

Waugh hurt the hamstring when he was sent sprawling by contact with New Zealand bowler Dion Nash in the limited-overs match at Eden Park.

Australia depart for the three-Test tour of India on Friday. Waugh said he expected to be out of action for 10 days, and would be fit for the Tests.

The Australian Test vicecaptain and limited-over skipper was going for a second run during Saturday's 30-run loss when Nash took a step backwards, clipping Waugh. There was definitely a step

backwards, I'm not sure what the reason for that was," Waugh said. "He took a step backwards and I'm hoping he was trying to get out of the road, I'm disappointed with how it happened." Waugh said the situation of

bowlers appearing to block the path of running batsmen had to be addressed by officials. "Bowlers throughout this season have got in the way of

the batsmen quite a few times and I guess I paid the price today," Waugh said. "It is something that has got

to be looked at because it happened quite a few times in Australia with (South African paceman) Lance Klusener.

The Pharaohs assured themselves of one of the two Group D berths in the quarterfinals with an impressive 4-0 victory over Zambia on Friday in Burkina Faso's second city of Bobo Dioulasso.

Hossam, whose hattrick was the first of the cup, became the competition's top scorer with five goals — overtaking Guinea's Souleymane Oulare who is on three.

World Cup qualifiers and pre-tournament favourites Morocco put three goals past unfancied Mozambique in the other game of the night in Bobo Dioulasso to boost their chances of securing the second Group D slot.

They play Egypt on February 17 needing a draw to be sure of a place.

Among the tournament's other World Cup qualifiers, reigning African champions South Africa and 1996 runnersup Tunisia face an uphill struggle if they are to avoid an ignominious early exit.

Cameroon need only a draw in their final Group A match against lowly Algeria in Ouagadougou on Sunday to reach the quarterfinals.

In Group A, local eyes will be on hosts Burkina Faso, transformed from a team of losers by caretaker coach Philippe Troussier of France. The Stallions play Guinea for one of

Group A's two quarterfinal

places on Sunday. Troussier takes control of South Africa's World Cup campaign on March 1, the day after the Nations' Cup final. The Bafana Bafana must win

a Group C grudge derby on Monday against Nations' Cup novices Namibia - who beat them 3-2 in the run-up to this year's finals in Burkina Faso. Group C leaders Ivory Coast, the 1992 champions, need a win

against Angola the same day to be certain of qualifying. Tunisia face a tough challenge in Group B where all four teams are on three points with

one game to play. Only victory in the final game against a youthful yet inexperienced Togolese side on Monday will save Tunisia.

Ghana, looking to make up for yet another failure to reach the finals of the World Cup, play the Democratic Republic of Congo in Group B the same day. Egypt, three times champions but indifferent performers

of late, were solid in defence against Zambia on Friday and sharp in attack. The game was something of a grudge match as Zambia eliminated them in the Nations' Cup quarterfinals in

Hossam opened the scoring in the 34th minute, snatching two more goals in the 58th and 71st minutes. Yasser Radwan made it four in the 80th minute.
