Pete savages some pride

MELBOURNE, Jan 15: World number one Pete Sampras returned to winning ways today with an emphatic Colonial Classic victory over Britain's Greg Rusedski, one of his closest rivals in the looming Australian Open, reports AFP.
After his shock defeat to Brazil's French Open champion Gustavo Kuerten in a group match on Wednesday, Sampras beat Rusedski 7-5, 6-1.
But the Kuerten loss means Sampras cannot reach Saturday's final where Andre Agassi has already claimed a place. Agassi beat Croatian hard-hitter Goran Ivanisevic 6-4, 6-7 (3/7), 6-3 to take a new step forward in his comeback campaign.
Sampras came through another game with little sign of the injury that needed more than three weeks of intensive treatment at the end of last year.
In Saturday's final, Agassi will play the winner of Friday's encounter between Mark Philippoussis of Australia and Phillis Kuerten.

Zimbabwe stage fightback

COLOMBO, Jan 15: Underdogs Zimbabwe bundled out Sri Lanka for 225 in less than three sessions of play to take a first innings lead of 26 runs on the second day of the second and final Test match in Colombo today, reports AFP.
The Zimbabwe pace duo of Heath Streak and Mupfema Bhangwa applied the pressure on the home side taking the first two wickets with only 43 runs to be followed by leg-spinner Paul Strang putting the brakes with a four-wicket haul.
Streak accounted for Sanath Jayasuriya for the third time in the series and had him caught at mid-on for five and later claimed the other prized scalp Aravinda de Silva for 27.
De Silva attempted to pull Streak but only succeeded in giving the bowler a return catch.
Bhangwa accounted for the wicket of Roshan Mahanama when the batsman played a ball onto his stumps for eight.
Strang had his first wicket when Marvan Atapattu edged a ball to be caught behind by Andrew Flower for 48.
Sri Lanka went in for tea at 130 for five after losing Hashan

Sisters' final on the cards?

SYDNEY, Jan 15: The most exciting sister act in sports, Venus and Serena Williams, surged into the semifinals of the Sydney International on Thursday, reports AFP.
Serena Williams, the younger and perhaps better half of the duo, fashioned a masterful 1-6, 7-5, 7-5 comeback on a gimpy knee against third-ranked Lindsay Davenport.
Moments later, Venus took to the same Centre Court and dispatched Maggie Maleeva 6-2, 6-2.
The Williams sisters, on opposite sides of the draw, could meet Saturday in the final of this tune-up for the Australian Open. Serena faces the winner of the Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario and Natasha Zvereva match, and Venus plays either Barbara Paulus or Ai Sugiyama.
Serena, only 16 and ranked No. 96, trailed 1-6, 2-5 against Davenport and faced two match points at 15-40 when she grabbed control with a combination of wily play and youthful athleticism.
Limping on her bandaged right knee after taking an injury timeout at 1-3 in second set, Serena fashioned her victory by cutting down on the errors that cost her the first set. She suddenly ripped winners down the lines and into the corners from both sides, and watched Davenport dig herself

Novo Nordisk comes clean

COPENHAGEN, Jan 15: Danish pharmaceutical group Novo Nordisk said it produced the human growth hormone found in the luggage of a Chinese swimmer upon arriving in Australia for the World Championships, news reports said Wednesday, reports AFP.
Novo Nordisk said it sold Norditropin to a Chinese state-owned import company and was intended for hospitals in China.
"We have no clues on how the growth hormone ended up in the wrong hands," Novo Nordisk spokesman Anders Rosbo was quoted as saying by Danish media.
Yuan Yuan, a silver medalist at the 1994 World Championships, and coach Zhou Zhewen, who admitted to placing the hormone in the swimmer's bag, were banned from the championships in Perth and sent home after 13 vials of the substance were found Sunday in Yuan's luggage.

Jenny collects two more

PERTH, Jan 15: Jenny Thompson of the United States won her third gold medal of the World Championships Thursday when she claimed the 100-metre butterfly event, reports AP.
It was Thompson's second individual title after winning the 100-metre freestyle and being a member of the 4-x-100-metre relay team.
Thompson, 25, clocked 58.46 seconds, beating her own meet record set earlier Thursday.
Ayari Aoyama of Japan was second with 58.79 and Petria Thomas of Australia was third in 58.07.
Thompson's win gave the US team its sixth gold medal in the pool.
Lenny Krayzelburg of the United States won the gold in the men's 100-metre backstroke.
Ukraine-born Krayzelburg, 22, clocked 55 seconds to edge Canada's Mark Versfeld with 5.17 and German Stev Theloke on 55.20.
Hungary's Agnes Kovacs won her first major title Thursday with victory in the 200-metre breaststroke event.
Sixteen-year-old European 200- and 400-metre champion clocked a meet record of 2 minutes, 25.45 seconds.
Kristy Kowal, 19, the American winner of the 100-metre gold medal, took a silver in 2:26.19. The US also claimed bronze with 15-year-old Jenna Storm finishing in 2:26.50.
Ian Thorpe of Australia stormed home to beat compatriot Grant Hackett to the gold medal in the 400-metre freestyle final.
Thorpe, 15, mowed down the fast-starting Hackett about five metres from the wall to touch in 3 minutes, 46.29 seconds.
Hackett, 17, clocked 3:46.44 while Paul Palmer of Britain was third in 3:48.02.
Italy's European champion Emiliano Brembilla was fourth and 1991 champion Jorg Hoff-
