Venables banned

LONDON, Jan 14: Terry Venables, the former England soccer coach who now coaches Australia's national team, was banned Wednesday from holding company directorships in Britain for seven years, reports AP.

Venables, who relinquished control of English First Division side Portsmouth earlier this week, admitted to or did not contest 19 specific allegations of serious misconduct made against him by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).

Venables reached a settlement with the DTI and agreed to a High Court order barring him from directorship and from being involved in forming, managing or promoting companies for seven years.

The court case arose from his alleged mismanagement of his former club, Tottenham Hotspur, his London night club Scribes West Ltd and another company, Edenote Plc.

Venables' lawyer, Nick Trainer, said the court ban would not affect his position as Australian coach.

Venables did not attend Wednesday's hearing.

DTI lawyer Elizabeth Glover told the court that Venables' conduct "has been such as to make him unfit to be concerned in any way with the management of a company."

Venables accepted that his conduct was of "such seriousness as to render him unfit."

Venables had been locked in a power struggle at Portsmouth with fellow-shareholder Martin Gregory, who agreed to hand over a 51 per cent controlling interest in the club to the former England coach for 1 pound (1.60 dollars) in August 1996.

But Gregory has since accused Venables of failing to fulfill his side of the deal, and Venables relinquished his majority shareholding of the club this week.

Tendulkar a la Azhar

Little master Sachin Tendulkar, who steered his side to an emphatic eight wicket victory over Pakistan with a brilliant one-man-show in the first of the three-match Independence Cup finals yesterday, became the second Indian after skipper Mohammad Azharuddin to

cross six thousand-run mark in limited-overs internationals. Sachin, the right-handed genius, achieved the distinction when he reached 45 on way to a swashbuckling 95 off 78 balls at the Dhaka Stadium.

The scintillating knock also placed Sachin, who so far has scored 6050 runs in 176 ODIs since his debut in 1989-90, eleventh in the top-run-getters list.

Former West Indies opener Desmond Haynes, with 8648 runs, is leading the elite group followed by Azharuddin who has 7649 runs to his name.

Besides, eight other batsmen — Javed Miandad, Aravinda de Silva, Salim Malik, Vivian Richards, Allan Border, Richie Richardson, Arjuna Ranatunga and Dean Jones, have also reached the magical figure.

Zimbabwe squander a good start

COLOMBO, Jan 14: Zimbabwe failed to capitalise after winning the toss, ending the day at 25.

For 9 despite a splendid start in the second and final Test against Sri Lanka at the Sinhalese Sports Club ground in Colombo on Wednesday, reports AP.

Zimbabwe earlier looked set for an imposing total, cruising along at 144 for 2, but a silly mix-up that resulted in the run out of Guy Whittall for 11 gave the Sri Lankans a golden opportunity to cash in and take control.

Whittall pushed the ball on the off-side and set off for a single with Murray Goodwin responding. But when the two batsmen saw bowler Muttiah Muralitharan challenging the run, they changed their minds and were run out, breaking their 24-run stand.

Off-spinner Muralitharan flung and accurate throw into the gloves of wicketkeeper Ramesh Kaluwatharana who flicked off the balls when Whittall was almost a metre out of his crease.

Zimbabwe then lost wickets at regular intervals mostly because of irresponsible batting as rival skipper Arjuna

Ranatunga continued to use the successful Muralitharan. Andre Flower (8), Craig Wishart (2) and Paul Strang (5) were the chief offenders to undermine the efforts of the top three batsmen Gavin Rennie (50), Grant Flower (41) and Murray Goodwin (73).

Flower gave Anurasiiri his first wicket by gently driving a ball into the bowler's hands. Strang, who was out next gave mid-off Ravindra Pushpakumara a simple catch off Anurasiiri.

Wishart played poorly, as he did in the first Test, and was ruled out leg-before to a ball from Muralitharan.

Rennie, though he made a half-century, virtually gave away his wicket by top edging a sweep against Muralitharan which resulted in a comfortable catch.

Goodwin, the day's top-scorer with 73, also misread a ball from Anurasiiri to be bowled with bounce after missing out on a cut.

Goodwin occupied the crease for 182 minutes hitting nine fours.

Grant Flower was the most aggressive of the Zimbabwean batsmen, clobbering 41 off 55 balls with eight fours before playing a delivery from pacesman Ravindra Pushpakumara

onto his stumps.

Alistair Campbell with 44 was the last to be out for the day after the second new ball was taken falling victim to Chaminda Vaas when he edged the paceman to be caught behind.

It was not immediately clear of the injury was serious enough to jeopardise his campaign for the Open, starting at Melbourne Park next week.

Chang has been replaced by 23rd-ranked Ukrainian Andrei Medvedev.

100-m freestyle gold Popov's

PERTH, Jan 14: Alexander Popov withstood a late surge by Australian Michael Klim to win his second world 100-metre freestyle title with a championship record time here today.

The 26-year-old Russian superstar led from start to finish to beat Klim by 0.27 sec clocking 48.93 secs. Klim's time was 49.20 secs.

Third was Sweden's Lars Frolander in 49.53 secs.

Popov went into the final as the second fastest qualifier after Klim had clocked 49.33 secs to Popov's 49.57 secs in winning his heat earlier today.

But Popov, who beat American Gary Hall for the world 100m title at the 1994 Rome World Championship in 49.12 secs, took charge from the start and led throughout, turning in 23.56 secs.

Popov is now a double Olympic and world 100m freestyle champion and undoubtedly the fastest man in water.

Klim was bidding for his third gold medal in his third swim at the meet, but was beaten by an outstanding champion.

Popov and Klim are training partners under Russian coach Gennadi Tourestski at the Australian Sports Institute in the national capital Canberra and are friends out of the pool.

It was Russia's first gold medal in the pool at the World Championships, although Popov will be again the one to beat in the 50 metres freestyle later in the meet.

How the match went

Indian captain Mohammad Azharuddin said that despite poor fielding, it was good work by their bowlers and batsmen especially the performance of Sachin Tendulkar which gave his side a 1-0 lead over Pakistan with a convincing eight-wicket victory in the first of the three-match finals yesterday.

"I think it is our bowlers who did a splendid job in the morning which helped us to contain Pakistan to a moderate total. And then it was Sachin who made all the difference in the afternoon," said a happy but exhausted Azhar in a post-match briefing.

"Sachin really played well. I think when he plays like that you don't stand a chance. He gave us a flying start. I wish he could get the hundred," added Azhar who has three wins in a row including two against Pakistan after he regained the captaincy earlier this month.

After two successive wins against their arch-rivals, the India skipper said, "I am obviously very happy, but I will be

much happier if we can win next couple of matches. Except the first half an hour when we dropped some catches, I think the team played quite well today."

Azhar gave full credit to his bowlers for maintaining good line and length that left hardly any room for Pakistan to score runs.

If Azhar was praising his bowlers, his counterpart Rashid Latif pointed the blame at his top order.

"I said Tuesday that everything depends on our batting and that has let us down once again."

Asked whether he would make any changes to the side for the next two matches, Latif revealed that Mohammad Hossain will be included for the next game.

"I am very shocked at the top order for throwing their wickets after getting started. Moreover, the Indians also played well," added the press shy Latif before handing over the microphone to his coach Haroon Rashid.
