

Former Pakistani Test player Manzoor Elahi and his compatriot Sher Ali formed a formidable al liance to exploit the highest aggregate total in the Janakantha Premier Division cricket league as Kalaba-



gan ran away with a mammoth 132-run win over Bangladesh Biman at the Dhaka Stadium yesterday.

The Super League clash between two worthy opponents tilted the Bagan way with Manzoor and Sher Ali stroking their way to complete their maiden league century and helping Kalabagan to amass a mind-boggling 308 for four in their share of 50 overs. The stockily-built right-hander reached the magical three-figure mark off only 78 balls with a towering sixer followed by a single off Biman skipper Ziaur Rashid.

Opening the Kalabagan innings with Harun-ur Rashid. Manzoor set the Dhaka Stadium alight with a flurry of shots all over the ground. With the Pakistani pinch-hitter on song, Kalabagan completed their 50 in 7.2 overs, 100 in 19.3 overs and the 150 came in only 26.3 overs.

Manzoor blazed his way to 50 off 41 balls studded with seven savage hits across the rope and three over-boundaries including a magnificent one off seamer Mofizur over extracover. His second fifty came off only 37 balls with the help of a quartet of fours.

Manzoor shared 89 runs in 16 overs with Harun before the latter departed for a patient 23 off 55 balls.




