India go level with Pakistan

KARACHI, Mar 8: Samir Dad was the hero for a second straight match, scoring twice in the second half and giving India a 2-0 victory against Pakistan Saturday to even their eight Test series at two games apiece, reports AP.

Dad, who poked in a rebound midway through the second half of Thursday's 4-3 victory in Lahore, scored 12 minutes apart to send the series back to India for the remaining four games beginning March 19.

Defenders Lazarus Barla and Dilip Tirkey also starred for India, keeping the Pakistanis away from goalkeeper A B Sub-

Dad put India ahead 10 minutes into the second half, scoring off a feed from right wing Mukesh Kumar.

In the 57th, Indian skipper Dahnraj Pillay and Kumar beat Pakistan defenders Naveed Alam and Danish Kaeelm before Pillay returned the ball to Dad, who doubled the Indian advantage.

Pakistan started off well when in the fourth minute. Shahbaz Ahmed and Muhammad Sarwar combined from the right, but Shahbaz failed to finish, missing an open net after beating Subbiah.

Two minutes earlier, Sarwar setup a fine ball for center forward Kamran Ashraf whose defalcation went over the crossbar.

"We played badly today," said Pakistan manager Islahuddin Siddique. "But the series is still

wide open.' Pakistan's skipper Tahir Zaman was disappointed with Pakistan's performance.

"I am totally surprised why we played so poorly," he said "We lost the rhythm after winning the two matches as our forwards were totally marked by the Indian defenders."

discontent among them, resigned few days ago citing violation of the PCB constitution by its chairman Khalid Mahmood after he decided to send Wasim Akram to South Africa.

"Tell me how is a senior player supposed to feel when the selectors give statements that 'he (the player) is over the hill' and 'has lost his bite and interest in the game,' while he is keen to play?" asked Wagar.

The former Pakistan skipper crossed 2000-run mark in Test cricket in his 78th appearance by pulling Fanie de Villers for four. Akram became the fifth all-rounder in the history of world cricket who scored over 2000 runs and took 200plus wickets after Australian Richie Benaud, Englishman Ian Botham, Indian Kapil Dev. West Indian Gary Sobers and his compatriot Imran Khan.

But despite his pretty impressive return controversy centring his inclusion is still brewing on back in Pakistan Senator Aqil Shah, member of the parliamentary probe committee, reiterated to 'The

News' from Peshawar that Akram was still being investigated for alleged match-fixing.

The fact that he has been sent to South Africa does not mean that we have stopped our

investigation. We are still collecting evidence. The decision to send him there was entirely Khalid Mahmood's (PCB chairman) and it was not within our jurisdiction to stop him. But we are convinced that he is involved and not just him but we will be looking to investigate the entire cricket team,

He was responding to comments made by the television team in South Africa, especially former Pakistan captain Asif Iqbal who supported Wasim Akram's inclusion in the team and kept repeating that "Wasim had been exonerated.

"Our committee has yet to sit down and deliberate on this issue. At this moment we are at the fact-finding stage. There is no question of exonerating him. We've had some letters from people who have been

other, and although we have no intention of revealing their names we hope that more people will come forward with information."

Asked to comment on the PCB decision to send Akram to South Africa, Aqil Shah said that the PCB had not helped in that regard and that only the chairman was responsible for sending Akram to join a victorious team. Aqil Shah said that his committee would be involving various intelligence agen-

cies to dig out the truth. "We hope to have all the findings in a month's time." Asked if the committee had reason to believe that the match fixing charges brought against Akram were true, the senator replied:

"Absolutely. Without doubt." Selectors however defended decision on Akram's inclusion. Selectors felt that since Akram

had been inducted all controversies should now be stopped. The Electronic Telegraph meanwhile reported that the touring Pakistan cricketers

rallied round Akram. Wasim Akram is reported to have been continuing his private chats to secure the support of senior players after reports that he was not wanted on the tour, despite being given go-

ahead signal by the board. Akram's old friends and teammates, like Ijaz Ahmed, Wagar Younis and Mushtag Ahmed, all assured him of their support. "Word reached me that some of the members didn't want me here," said Akram. " wanted to know the truth but I found no resentment. They said that since I had been cleared back home there was no reason I shouldn't play."
