Boy killed in road mishap

PATUAKHALI, Feb 24: A boy was crushed under the wheels of a passenger bus near Katikpasha on Patuakhali-Barisal road recently, reports UNB.

Local people said the boy, identified as Shahidul, 8, met the accident on Saturday last when he tried to cross the road. Police seized the vehicle but the driver managed to escape. A case was lodged with Dumki police in this connection.

Girl violated

MAGURA, Feb 24: A minor girl was violated by two young men at Baraipara village in Sripur Thana of the district on Sunday, reports UNB.

Police said the girl, 12, was going to the neighbouring Tupipara village when the two culprits, identified as Jewel and Irfan, abducted her. They took her to a house and violated her one after another. Later, police on a tip-off, rescued the girl from the house of one Akber in village Sripur and sent her to the hospital for medical test. A case was filed with the police.

Crushing on in Darsana Sugar Mills

CHUADANGA, Feb 24: The Darsana Sugar Mills has produced 9,814 tonnes of sugar till Sunday during its 100 days of crushing of sugarcane in the current season, reports BSS.

The mill crushed 1,09,817 tonnes of sugarcane. The production in the mill is now going on in full swing. The mill has fixed up a target to produce 10,725 tonnes of sugar in the current season by crushing 1,30,000 tonnes of sugarcane. The production in the mill will be continued till the first week of the next month.

Boro farming target won't be achieved in Sunamganj

SUNAMGANJ, Feb 24: Farmers feared that the target of Boro cultivation in the district would not be achieved during the current season mainly due to want of irrigation facilities, reports UNB.

Sources in Agriculture Extension Department said the production target of paddy was fixed at 3.26 lakh metric tons, but there might be a shortfall of over 72,000 metric tons worth Tk 80 crore.

There was no rainfall in time, said the farmers adding that the water-bodies like haors, canals and baors are running short of water.

This has created a serious problem for irrigation facilities in the Boro fields threatening production shortfall in the district which is traditionally a surplus area. Officials said they had expected food surplus of about 2 lakh metric tons here this season.

Almost all the 124 haors in the district are running short of water leaving a large area of land without irrigation.

The farmers said pest attack in different areas of the district has created concern among the farmers. They said they could not collect good quality seeds due to the pest attack during the last season.

Roads, bridges in bad shape in Khagrachhari

KHAGRACHHARI, Feb 24: Some roads and at least 20 bridges and culverts of the district have become unfit vehicular traffic.

Everyday hundreds of buses, trucks and other vehicles are passing through the damaged roads, bridges and culverts with high risks. The roads are: Khagrachhari-Panchhari, Khagrachhari-Dhiginala, Khagrachhari-Rangamati, Khagrachhari-Chittagong and Khagrachhari-Feni road. The roads need immediate repair and reconstruction.

Innumerable potholes have developed on the aforementioned roads.

Meanwhile, 20 bridges and culverts are also in deplorable condition. The bridges which are in dilapidated condition are Matiranga bridge, Manikchhari bridge, Nakapa bridge and Guimara bridge.

Train passengers woes multiply

CHANDPUR, Feb 24: The train passengers of Chandpur-Laksham, Chandpur-Chittagong, Chandpur-Sylhet, Chandpur-Hazigonj sections are facing immense sufferings due to irregular train services, unhygienic conditions of railway stations and negligence of the railway staffers.

Most of the trains run in these routes irregularly. According to passengers, the number of trains as well as compartments are inadequate. Small number of compartments in each train can not cope with heavy rush of passengers. Sometimes trains run without first and second class compartments creating great inconvenience to upper class passengers.

Contraband worth Tk 43cr seized from Rajshahi border

RAJSHAHI, Feb 24: Contrabands worth about Tk 43.12 crores were seized by the BDR personnel from different border areas of Rajshahi region during the last six months till February 15 last.

BDR also arrested 72 people for their alleged involvement in smuggling and fled 1934 cases in these connections during the period.

Among the seized goods, silk yarn, brass, copper, touch-stone statue, onion, gold, silver and electronic goods worth about Tk 32.83 crores have been recovered during smuggling to India. The contrabands incoming from the neighbouring country included saffron, motor parts, cattle head, bicycle, cosmetics and crockeries worth about Tk 10.30 crores.

BDR authorities further said, smuggling activities in the region were not being controlled completely due to various reasons which include non-cooperation of local district administration, other law enforcing agencies and people.

Shortage of adequate number of Border Out Posts (BOPs), manpower and vehicles.

Citing an example BDR sources said, Mazar Diar is a big land on the Padma river bed near border in Rajshahi district, but there is no BOP camp in the area.

Mahananda Bridge Task Force at Chapainawabganj has been withdrawn recently by the decision of the concerned district administration which was hampering the smuggling control activities.

The BDR authorities have sought full cooperation from all concerned in checking border related crimes in the region.

The number of passengers travelling without tickets have increased recently. It has been causing sufferings to the genuine passengers. Scores of beggars and toll collectors have been creating problems to the passengers.

Most of the compartments are not kept clean. Sometimes water and light are not available in the toilets. Doors of many toilets are found broken. Sometimes compartments have no electricity and fans. In most railway stations there is no waiting rooms for upper class passengers. Toilets in the stations are dirty. Those are not cleaned regularly. Waiting rooms in most of the stations

have no proper sitting arrangement. Sometimes waiting rooms are found locked.

The trains do not maintain timetable. The arrival and departure of trains are often late by two to three hours. As a result the passengers particularly those who attend schools, colleges and offices are worst sufferers. It is alleged that some corrupt railway employees are allowing passengers to travel without tickets. It is also alleged, booking counters start functioning just a few minutes before the arrival of trains. As a result many passengers fail to purchase tickets on time. The inter-city service train between Chandpur and Chittagong runs with heavy crowd everyday. Passengers even cannot purchase tickets two or three days earlier. Tickets are sold in black market. Many railway lands in Kalibari court station and main station are being grabbed by unauthorised persons. It is alleged many railway lands are leased out illegally.

Many shops, hotels and restaurants are being constructed in railway stations causing inconveniences to passengers.

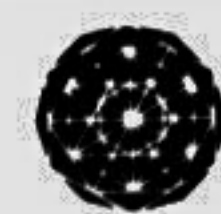
