

### News snaps

#### 6 injured in stampede

SIRAJGANJ, Feb 22: At least six people were injured in a stampede when miscreants tormented them exploding crackers in aird around the district Judge Court and DC office on Thursday, reports UNB.

The terrorist incident took place after the release of a student leader of Shahjadpur Govt College on bail.

The miscreants left the scene after the students, who came to receive their leader Polash, GS of the college students union, chased them with the help of local people. Office work in the area was disrupted for about two hours due to the trouble.

Local people said Polash, arrested in five cases, had been detained under the Special Powers Act.

#### Hospital medicine being smuggled out

RANGPUR, Feb 22: Kotwali police accompanying DB police have recovered huge quantities of government medicines and FP materials worth Taka three lakh from different areas of Rangpur town recently.

Six persons were arrested so far in this connection. According to police, most of the recovered medicines and other items owned by UNICEF were supplied free of cost to government hospitals and clinics. A section of people in collaboration with the hospital staff took out these medicines from the government stores and sold it to some criminals to smuggle into India.

Police on a tip-off launched a surprise drive and recovered the stolen medicines.

#### School girl raped, killed

SIRAJGANJ, Feb 22: A school girl was allegedly raped and killed by a group of miscreants at Ashuria in Shahjadpur thana on Friday night, reports UNB.

Police sources said the victim was identified as Amina Khutun, 13, a student of class eight of Ashuria High School. The miscreants abducted her at gun point on January 26 from her village home. After 11 days, police recovered Amina's body from the Karotan river. Her body was tied with a sunken boat. Police sent the body to Shahjadpur Thana Health Complex for autopsy. A case was filed in this connection.

#### Meeting of Patuakhali Agri Credit body

PATUAHKHALI, Feb 22: A meeting of the district agriculture credit committee was held here recently with Deputy Commissioner (DC) Habibullah in the chair, reports BSS.

Among others, General Certificate officer, Thana Nirbahi Officer, local representatives of different nationalised commercial banks, Bangladesh Krishibank, Bangladesh Bank, Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation, district fishery department, district agriculture extension department, district livestock deptt, and Swanirvar Bangladesh attended the meeting.

The DC who is also the president of the district agriculture credit committee expressed his dissatisfaction over the lending, recovery and disposal of certificate cases of different banks in the region.

#### Use of tractors gaining popularity

MEHERPUR, Feb 22: Use of tractors and power tillers is gaining popularity among the farmers of the district, reports BSS.

According to a survey conducted by the sadar thana agriculture department more than 80 per cent of the cultivable lands have been brought under mechanised cultivation in the district by using power tillers and tractors. Some farmers, when contacted, informed that most of them are now tilling their lands by tractors and power tillers. Agriculture Bank has allocated Taka 75 lakh as loan on easy terms and conditions to help the poor and marginal farmers to buy power tillers and other agricultural instruments.

### Aman production falls short of target in 16 N-dists

NATORE, Feb 22: The production of transplanted Aman crop during the last season was much lower than the target fixed in the 16 northern districts due to rampant use of substandard fertiliser, untimely drought and rainfall, reports UNB.

Agriculture Extension Department (AED) officials here said the estimated production of the high yielding variety of Aman was 2.44 mts per hectare of land while the actual production was 2.10 mts.

They said the drought-like situation during the peak season and unwanted rain at the time of harvesting aggravated the situation.

Rainfall was essential during the blooming period of the crop when the cluster of paddy contain milk. But there was no rainfall during that time.

The officials said the farmers in the district were not aware of using high nutrient chemical fertiliser Di-Ammonium Phosphate (DAP) and

metric tons. But actual production was 27.75 lakh mts and the loss of production was estimated at about Tk 200 crore.

Experts said rampant and disproportionate use of SSP fertiliser mostly smuggled in from India instead of granular TSP or DAP was the main cause of the decrease in the production of paddy.

They said the drought-like situation during the peak season and unwanted rain at the time of harvesting aggravated the situation.

Rainfall was essential during the blooming period of the crop when the cluster of paddy contain milk. But there was no rainfall during that time.

The officials said the farmers in the district were not aware of using high nutrient chemical fertiliser Di-Ammonium Phosphate (DAP) and

stressed the need for orientation programme in this regard.

While talking to this correspondent, additional director of AED, Rajshahi division MA Sattar said mass awareness and knowledge of hi-nutritious chemical fertiliser like DAP are essential for our farmers to overcome such situation in future Irri-Boro farming.

He also said AED has already started a series of programmes to arouse consciousness among the farmers about the unwanted substandard SSP fertiliser.

It is observed that about 80 per cent farmers are not familiar with the Block Supervisors (BS) — the field-level agri officials in this region. Generally the farmers get latest and scientific information for crop cultivation from the BS of AED.

### 2 killed in Araihazar road mishap

NARAYANGANJ, Feb 22: One woman and her six-year-old child were killed in a road accident on Dhaka-Sylhet highway at Araihazar thana in the district on February 17 afternoon.

Police said the dead bodies were identified as Shamsunnahar, 30, wife of Farid Mia, and her son Kabir inhabitants of Rupura thana in Narasinghpur.

A Dhaka-bound speeding truck hit Shamsunnahar and his son from behind while they were waiting for transport at Patchrukh bus stoppage at about 2 pm.

The mother and her child died on the spot while the killer vehicle managed to flee. The bodies were sent to Narayanganj General Hospital morgue for autopsy.

A case was lodged with Araihazar thana in this connection.

##### Husband to die for killing wife

FARIDPUR, Feb 22: District and Sessions Judge of Faridpur SMA Samad in a judgement delivered on January 25 sentenced Idris Bhuiyya, son of Dalluddin Bhuiyya, Deputy Commissioner (DC), Char Magduba under Bhanga thana to death for killing his wife and acquitted seven other accused. The judgement was pronounced in absence of Idris Bhuiyya.

The story in brief is that Manwara Begum, daughter of Abdur Rouf Matubbar of village Gazaria under Bhanga thana was married to Idris Bhuiyya, son of Dalluddin Bhuiyya of village Char Magduba in the same thana nearly two and a half years ago. On February 24, 1996, an exchange of hot word took place between the husband Idris and wife Manwara Begum over dowry. At one stage Idris beat her wife mercilessly. As a result, she died on the spot.

A case was lodged with Bonga thana. Police submitted chargesheet against the accused after investigation. Public Prosecutor Advocate Abul Bhasher Sarder stood for the plaintiff while Advocate Dulal Chandra Sarkar stood for the accused.

##### 11 shops gutted

Eleven shops at Maskandia bus stand under Madhukhali thana were burnt away in a devastating recent.

According to firebrigade source, the fire originating from short circuit of a shop. It gutted all 10 adjoining shops. The firebrigade personnel on receipt of information rushed to the spot and brought fire under control fighting for an hour. They saved other valuable shops of the bus stand. The damage caused by the fire was roughly estimated at Taka seven lakh.
