

Vajpayee invited to form next Indian govt

NEW DELHI, Mar 10: India's president today asked veteran Hindu nationalist Atal Bihari Vajpayee to form India's next government, likely to be an unwieldy minority coalition backed by small, desperate parties, reports AP.

Vajpayee of the Bharatiya Janata Party, was prime minister for 13 days after the 1996 election before his government collapsed when it failed to find allies for a parliamentary majority.

Vajpayee met President K R Narayanan after he received a letter from him asking whether the BJP was ready to form a government.

During the 30-minute meeting, Narayanan asked him to furnish documents to prove his claim of controlling enough seats in Parliament to survive a

confidence vote. The documents would be sent tomorrow. Vajpayee said.

The president sent a letter to Vajpayee immediately after the Election Commission presented him a list of newly elected lawmakers.

"I am going to see the president and tell him that the BJP and its allies are in a position to give a stable government," Vajpayee told reporters.

The task is difficult, but we will succeed," he said before a meeting with President KR Narayanan.

"In so far as yours is a single largest party in the Lok Sabha (parliament) and the largest pre-election alliance, I request you to let me know whether you are able and willing to form a stable government which can See Page 12 Col 6

Project for slum dwellers uncertain as govt yet to provide land By Naimul Haq

sources Division, Dhaka City The 28.5 million US dollar Urban Poverty Reduction Project (UPRP) for over one million city slum dwellers faces a deadlock as the government could not yet guarantee land for those to be settled. According to sources in the

Local Government Engineering Department (LGED), one of the preconditions of Asian Development Bank (ADB) for funding the project was guarantee from the government that land for the settlers would not be used for other purposes at least in 10 years. Accordingly, a wrap-up meeting in June, last attended by officials from ADB, Planning Commission, External Re-

Corporation (DCC), LGED and various other agencies decided that ministries would be requested to find khas land which would not be used by them at least in 10 years. A survey to find suitable land would be started, it further decided. "However, till date, the government could not yet pledge

land for the slum dwellers," an ADB official said. "We are still negotiating with the government about the land security. Without the guarantee for land, we are unable to go for the final stage of loan negotiation," said Francis B Narayan, ADB's Senior Programme Officer.
