Architecture Dept teachers blast BUETTA comment

The teachers of the Architecture Department of BUET have sharply reacted to a comment made by the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology Teachers' Association (BUETTA) that the teachers of the architecture department be punished for tarnishing the reputation of BUET and violating the rules and regulations of the university. They also questioned the justification of such a remark.

Shamsul Wares, Associate Professor of the Architecture Department, told this correspondent that the statement of the association was disappointing.

According to him "BUETTA is for the welfare of the teachers. The association might have played a neutral role, rather they went on supporting the authority. They should have looked for a solution of this stagnant situation. We have the right to protest. If we are made to be a minority, that would be undemocratic," he added.

About the present development, he said that they are ready for negotiation. And they would call off the work abstention only if the authority ensures to go back to the previous admission procedure from next year.

But the registrar of the university intimated a meagre possibility of such negotiation. A decision, taken at a syndicate meeting, held recently, urged the teachers of the Architecture Dept to call off the work abstention.

Asking why they want a separate examination procedure, Wares explained elaborately. He mentioned that there was no change brought in the case of Engg Departments, only they are the sufferers. "The physics needed in engg covers a wide spectrum, but in architecture, the emphasis is given only on light, acoustics etc rather than electricity and magnetism and all that", he said. So like in physics, the skill required in mathematics and English is also less than engineering. That's why the teachers are demanding a separate examination test. He concluded saying "The new system is completely abortive in terms of searching future ingenious designers the architects. The department mainly look for the creative minds not the mechanised brain".

Pressure is mounting on both the sides and a new semester is about to commence. So it is expected to draw an end to this situation very soon.

UNICEF to expand activities in CHT

RANGAMATI, Feb 19: United Nations Children Fund (UNICEF) has decided to expand its activities in the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT).

The UNICEF will undertake a package of development works in the fields of water supply, nutrition, health care, horticulture, kitchen gardening and formal and informal education in collaboration with the CHT Development Board (CHTDB), board official Abdul Aziz told BSS.

The assurance came after a UNICEF team led by its country representative Rolf C. Carriere held talks with the local officials today following a three-day visit to three hill districts of Rangamati, Khagrachhari and Bandarban when they exchanged views with local officials, political and social leaders and common people.

CHTDB undertook an UNICEF aided project at a cost of Taka 27 crore in 1985 in the first phase, followed by its second phase at a cost of Taka 35 crore for the socio-economic development of the remote areas of the region.

Several other donor agencies and countries have agreed to extend their hands for the development of the hill region.

22 more youth training centres to be developed, says minister

State Minister for Youth and Sports Obaidul Quader yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that the government would set up 22 more residential youth training centres at different district headquarters, reports BSS.

Replying to a private member's resolution moved by Mostafizur Rahman (AL-Chittagong) for setting up a technical training centre at Sandwip, he said that the present government has already set up 21 such centres at the district level.

Besides, the government has a programme to introduce 69 technical training centres at different parts of the country, Quader said.

He said that the present government led by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has realised the importance of finding jobs for the vast number of unemployed youths.

Seminar to discuss draft bill on NHRC Sunday

A seminar to discuss issues relating to the current draft bill on the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in Bangladesh will be held at the National Press Club at 10 am on February 22, reports UNB.

Amnesty International (AI) Bangladesh in collaboration with AI-International Secretariat have organised the seminar.

The seminar will enable to get a more thorough understanding of the views and perspective of human rights NGOs on the proposed NHRC.

Delegates from the AI's International Secretariat visiting Dhaka will provide a brief overview of AI's position on NHRC in general as well as assessment of the current draft of the bill for the establishment of an NHRC in Bangladesh.

2nd Corrigendum to International Tender for Supplying Sweet Water (Tender No BEPZA-CE-11/97)

The following amendment are incorporation in the tender documents:

- In 6th & 7th line of page-1 Para-2 it is mentioned that the quantity may increase for which provision for future expansion should be kept. The ultimate requirement after 15 years may be considered to be around 4 million gallons per day.
- In SI 16, 17(a), 17(b) and 18(a) under "Terms and Conditions for Supplying Quality Water in Chittagong Export Processing Zone (CEPZ)" the amendments made are hereunder:
 - In SI No 16 the liquidated damage for delay in commissioning shall be US\$ 1000 per day up to a maximum of 60 days.
 - In SI No 17(a) instead of "1000 mgd" it should read "for each 1000 gallon per day. In SI No 17 (b) instead of "1.5 mgd" it should read 2 mgd."
 - In SI No 18(a) the guaranteed capacity shall be "2.25 million gallon per day" instead of "2.7 million gallon per day."

All other terms and conditions including the amendment made earlier (No BEPZA-CE-11-97/106. Dated: 21st December, 1997) shall remain unchanged.
