

India accuses Pakistan of politicising

BOMBAY, Feb 5: Indian cricket chiefs ordered their second-string national team to complete a three-day match against Karachi after Pakistani authorities postponed today's play to coincide with protest rallies against New Delhi's rule in Kashmir, reports AFP.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) accused its Pakistani counterparts of 'politicising sport' after the final day's play today between India A and Karachi was put off until Friday.

BCCI president Raj Singh Durgapur said here: 'This is a very unfortunate development. Pakistan has brought politics into sport. We did not expect it but we will not accept it either.'

'We have decided not to play Friday's game. The rest of the tour will go on.'

Play was put back 24 hours after Pakistan today called for a nationwide show of solidarity with the Kashmiri's struggle for self determination.

The Himalayan state is divided between India and Pakistan and has caused two wars between them since 1947. The Indian part of the state has been the scene of an armed separatist campaign since 1989, costing more than 20,000 lives.

India A's 48-day tour, including three first-class matches and three one-dayers against Pakistan A, is the first by a senior Indian side to Pakistan since 1989.

ACB defends its decision

MELBOURNE, Feb 5: The Australian Cricket Board today rejected criticism of its tour scheduling, with chief executive Malcolm Speed saying players had been consulted and invitations to some overseas tournaments had been declined, reports AFP.

Speed was responding to comments from Australian Cricketers Association president Tim May, who said the programming of short one-day tours required greater scrutiny.

Australian limited-over captain Steve Waugh agreed, saying he would have preferred a bigger break between the third Test against South Africa which finished in a draw in Adelaide on Tuesday and the one-day tour of New Zealand.

Waugh's 12-man Australian team is set to play Pakistan's second 4-dayer from today.

Pakistan take on Border Team in their second four-day match in the South African coastal town of East London today.

Earlier on Tuesday, the visitors led by Rashid Latif gave a flying start to their South Africa tour with a huge 307-run victory over Qiziladhin West in the final day of their opening four-day match held at the Kimberley Country Club ground in Kimberley.

team left here late today on a flight to Christchurch for the February 8-14 tour, which will feature four one-day internationals.

Leg-spin wizard Shane Warne withdrew from the New Zealand tour on Wednesday complaining of shoulder soreness.

'We've been unable to accept a number of other invitations — we recognise we have to strike a balance here,' Speed said.

'There's a triangular tournament against India and Sri Lanka in Singapore this May and we won't accept the invitation unless the players indicate they wish to go.'

Speed said the New Zealand tour had been set up about 18 months ago, when current ACA consultant Graham Halbish

was still ACB chief executive. He added the players had been consulted on the nine-day Sharjah tour in April and said they had requested Australia to send a full-strength team to the Commonwealth Games in September in Kuala Lumpur.

The fourth mini-tour will be an eight-day knockout tournament in Bangladesh, which will come in the middle of the Pakistan tour towards the end of the year.

The funds from that tour will fund the worldwide development of cricket and all the Test-playing nations will take part,' Speed said.

'It is a very important event and we will break the tour for it. But Waugh, a member of the ACA executive, felt May had a point.

The Super League match of the First Division cricket league resumes Sunday with Orient Club taking on Dhammond Club on the day.

SA cricketers back home

JOHANNESBURG, Feb 5: South Africa's cricket team returned home this morning after a bruising nine-week tour of Australia, remained adamant that Australian batsman Mark Waugh should have been given out in a decisive Test match this week.

'I'm more convinced (that Waugh was out) now than I was before,' South African skipper Hansie Cronje told reporters on meeting about 100 fans gathered at the crack of dawn at the airport here to welcome the team back.

Australia have now won their last home series against all their opponents and their last away series against every one except India and Pakistan, where they lost, and New Zealand, where they drew.

Bartova sets new world mark

ERFURT, Germany, Feb 5: Daniela Bartova of the Czech Republic set a new world indoor record for the women's pole vault here Wednesday when she cleared 4.41m at an international meeting, reports AFP.

The previous world best was 4.40m set by Australian Emma George in December 1996 and equalled by Stacy Dragila of the United States four months later.

Davenport in last eight

TOKYO, Feb 5: Olympic gold medalist Lindsay Davenport said Thursday that she looks forward to meeting Martina Hingis in the final of the Toray Pan Pacific Open, an annual women's tournament being played here, reports AP.

'I would love to be in the final and have the Hingis vs Davenport final,' Davenport, the world's No 2 said after advancing to the quarterfinals by beating Japan's Naoko Sawamatsu 6-2, 6-2.

'But I still have two more matches to go,' said the 21-year-old from Newport Beach, California. 'It's a long way to go to the final for myself and I'm gonna have to play well tomorrow.'

Hingis, top-ranked in the world and the tournament's defending champion, is fresh from winning her second straight Australian Open championship, in the Toray, the top-seeded Swiss teenager has already advanced to the round of eight.

This week, Davenport moved up from the world's No 3 to second place, her highest-ranking ever. In Melbourne last week, Davenport lost to Conchita Martinez 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 in the semifinals.

On Friday, Davenport meets Romania's Irina Spilrea, 10th-ranked and seeded fifth, while

Hingis plays unseeded Rita Grande of Italy. Grande, ranked 46th, advanced with a 1-6, 6-3, 6-3 victory over 38th-ranked Maria Alejandra Vento of Venezuela.

Davenport might have an edge this time over Hingis, who has suffered a week-long cold. But Hingis said the cold was almost over.

Davenport, who lost to Anke Huber of Germany 6-3, 4-6, 6-2 in the Toray quarterfinals last year, says she feels she has a big advantage this year — she's slimmer and faster.

Among other winners, third-seed Amanda Coetzer of South Africa best qualifier Samantha Reeves of the United States 6-4, 6-4.

In an upset, wild card Miho Saeki, ranked 83rd in the world, defeated the world's No 31 Magdalena Maleeva of Bulgaria 6-4, 7-6 (7-4).

Sampras skips Davis Cup tie

OAKLAND, Feb 5: World number one Pete Sampras said Wednesday he would not play the United States' opening-round Davis Cup tie against Russia April 3-5, in Stone Mountain, Georgia, reports Reuters.

'I just talked to [US captain] Tom Gullikson and told him I wasn't playing,' Sampras said in a teleconference call. 'In the past I haven't played the first two rounds very much and I won't this year.'

Sampras said the calf injury he suffered during the United States 5-0 loss to Sweden in last December's Davis Cup final played a role in his decision.

'Having to treat that injury during the off-season had something to do with it,' Sampras said. 'I was really upset that I was injured. I've been saying for a long time that tennis needs an off-season.'

Seeds fall at Split

SPLIT, Croatia, Feb 5: Britain's top-seeded Greg Rusedski powered his way safely through his first-round clash at the ATP's 375,000 dollars Croatian Indoor tournament here on Wednesday — but fourth-seeded Andrei Medvedev of Ukraine crashed out in the second-round, reports AFP.

Rusedski raced to a 6-3, 6-4 win over Gianluca Pozzi of Italy but Medvedev went down 6-3, 6-7, 6-1 to Denmark's Kenneth Carlsen.

Another seed to be beaten was the number six Thomas Johansson of Sweden who was beaten 7-6, 6-4 by Martin Sinner of Germany.

Pressure doesn't bother Pete

OAKLAND, California, Feb 5 (Reuters): Although Australian Open champion and world number two Petr Korda is creeping up on his number one ranking, Pete Sampras says he feels no extra pressure from the Czech's ascent and is committed to breaking Jimmy Connors' open-era record of finishing five successive years on top at the end of 1998.

'My goals are simple: To be number one and to do well at the majors,' said Sampras, who added that breaking Connors' record 'would be one of my better accomplishments, may be my best compared to the Grand Slams (I have won) it's not easy to stay on top in any sport. It just proves longevity is something I'll hopefully be remembered for.'

'It's one thing to (stay on top) for one year, but to do it year after year is not easy.'

Korda is only 300 points behind Sampras in the ATP Tour rankings. Sampras has to defend his title at the Sybase Open in San Jose next week against a stellar field that includes Michael Chang, Andre Agassi and Gustavo Kuerten, while Korda will be playing in Dubai.

Sampras also has to defend points from his title at Philadelphia the week of February 23. Korda is scheduled to play a tournament every week until April and could

overtake Sampras by the end of this month.

Sampras, speaking in a teleconference call Wednesday, said he wouldn't be surprised if the 30-year-old Korda briefly took over the number one spot.

'We all have known he has the game,' Sampras said. 'The question was if he could maintain it for a number of months.'

'The second week of a major is usually where I've picked it up in the past, unfortunately, I had a bad day... that was tough to swallow but I've got to do it.'

Sampras, who owns 10 Grand Slam singles titles, said he is itching to break Roy Emerson's all-time record of 12. 'I feel I can do in the next two to four years,' he said. 'I'm going to try to do whatever I can over the years to try to (break) it.'

Sampras was upset by Slovak upstart Karol Kucera in the 1998 Australian Open quarterfinals and lost an opportunity to avenge his US Open loss to Korda.

Taylor's denial

SYDNEY, Feb 5: Australian captain Mark Taylor has denied reports that some players may boycott the Indian tour because of a lack of progress in negotiations with the Australian Cricket Board (ACB), reports PTI.

'That is not true. I think everyone is looking forward to going to India and I certainly haven't heard anything along those lines,' the ABC radio quoted him as saying.

Earlier it had been reported that the Indian tour could be in jeopardy with leading cricketers considering a boycott unless their stalled talks with the ACB on pay and conditions resumed soon.

The Australian Cricketers' Association (ACA), which has been negotiating with the ACB on behalf of the players, first mooted the idea of a strike in November last year, but the ACA executive — mostly Test players — called it off, believing it would be a public relations disaster.

Yesterday, the ACA also called for an overhaul of short one-day international tours like the four-game New Zealand tour for which Australian team leaves today.

The call came in the wake of yesterday's decision to withdraw champion spinner Shane Warne from the touring team.

Marseille Open results

MARSEILLE, France, Feb 5: French and Spanish hopes suffered severe setbacks at the 539,250 dollars ATP event here on Wednesday, reports AFP.

Sebastien Grosjean, playing in front of his home fans, limped off against eleventh-ranked former Wimbledon champion Richard Krajicek when he was at 5-5 in the second set. He had lost the first set 6-3.

And France's world junior champion Arnaud di Pasquale, who came in at the eleventh hour as a replacement for compatriot Guillaume Raoux, was beaten 6-3, 5-6, 7-6 by Spain's Francisco Roig in the first-round.
