

**England on verge of victory**

England were well on course for recording an impressive win over West Indies to level the series on the fourth day of the third Test at Queen's Park Oval in Trinidad yesterday.

Chasing a victory target of 225, England were 122 without loss a few minutes before lunch when heavy showers forced the players off the field.

Alec Stewart was batting on 62 while skipper Mike Atherton was unbeaten on 47.

**Border starts a fresh innings**

MELBOURNE, Feb 16 (Reuters/AP): Former Australia cricket captain Allan Border took on a new role today as a Test selector.

Border, who played 156 Tests for Australia, including 93 as captain, will join Trevor Hohns and Andrew Hilditch on a three-man selection panel, the Australian Cricket Board said.

The left-handed batsman scored 11,174 Test runs, as world record, before retiring from first-class cricket two years ago.

**Dubai Open Corretja's**

DUBAI, Feb 16: Fourth seed Alex Corretja claimed his first career hardcourt title Sunday by defeating fellow Spaniard Felix Mantilla 7-6, 6-1 in the final of the one million dollars Dubai Open, reports AP.

In the doubles final, India's Leander Paes and Mahesh Bhupathi, seeded first here, won their eighth title in nine final appearances and walked away with 78,000 dollars after defeating Americans Don Johnson and Francisco Montana in straight sets 6-2, 7-5.

**Sampras stoops to Agassi**

SAN JOSE, California, Feb 16 (AP/AF): Continuing his dramatic comeback after falling out of the top 100 last year, a confident and hard-hitting Andre Agassi easily upset No 1 ranked Pete Sampras 6-2, 6-4 in the Sybase Open final.

Despite Sampras' strong serves, Agassi controlled the match Sunday with power and placement to win his fourth Sybase title. He also won it in 1990, '93 and '95.

When Sampras hit long for match point, a jubilant Agassi raised his hands in victory and blew a kiss to the fans, as wife Brooke Shields cheered wildly and the crowd gave him a standing ovation.

**England hold the edge**

PORT OF SPAIN, Feb 16: Mike Atherton's England edged themselves into a possible winning position in the third Test against the West Indies at the Queen's Park Oval here Sunday — dismissing the home side for 210 and leaving themselves a victory target of 225, reports AFP.

And by close of play the tourists had reached 52 for no wicket with Atherton (30) and Alec Stewart (14) still at the crease having survived 24 overs.

Atherton, who had to be persuaded to stay on as captain for this tour, knows that another defeat here might be the beginning of the end of his record-breaking leadership reign.

As the West Indies batted through their second innings Angus Fraser again proved to be the danger. He took four for 40 while Dean Headley also came good with four for 77.

Fraser, however, also took the all-important wicket of Brian Lara — the fourth time he has removed Lara in four innings.

But England's failure to finish off the West Indies second innings after Headley's late afternoon burst of three wickets for one run in seven balls could yet prove decisive.

Adams completed the first half-century of the match

adding 51 priceless runs for the last two wickets.

Nixon McLean and Courtney Walsh contributed just three singles between them, but their role in frustrating England's timing attack was precious.

Lara's early exit for 47 to Fraser gave England the fillip they needed after yesterday's poor batting display.

Fraser eventually added the final wicket, of Adams, to his initial morning spell of 8-4-8-2.

So far, in one of the greatest of all Test comebacks, 32-year-old Fraser has taken 200 wickets in four innings at a cost of only 190 runs.

Headley bowled with great determination and shook off his hitherto inconsistency.

In the morning session he delivered 11 successive overs in sweltering conditions, giving way to slow left-arm Phil Tuftnell only for the penultimate over before lunch.

A fine ball angled across the left-handed Chanderpaul induced the edge and keeper Jack Russell — who has put his nightmare 50th Test last week behind him — tumbled to his left to scoop up a smart one-handed catch.

Five deliveries later, at the end of the same over, David Williams was pinned lbw by a distinctly sharp near-yorker and — from the first ball of his next over — Headley clean bowled Ambrose, also for a duck.

At 159 for eight the West Indies led by only 173 but Headley strained in vain for the kill — Adams pulling a short one for four and then driving through extra cover for another boundary when he pitched one further up later in the over.

Andy Caddick was again ineffective and irritatingly out of sorts on such a crucial day.

Atherton gave him only four overs in the first session and withdrew him immediately when he conceded 11 runs in the opening over after lunch.

Now, with the West Indies total moving to 180 by tea, Caddick had to come back to provide fresh legs but he was initially driven high and straight by Adams.

But, on 189, Caddick at last got one to bounce from the sluggish surface and the angle across left-hander McLean produced the edge. Stewart, to the relief of England, fell to his left at second slip to hold a good catch.

Yet there was still more frustration as 21 runs were eked out for the final wicket.

Adams once sliced Caddick in the air between Mark Butcher and John Crawley in the covers and then smashed Headley high over extra cover for four. Headley also had frenzied lbw appeals against both Adams and Walsh turned down.

England's tactics during this tense period of spreading the field early in the over to try to restrict Adams possibly

contributed merely to an easing of pressure on the batsman, but, in fairness, the West Indian tailenders did defend skillfully and, ironically, their resistance may also have given extra belief to England's top order that they could also survive and thrive on this pitch.

Finally, five overs after it was due, Atherton called for the new ball — and he called up Fraser to use it.

Fraser could not, and did not, let him down. Adams speared his third delivery straight to the skipper at mid-off.

England's assistant coach John Embury warned England openers Mike Atherton and Alec Stewart that they must win a second battle with Curtly Ambrose when the Test continues Monday.

There is still a lot of hard work to be done. We all believe that we can win this Test. But we need Mike and Alec to get us off to a good start again in the morning.

They have played brilliantly to get us into this position but I imagine the West Indies will open up with Ambrose and Walsh once more Monday and the first dozen or so overs will be crucial.

Waugh and Kasprovic suffered minor hamstring strains last week but the selection panel was satisfied the pair should depart with the rest of the 15-man squad.

Hohns said Australian team physiotherapist Erol Alcott had consulted both players and decided there was no risk in them touring.

Waugh strained his hamstring in a collision with New Zealand bowler Dion Nash in a limited-over match last Saturday, while Kasprovic felt a twinge in his hamstring while bowling for Queensland in the Sheffield Shield match against Tasmania on Friday.

**Zimbabweans tuned up well**

TIMARU, New Zealand, Feb 16: Zimbabwe tuned up for the first Test against New Zealand from Thursday with an innings and 56-run win over provincial side Canterbury on Monday, reports AP.

Zimbabwe took the final five wickets for 52 runs to wrap it up before lunch on the fourth day.

**Azhar bails Pakistan out**

A fantastic 136 by all-rounder Azhar Mahmood took Pakistan to a respectable 329 all out in their first innings on the third day of the first Test in Johannesburg yesterday.

The South African second innings could not start due to poor light. The Proteas are 35 runs in front.

Mahmood's ton was his second in seven Tests and surpassed his previous best — an unbeaten 128 in Rawalpindi against the same opposition in September last year.

AP adds: Pakistan, propped up by an unbeaten 87 by Azhar and a century stand for the sixth wicket, made 265 for eight at tea.

Mahmood and Moin Khan (46) shared 107 runs as Pakistan recovered from a top order batting collapse that had them struggling on 112 for five.

Mahmood, a right handed all rounder, gutted the South Africa attack with 14 bound-

ninth wicket partnership between Pat Symcox and Mark Boucher enabled the home side to reach a total of 364 all out, Pakistan were 106 for four when bad light stopped play.

With rain having caused a three-and-a-half hour stoppage earlier, a total of 31 overs were lost. Only three overs were bowled when play resumed, with Pakistan adding 15 runs without further loss before it was decided the light was too bad, despite floodlights being on.

Symcox, 37 years old, became the first number 10 batsman to score a Test century in 96 years, as he and 21-year-old wicketkeeper Boucher took their ninth wicket partnership to 195, beating the mark of 190 set by Asif Iqbal and Intikhab Alam for Pakistan against England at the Oval in 1967.

Pakistan opening batsmen Aamir Sohail and Saeed Anwar were dismissed off successive balls with the total on 15.

Sohail, who replaced the injured Rashid Latif as captain

for the match, was given out by umpire Cyril Mitchell, caught down the legside by wicket-keeper Boucher off Pollock, although the ball appeared to have brushed his shirt as he attempted a hook shot. Anwar was caught at first slip by Cullinan off Donald.

Ijaz Ahmed and Wasim Mohammad staged a recovery, putting on 72 in 65 minutes before Wasim, who made an impressive 44 off 44 balls with eight fours, was caught behind off a ball Klusener which lifted sharply.

Inzamamul Haq was bowled for a duck in Klusener's next over.

**Aussies set to split cricket**

MELBOURNE, Feb 16: The Australian Cricket Board (ACB) is expected to announce tomorrow the formal separation of Test and one-day matches in its international calendar from next season, a move sought by the Australian Cricketers' Association (ACA), reports AFP.

The announcement is expected at the launch of the board's five-year strategic plan which will be the start of a six-month process to determine the direction of cricket in Australia.

The ACB today refused to comment on the strategic plan, first announced in August, saying only that as part of the process workshops would be held in each state.

Contributions would be sought from past and present players and state associations as well as the ACA and the public.
