SATKHIRA, Feb 8: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina today called upon the people to remain alert so that no unscrupulous traders could create hardship in public life by increasing prices of rice and other essentials, report agencies.

"There is sufficient stock of rice in the country and more rice is being imported and as such there is no reason for increasing prices of rice in the country," she told a mammoth public meeting at the Government High School maidan here this afternoon.

The Prime Minister said that various steps including distribution of rice under Open Market Sale (OMS) had been launched throughout the country to bring the situation under control. The OMS would soon be started at thana level, she said.

The decades-old insurgency in the Chittagong Hill Tracts is coming to a formal end with the ceremonial surrender of arms by Shantibahini guerillas at Khagrachhari Stadium, begin-

ning tomorrow. A total of 743 guerillas will surrender their arms on the first day.

Nearly 2,000 guerillas including 'regulars' are returning to civilian life with the surrender of arms in three phases under the December 2, 1997 agreement between the government and the Parbattya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS) which waged the bushwar since 1973.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will receive a gun from PCJSS Chairman Jyotirindriyo Bodhipriyo Larma alias Shantu Larma at the surrender ceremony in presence of

members of the Cabinet, political leaders, dignitaries, editors of national dailies, high civil and military officials and diplomats. He will be followed by the

PCJSS cadres who will lay down their guns in the ceremony, to be marked by release of white pigeons by the Prime Minister in a gesture of peace returning to the region after 25 years. The PCJSS armed cadres

who have been granted a general amnesty will receive a cheque for Tk 50,000 each after surrender to help them rehabilitate into normal life. The guerillas and their top

brass will be provided security, if required
