

land skipper Mike Atherton braced himself for a new round of criticism of his captaincy after England crashed to a humiliating 242run defeat in the fourth Test against the West Indies here on

Monday. But he said that although the West Indies had deserved their win, England could still win the

Despite the brave words, a slump in Atherton's batting form (he was out for a duck and one in his two innings here) and his controversial decision to use only two frontine seamers and two spinners rather than three pace bowlers, made Atherton's 50th Test as England's captain one he will want to for-

The West Indies outthought and outplayed England from day one to go 2-1 up in the six-Test series and all the excitement generated by England's three-wicket triumph in Trinidad a fortnight ago evaporated as England followed up their dismal first innings 170 with an even worse 137 total in their second.

There were just five balls of the fourth day remaining when Curtly Ambrose had Dean Headley caught in the slip cordon for nine to wrap up the West Indian triumph.

Earlier, a poor display in the field allowed the West Indies. who scored 352 in their first innings, to rally from their overnight 127 for nine in their second innings to reach 197 all

England's psychological advantage, gained on day three, soon evaporated in the morning sunshine as Bishop and Ramnarine produced a defiant partnership.

The left-handed Ramnarine, in his debut Test, was let off four separate times to difficult chances and took full advan-

The two established a new last wicket record stand for the West Indies against England. beating the unbeaten 67 put on by Michael Holding and Colin Croft at Antigua in 1981. They were finally separated just before lunch

Bishop's unbeaten topscore of 44 off 94 balls included four fours and a towering six off leftarm spinner Phil Tufnell. Ramnarine's contribution was 19 before fast bowler Dean Headley removed him to finish with three for 90 off 31 overs.

The West Indies world class new ball pair took over in the afternoon.

Ambrose struck with the fifth ball of his second over. removing England skipper Mike Atherton lbw for one with a sharp breakback.

Atherton's place in the team as opener will almost certainly come under review. He has scored only 216 runs since his 77 against Australia at Lord's last June for a miserable average of 14.4.

Walsh, in his 100th Test, was not to be denied. He soon provided a double strike of his own to leave England 22 for three.

Alex Stewart, England's leading batsman in the series, was lbw playing across for 12. Two balls later, Nasser Hussain got tangled up by a Walsh bouncer and fended a catch to Jimmy Adams at short-leg.

Only six more were added when Ambrose responded with his second wicket. Left-hander Graham Thorpe flicked off his legs and Ramnarine came up with a superb low, diving twohanded catch at leg gully.

With Ambrose and Walsh given a rest, it appeared England would send the match into the fifth and final day.

After a stand of 30 between Mark Butcher and Ramprakash, Hooper hit in the first over after tea. The left-handed Butcher was lbw for 17, playing across the line.


Again the West Indies were temporarily stalled as wicketkeeper Jack Russell and Ramprakash added 32 in an hour and a half. But Walsh returned with a wicket in his first over of a second spell, Ramprakash undone by an unplayable legcutter that he somehow managed to deflect to the wicket-

keeper. Russell and Robert Croft held firm for a further 45 minutes before West Indies captain Brian Lara brought back Am-

brose for his second assault. But it was Hooper who broke the developing stand, Croft edg-ing an arm ball to the wicketkeeper. Hooper also removed Angus Fraser to a top-edged

In between, Lara clung on to a brilliant first slip catch to dispatch Russell off Ambrose, who rounded off the innings and the match with the wicket of Headley, caught at fourth slip by Shivnarine Chanderpaul.

West Indies skipper Brian Lara was optimistic that his team would now go on to win

"I think we can come out on top in the fifth Test in Barbados and may be go on to win the series 4-1."

Lara admitted that winning the toss proved crucial in his side's victory in the fourth Test. The West Indies captain gave much of the credit for the victory to his pace attack of Curtly

Ambrose and Courtney Walsh. "Carl Hooper and Dinanath Ramnarine had very good matches. But Curtly and Courtney have done the job so often that you rely on them so much that it becomes automatic," he

Atherton said he is still confident England can square the series in the fifth Test in Barbados.

"We've got happy memories at Barbados," he said, adding: "We won there last time and we'll have a lot of support there. Hopefully we can play as well as we did last time and level the series."

Chanderpaul, who made a fine 118 in the West Indies first innings, was named man-ofthe-match by former West Indies opening batsman Roy Fredericks

Chile's chilly strike duo

SANTIAGO, Chile, Mar 3: Chile's star striker Ivan Zamorano says Italian head coach Cesare Maldini has a reason to be worried when the two national squads play in the soccer World Cup in France in June, reports AP.

Zamorano played Sunday for his side Inter Milan after several months sidelined by injuries, and scored a goal in the 2-0 victory over Napoli.

Noting that Maldini was at the stands in the San Siro stadium. Zamorano wrote Monday in his weekly column in the Santiago daily El Mercurio: "With the goal I scored, I have given (Maldini) one more reason to be worried, although he probably was already after Chile's victory over England in Wembley and the superb performance there by Marcelo Salas.

Salas, the striker of River Plate of Argentina, scored both goals in Chile's 2-0 upset victory over England Feb 11.

Salas, 23, who will join the Lazio side of Rome after the World Cup with a multi-million dollar contract also scored one goal Sunday in River's 4-1 victory over Espanol in Buenos Aires.

The recovery of Zamorano and the continued good performances by Salas have Chilean fans growingly enthusiastic about their national team's possibilities in the World Cup.

El Mercurio, Chile's largest newspaper, on Monday displayed two full pages with a poll among several prominent Latin American sports writers comparing Salas and Brazilian star Ronaldo of Inter Milan, FIFA's player of the year in 1996 and 1997: the result, an 8.6 mark for Salas, 8.5 for Ronaldo.



"We have shown throughout the series that we have the capability to bowl them out twice, and I do think the West Indies batting is fragile. "There is no reason we can't

continue to do that and we can therefore win in the next Test in Barbados if we start getting some runs on the board. "We have come back in this

series already and if we win in Barbados the series will be 2-2 and we will be right back in it.
