Boy burnt alive, 200 shanties gutted in Ctg

CHITTAGONG, Feb 11: A seven-year-old boy was burnt alive and about 200 shanties and 10 small shops were gutted in a devastating fire that broke out in Burma Colony here this morning, reports BSS.

Ten other people were also injured in the blaze that started at around 9:40 am and continued for more than two hours.

Fire brigade sources said an oven in a shop-cum-house sparked off the fire. It soon spread to the adjacent houses and shops as the roadside high-powered main electric cable line also caught fire.

Eight fire units from different fire stations including firemen from Navy and Air Force rushed to the spot and bring the fire under control after two hours.

The boy who died in the fire was identified as Saddam Hossain. However, the extent of loss could not be ascertained immediately.

Later, Minister for Civil Aviation and Tourism Engineer Mosharraf Hossain visited the area and assured the fire-affected people of proper assistance and rehabilitation.

COMILLA, Feb 11: Fifty people, including a fireman and a policeman, were injured as angry transport workers set fire to a bazar near Tomchham Bridge here today, reports UNB.

Article 70(1) reads: A person elected as a member of parliament at an election at which he was nominated as a candidate by a political party shall vacate his seat if he resigns from that party or votes in parliament against that party.

Dr Ershadul Bari, Dean of the Faculty of Law, Dhaka University, said Article 70 is not applicable in the case of Swapan who has already been expelled from his party, BNP.
