India accuses Pakistan of politicising

BOMBAY, Feb 5: Indian cricket chiefs ordered their second-string national team not to complete a three-day match against Karachi after Pakistani authorities postponed today's play to coincide with protest rallies against New Delhi's rule in Kashmir, reports AFP.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) accused its Pakistani counterparts of "politicising sport" after the final day's play today between India A and Karachi was put off until Friday.

BCCI president Raj Singh Dungarpur said here: "This is a very unfortunate development. Pakistan has brought politics into sport. We did not expect it

but we will not accept it either.
"We have decided not to play

Friday's game. The rest of the tour will go on." Play was put back 24 hours after Pakistan today called for a nationwide show of solidarity

with the Kashmiri's struggle for

self determination. The Himalayan state is divided between India and Pakistan and has caused two wars between them since 1947. The Indian part of the state has been the scene of an armed separatist campaign since 1989, costing

more than 20,000 lives. India A's 48-day tour, including three first-class matches and three one-dayers against Pakistan A, is the first by a senior Indian side to Pakistan since 1989.

"My goals are simple: To be number one and to do well at the majors," said Sampras, who added that breaking Connors record "would be one of my better accomplishments, may be my best compared to the Grand Slams (I have won) it's not easy to stay on top in any sport. It just proves longevity is something I'll hopefully be remembered for.


"It's one thing to (stay on top) for one year, but to do it year after year is not easy."

"In order to get to number one and stay there you have to play well every week, it's much more important to be ranked number one at the end of the year than it is at the beginning of the year."

Sampras said he was disappointed by his loss in Melbourne but won't dwell on it.

"The way I was playing the first week in Australia. thought I was going to be pretty tough to beat," Sampras said.

"The second week of a major is usually where I've picked it up in the past, unfortunately, I had a bad day . . . that was tough to swallow but I've got to do it."

Sampras, who owns 10 Grand Slam singles titles, said he is itching to break Roy Emerson's all-time record of 12. "I feel I can do in the next two to four years," he said. "I'm going to try to do whatever I can over the years to try to (break) it."
