MSC-F'ganj Premier league opener Soccer resumes at Mirpur

Holders Mohammedan Sporting Club will take on Farashganj Sporting Club in their opening super league clash in the Premier Division at 5 pm as the last phase of the Senior Division football league which includes the super and the relegation leagues of both Premier and First Divisions, begins at the Mirpur Stadium this afternoon.

In first match of the day, Shantinagar Club will face Bangladesh Boys Club in the First Division relegation league at 3 pm.

Mohammedans lead the 10-team Premier league table with 41 points on completion of the return leg (second phase) on January 22 while Mahanagari Cup champions Mukhtjodha Sangsad Krija Chakra are second one point behind.

Federation Cup champions Abahani, who will begin their super league campaign against Farashganj on February 19, finished third with 36 points while Brothers Union and Farashganj Sporting Club, the remaining two teams which qualified for the five-team super league have 23 and 19 points respectively.

The other five teams - Rahmatganj Muslim Friends Society, Arambagh Krija Sangha, Victoria Sporting Club, Youngmen's Club Fakirerpool and Agrani Bank, will fight it out in the relegation league from tomorrow to determine the two teams that will play in the First Division next season.

Rahmatganj and Arambagh have 17 points each while Victoria and Fakirerpool finished the return leg with 16 points apiece. Agrani Bank is at the bottom with 14 points.

Jagarani Sangsad, Mirpur Chalanika, BRTC, East End Club and Dhaka Wanderers Club will play in the First Division super league which begins at the same venue tomorrow with the Badda-Wanderers match.

Badda and Mirpur Chalanika finished atop the ten-team league with 31 points each at the end of the return leg while BRTC, East End and Wanderers qualified for the super league with 28, 26 and 24 points.

Mark's list of complaints

AUCKLAND, New Zealand, Feb 13 (AP): Australia's limited-overs vice-captain Mark Waugh has hit out at the number of one-day matches scheduled by subcontinent nations, and described playing New Zealand as "boring".

Australia lead 2-1 ahead of Saturday's final match of a four-game limited-overs series against New Zealand. The series followed on closely from the tri-series, where Australia also played the Kiwis four times, and the teams will meet again in Sharjah after touring India later this month.

"It does get a bit boring," Waugh said Friday. "We have played the Kiwis how many times in the last couple of months? You play the same team 10 or 11 times and I think that is a bit much, it is probably a bit of over-kill."

Waugh also criticised India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka for not putting enough emphasis on Test matches. "There are probably too many one-dayers in countries like India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka - they seem to play every week," Waugh said.

"Fortunately we don't play quite as much, as there is more emphasis on test cricket in Australia." Meanwhile, Waugh said Australia's limited overs line-up, revamped earlier this season, would provide the basis for Australia's World Cup team in England in 1999.

"I think we have enough good players to be a force in the World Cup," Waugh said. He said the current squad had more flair than past Australian sides.

Obviously Adam Gilchrist adds a bit of flair at the top of the order and Darren Lehmann can do anything, he's a great improviser," Waugh said.

"Ricky Ponting is coming into his own now and has really developed into a top class player and Michael Bevan is the best middle order one-day player in the world."

First Test from today

JOHANNESBURG, Feb 13 (AFP/AP): Pakistan, weakened by injuries and psychologically bruised by the mugging of two key players, go into the first cricket Test against South Africa at the Wanderers here tomorrow as distinct underdogs.

Sportingly agreeing to take to the field on Saturday despite wanting an extra week to allow their two assaulted players to recover and to fly in replacement players, the news is not all bad for the visitors, however.

Back-up seamer Shoaib Akhtar is not, as was first suspected, suffering from a torn knee ligament, and will be fit for the match. Off-spinner Saqlain Mushtaq, who with strike bowler Mohammad Akram was attacked and robbed outside their hotel in the upmarket suburb of Sandton here on Wednesday night, will also be fit for action.

The Test was due to have started on Friday but the United Cricket Board of South Africa agreed to a postponement after the Pakistanis complained they were down to 10 men.

The Pakistanis wanted the match to begin only next Thursday but finally agreed to go into action tomorrow due to complications with television rights and sponsors.

Coach Haroon Rashid told the SAPA news agency the tourists decided to give the Test the go-ahead and "suffer the consequences for the sake of the game."

Rashid in any case wants replacements, and is thinking in terms of either veteran seamer Aaqib Javed or promising youngster Fazli Akbar.

"The final decision is up to the selectors," he told SAPA. "But we expect somebody - a seamer - to be flown out within the next couple of days."

Akhtar's availability will provide some much-needed support for Waqar Younis and all-rounder Azhar Mahmood up front, but the brunt of the bowling is still likely to be borne by spinners Saqlain and Mushtaq Ahmed.

"But Waqar is also a seasoned pro," said Rashid, "and he knows what's expected of him. He will rise to the occasion."

While sympathetic to the plight of the Pakistanis, the South African players will, however, give no quarter on the field.


"We never underestimate anyone," said South African coach Bob Woolmer. "Not at Test level. Even if they are slightly weakened they are still Test cricketers, so you cannot take things easy or lightly."

"Win, lose or draw - that we'll be only able to tell you in five day's time. What we have to do now is concentrate on what we do, focus on the game and make sure we get into a position to win and then try and nail it."

Gullit given the sack

LONDON, Feb 13 (Reuters): Former Chelsea greats including Peter Osgood and Ray Wilkins admitted being shocked when they heard the club were replacing Dutch manager Ruud Gullit with Italian striker Gianluca Vialli.

Peter Osgood, who scored in every round as Chelsea won the FA Cup in 1970 as well as scoring the winner in the 1971 European Cup Winners' Cup final, praised Gullit for attracting top stars to the London club - but criticised him for what he said was his casual attitude at Stamford Bridge.

Osgood, now a member of the Chelsea hospitality staff on match days, said: "Ruud has been a lucky man and very fortunate."

"At Chelsea Graham Rix does all the coaching with Gwyn Williams and they have done a lot of good work."

"From what I hear Ruud just goes along for 20 minutes a day. So maybe in the long run his going will be a good thing for the club."

"That said, and to be fair to him, he was a great player and it is his status in world football that has brought the Italian stars like Gianluca Vialli, Gianfranco Zola and Roberto di Matteo to the club."

"I don't think him leaving is about money because he is already a very rich man. I think it is about ambition, he wants to go home, or back to Italy."

"I think he has other things on his mind. I'm sure he will be going to Rangers."

Osgood, interviewed on Sky TV, went on to applaud the appointment of Vialli as player-manager and joked that at least it would ensure the Italian got a game.

"We'll miss Ruud for his charisma but I found him a very arrogant man, there was no warmth there," added Osgood. "Vialli is different class, a real gentleman."

"Ruud brought the club out of the doldrums, second in the Premier league, in the quarter-finals of the Cup Winners' Cup and the semi-finals of the League Cup, but I found it hard to understand why he kept switching the side around - at the end of the day you have to play with your best side."

Ray Wilkins, now coach at neighbouring Fulham, but Chelsea's youngest ever captain at the age of 18 in 1975 who went on to play over 200 matches for them, said: "Obviously the club had their reasons but like the rest of the football world, I'm flabbergasted."

"Chelsea have been going great guns and Ruud had got the side playing some great football which gave spectators a lot of pleasure."

John Hollins, another member of Chelsea's great side of the early 1970s who also managed the club for three years in the mid-1980s, praised Gullit as a player and manager.

"Since the 1970s Chelsea have had a few managers who have not done a lot to shout about. It's got to go on from there and I think the board looked at it that way and made this swift decision."

Kasprowicz injured

HOBART, Australia, Feb 13: Australia's fast bowling crisis deepened today with a doubt over the availability of Queensland pacer Michael Kasprowicz for the forthcoming tour of India, reports AFP.

Kasprowicz, who has become a Test regular in the absence of injured top-liners Glenn McGrath and Jason Gillespie, has a sore left hamstring.

Australian selector Trevor Hons said the injury was "untimely," but appeared minor.

Kasprowicz over-stretched his hamstring while bowling in the Sheffield Shield match against Tasmania here Thursday and subsequently left the field.

He won't bowl again in the match, but will be ruled out of a domestic limited-over game here on Sunday.

Australia are already without fast bowlers McGrath, Gillespie and Simon Cook for the Indian tour.

Kasprowicz had a magnetic resonance imaging X-ray of his hamstring today and Queensland officials said that while they had not yet seen the X-rays, an early diagnosis suggested the injury was not serious.

Zaragoza reach last four

MADRID, Feb 13: Real Zaragoza completed the Spanish Cup semifinal lineup by drawing 2-2 at Real Betis on Thursday and going through 5-2 on aggregate, reports Reuters.

Zaragoza join 1997 cup winners Barcelona, Mallorca and Second Division Alaves in the semifinals.

The visitors, 3-0 up after the first leg, effectively secured their place in Friday's semifinals draw after just 17 minutes when Pier Cherubino scored against the side that transferred him at the start of the season.

The away goal left Betis with an almost impossible task and a goal from Brazilian striker Jamelli increased the Zaragoza advantage nine minutes later.

Betis will have a quick opportunity for revenge. The clubs meet again, back at Zaragoza, in the league on Sunday.
