The home team led by 3-0 with just 15 minutes to go and were 4-1 up in the 86th minute, only to throw away the lead and allow the Congolese to snatch third place.


Klinsmann ready for action



Coming together with West Indies struggling at 38 for two after losing both openers, the pair added 159 for the third wicket before Lara, playing with ever-increasing fluency and looking certain of a century, drove slightly uppishly off Robert Croft to be brilliantly caught inches from the ground by Graham Thorpe at extra

Lara batted for 256 minutes. faced 201 balls and hit 13 fours and two sixes.

But Chanderpaul was not to be denied his well-deserved century and there were dramatic scenes as he reached the mark just before the close.

Crowds of spectators swarmed onto the pitch to congratulate him and there were' scuffles between supporters and police and several of the England players remonstrated with the supporters.

Lara returned to the middle to help persuade spectators to leave the pitch.

"They should not have been out there but fortunately they did not do much damage," Lara said afterwards.

The day began badly for Mike Atherton when he lost the toss in his 50th Test as captain and it got no better as his team missed chances to make early inroads into the West Indies batting.

In the first over off-spinner Robert Croft, brought into the side to form a spin partnership with left-armer Phil Tufnell, fumbled the ball when the openers went for a short single. Then in the sixth over Stuart Williams hooked medium-fast bowler Dean Headley high to deep fine leg where Angus Fraser failed to get to the ball

which went for six. And with West Indies on 55 for two Alec Stewart dropped a waist-high catch at second slip off Chanderpaul when he had made only nine. It was to prove an expensive mistake.

Williams was the first to go. caught low in the slips by Thorpe off Fraser for 13 to give the pace bowler his 21st wicket of the series.

Fellow-opener Sherwin Campbell spent 71 minutes scoring 10 before he failed to get his bat out of the way of a rising ball from Headley and was caught behind by Jack Russell. England then faced another problem when Headley was

twice warned for running on the pitch. One more warning means he would be unable to bowl again in the innings. In the afternoon session Lara and Chanderpaul began moving up through the gears,

mixing cautious defence with a series of blistering drives. Lara hit a six off Croft and seven fours in his 124-ball fifty

and hit a second six off Headley immediately afterwards.

Chanderpaul has so far batted 314 minutes, faced 228 balls and hit 13 fours and a six to be 100 not out at the close. He has already added 74 for the fourth wicket with Carl Hooper who opened his scoring with a six and was undefeated on 36 at the end of play.

sence of ace fast bowler Allan Donald as he came out of the shadows of Anwar's fifth Test century in his 29th match. Donald has been ruled out of

the rest of the Test with a strained muscle on his right buttock. He will bat in South Africa's second innings if required. Pollock bowled outstanding on either side of the tea break

and his scalps included Anwar, who was trapped leg before wicket for 118 runs. Pollock, playing on his home ground, began the slide by removing Yousaf Youhana for

one, his second failure on debut. Youhana scored five in the first innings Pollock then proceeded after tea to trap Moin Khan (5) and Anwar lbw and had first in-

nings centurian Azhar Mahmood caught behind for one. With Mushtaq Ahmed and Shoaib Akhtar unbeaten on 16 and once respectively, bad light stopped play with 13.5 overs still to be bowled.

Anwar and Aamir Sohail had laid the platform for a big second innings total with a 101run first wicket stand.

Ferreira on a roll

Pakistan to 98 without loss. Soon after lunch, Sohail, having struggled throughout his 144-minute for 36, edged Donald to wicketkeeper Mark Boucher.

Anwar, 29, was uncharacteristically subdued throughout his 312-minute innings as he anchored the side's innings with a chanceless effort. He smashed Pollock for four

to become the 20th Pakistani to score 2000 runs in Test cricket. Anwar and Ijaz Ahmed (24) figured in 58-run stand for the second wicket when Fanie de Villiers produced a double blow in his 13th over.

Ahmed was bowled and three balls later Wasim (5) was run out at bowler's end backing up a second run that was never on. It was a rare failure by Mahmood. In his last three first-class outings, the talented right hander had hit centuries including a career-best 136 in
