to be developed. The various aspects of Japan's policy on environmental management and sustainable development has to be analyzed and the mechanisms developed for implementing that policy has to be appraised.

The multifaceted aspects of Japan's role model as a donor-superpower has to be examined and the dimensions of its aid policy in this context need be evaluated. The areas for closer cooperation between Japan and its Asian neighbours in the areas of environment and sustainable development have to be identified. There are also special concerns of Bangladesh as a developing country in pur-


suing its interests of environmental management and sustainable development with Japan which have to be viewed in the wider context of regional and subregional relations.

Last but not least, there may be sample case studies of Japan's environmental management and sustainable development, with specific references to possible Japanese funding projects related to the above areas that may prove beneficial to both Japan and Bangladesh and other countries of South Asia. Japanese international funding agencies have been quite closely monitoring, with necessary funding, some very ambitious regional and subregional environmentally sensitive development projects.

What is crucial is to appropriately diagnose the environmental constraints and developmental handicaps of Bangladesh in their national and regional-subregional context and to suggest prescriptive measures to overcome them, with linkage components appropriate for combating the pattern of environmental degradation, while pursuing the objectives of development so that the regional states concerned and outside supporters such as Japan may work in close harmony.

The World Bank has adopted a strategy for permanent development through alleviation of poverty and improving living standards of the people, said a high official of the Bank while delivering a lecture in the city on Sunday.

Dr Sayed A Mahmud of Private Sector Development, World Bank, Washington office, gave the lecture on 'Opening up the World Bank's development-related knowledge to the developing world,' at the Community Development Library auditorium.

Vice-Chancellor of East West University Dr Farashuddin was the chief guest, while Kazi Fazlur Rahman, an advisor to the former caretaker government, presided.

Representatives from different NGOs, universities and international organizations attended the lecture.

Dr Sayed said to achieve the target the bank had been trying to create a congenial working environment.

"For that reason, the bank has undertaken the method of knowledge management system for the developing countries during the current year," Mahmud added.

He also underscored the need for acquiring knowledge to survive in this competitive world.

Dr Farashuddin said the huge information gathered by the World Bank should be disseminated to the developing countries for use in their development process.

Birth anniversary of Vivekananda observed

As Yasmin cried out for help, local people chased the snatcher and caught him from inside the Osmani Udyan. The ring was recovered from him.

4 bills to be placed in JS

At least four local government bills are due to be placed before the House for consideration. Moreover, the historic Chittagong Hill Tracts peace accord would be placed before the House.

BDR seizes smuggled goods in Comilla

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) seized smuggled goods worth Tk 23.86 lakh from different border points in the district of Comilla within six days, official sources said reports UNB.

A special patrol party of jawans of 17th battalion of Kothari raided a truck at belghar area in Sadar thana on January 1 and recovered contraband items worth over Tk 20 lakh.

In another raid the jawans of Barajala border outpost recovered 675 Indian sarees worth about Tk 2 lakh from Shalghar in Sadar thana on December 29.

7 killed in road accidents

Seven people were killed and 50 others injured in separate road accidents in Savar and Jhenidah Sunday, reports UNB.

Five people, including a schoolgirl were killed and 45 injured in a road accident on Nabinagar-Kaliakoir highway near Jiranibazar in Savar thana Sunday.

Police and witnesses said a Nabinagar ground passenger bus from Kaliakoir of Gazipur overturned at Shibrampur as it hit a roadside tree while trying to avoid a motorcycle at around noon.

Three people died on the spot while two others succumbed to injuries on way to hospital.

Of the dead, three were identified as Ilias, 27, an engineer, Mahzuba Begum 15, a student of class VIII at Anjana Model School and Majid, 22, helper of the bus. The other victim could not be identified.

The injured were admitted to local hospital.

In Jhenidah, two people were killed and 10 others injured in a road accident on Jhenidah-Magura road in Sadar thana yesterday.

The dead were identified as Mannan, 40, a resident of Basudia in Jessore district, and Bidhan 35 of Jugni in Shaikhpura thana.

According to witnesses, the accident occurred when a truck and a bus collided at Aroardanga, seven km from the town, at about 11.45 am, killing Bidhan on the spot. Mannan succumbed to his injuries at Sadar Hospital.
