On a bouncy track

The first ball that was bowled by Dattu Phadkar on a matting wicket at Dhaka Stadium on the new year's day in 1955, did not rise above the knee height. The delivery of Fazal Mahmood that 'fazzled' the Australian Neil Harvey on 96, barely hit the middle of the stumps. For years together we have hardly seen a bouncer being despatched to the ropes because on this wicket bowlers rarely tried a bouncer.

This was the nature of the Dhaka Stadium wicket until one day a South African walked into the middle, not with a bat, but with his experience and expertise to chastise the sleeping track into a lively and kicking surface. Phil Russell had come from Durban, a town synonymous with the name of Mahatma Gandhi. There he prepares the wicket for years on end on which batsmen love to play shots on the hard and bouncy surface and bowlers like to bowl their armour — the bouncer. It is almost a 50-50 divide — you get the chance to play your shots and he gets the chance to demolish you.

From the matting wickets of the 50's to the slow surface of the next three-and-a-half decades and finally to the lively pitches of the late 90's — quite a transformation. The pitches in the sub-continent have always been prepared in a manner which gave some help to the slow spinners but had never been conducive to stroke-play or helped the quicker bowlers in any manner. As a result the Indians and Pakistanis produced some of the world's best known spinners. The Pakistanis were particularly lucky to have seen the bowlers like Fazal Mahmood, Mahmud Hossain, Khan Mohammad, Sarfaraz Nawaz, Imran Khan, Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis and lately Shoaib Akhtar and a

few other youngsters who could really bowl fast on any wicket. But India were not so fortunate. Since the days of Dattu Phadkar and Ramakant Desai only Kapil Dev had shown in full glory followed by Prabhakar, Srinath, Venkatesh Prasad and to some extent Abbey Kuruvilla. Of course there were others who abounded in talents but wasted them on the lifeless pitches of India —

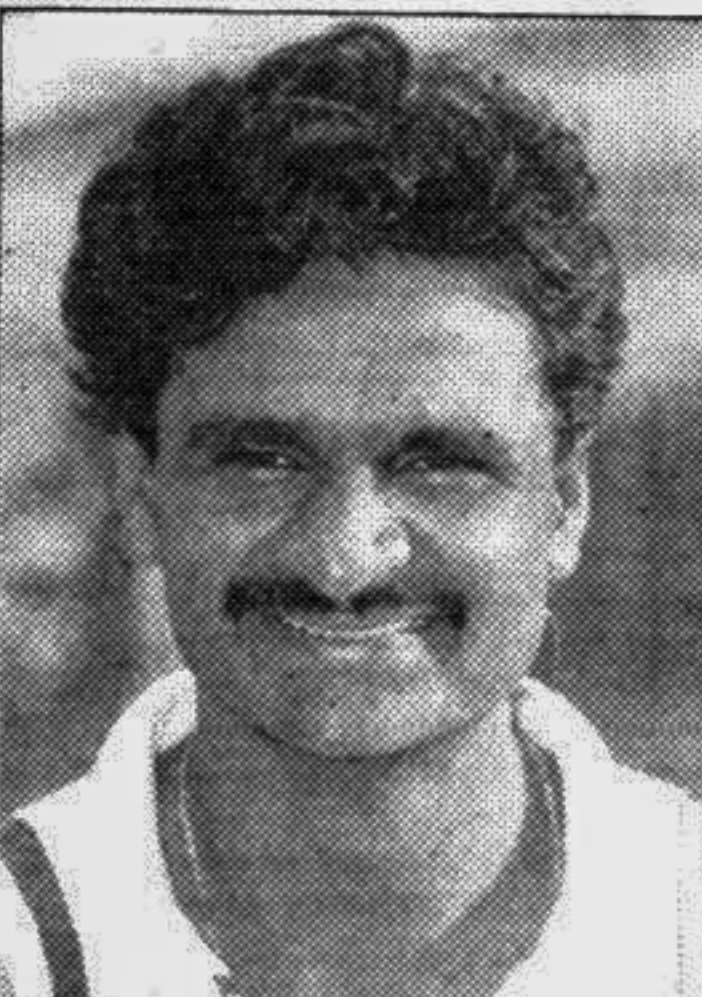

The three other official Test matches played on turf wickets produced no results. It will not be out of place to indulge in an interesting exercise of statistical display, though I am not good at it. A total of 4940 runs were scored in 7 matches till 1969 at the expense of 213 wickets. At an average 705.71 runs were scored in a match and 182 runs per innings. The average runs per wicket was a dis-

mal 23.19. A total of 27 innings were played out of which five were incomplete and three were declared. These only point to the slowness of the wickets which were never conducive to strokeplay. I know I should not try to do it but I feel tempted to draw a small comparison to drive home my point.

We all saw how the wickets behaved during all six days of play of the Independence Cup cricket. The usual uneven bounce, specially the ball keeping low at the Pavilion end was almost non-existent. Batsmen were freely making their strokes as the bowlers were helped with extra bounce and speed from the wicket. In all fairness it must be said that both batsmen and bowlers were almost equally treated by the surface. That is the beauty of a true wicket.

The third final between India and Pakistan produced 630 runs in 95.5 overs at the cost of only 12 wickets. The total included as many as three centuries by Saeed Anwar, Ijaz Ahmed and Saurov Ganguly. On an average each wicket produced a healthy 52.5 runs and each over produced 6.59 runs — more than a run-a-ball which made the match most interesting and memorable in recent times.

A good wicket has always been considered a prerequisite for good cricket by experts all over the world and a good beginning has been made in Dhaka. Now that the primary condition for good cricket has been met, it is now for our cricketers to grab this opportunity with both hands and improve their game.

Bayern trio disciplined

MUNICH, Germany, Mar 12: Three Bayern Munich players have been fined 11,000 dollars each here on Wednesday after their blistering attack on the club's Italian coach Giovanni Trapattoni, reports AFP. The three players are Mario Basler, Mehmet Schol and Thomas Strunz.

Wadekar fills Desai's shoes?

MUMBAI, Mar 12: It is widely expected in cricket circles here that former India captain and manager Ajit Wadekar would replace Ramakant Desai in the national selection committee, reports PTI.

Selection committee chairman Desai has already submitted a letter to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) stating that he is quitting the post due to ill-health. Though BCCI president Raj Singh Dungarpur has said that Desai is unlikely to be replaced till the end of the triangular one-day series in mid-April. The announcement of Wadekar as replacement is expected to be made during the course of the second India-Australia Test at Calcutta from March 18-22, according to BCCI sources today.

The only hitch at present is whether Wadekar would accept to be a co-selector with Central Zone's Kishen Rungta as chairman as the latter has not played any Tests but is the senior-most member after Desai in the committee, sources said.

However, there have been precedents of a non-Test player heading a national selection committee comprising some Test players in the past. A shining example is Raj Singh himself who has not played any Test. He was at the helm of two committees in the late eighties with Test stars Bhagwat Chandrasekar, Gundappa Viswanath, Naren Tambane and Chetan Chauhan as co-selectors.

Emirates' 3rd in a row

Emirates won the World airlines cricket tournament for the third year running when they beat Leeward Islands Air Transport (LIAT) by 59 runs in the final recently. Emirates were all out for 161 runs and LIAT all out for 102, says a press release.

Group managing director Maurice Flanagan presented the championship trophy to his airline's winning side. Mohammed Al Khaja, Emirates group director of training, safety and standards, who directed the tournament's organising committee, thanked Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum for his support of cricket in Dubai. Flanagan for the airline's support of the tournament, the Dubai Cricket Council and the organisers for the work they did towards making the event a success, and Mobil for sponsorship of the Emirates teams and the donation of a number of individual trophies.

Emirates were the host airline for the two-week long championship, the sixth of its kind and the first on the Dubai Cricket Council's new grass pitches in Dubai. The event has been played every two years since 1988.

Raj roars

BOMBAY, Mar 12: President of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) Raj Singh Dungarpur has said the Australian media does not have any business to comment on the affairs of the Indian cricket board, reports PTI.

"The Australian media should restrict their comments to their country's cricket board and not comment on Indian board," Dungarpur told here last night. Dungarpur was reacting to a bloop by two Australian commentators of ABC Radio, during the first Test between India and Australia in Chennai last week about match fixing and bribery in Indian cricket. ABC commentator Tim Lane and guest Peter Roebuck during what was described as a general discussion, also allegedly aired suspicions about the integrity of a senior Indian player and an umpire.

Aussies' another trial

JAMSHEDPUR, Mar 12: Jolted by a stunning 179-run defeat in the opening Test at Chennai, the visiting Australians would seek to redeem their prestige as they take on a youthful India A side in a three-day match beginning at the Keenan Stadium here from tomorrow, reports PTI.

The visitors have had a disastrous tour so far, having earlier suffered a ten-wicket drubbing at the hands of Ranji Trophy champions Mumbai in their opener, and would be eager to tone up their game ahead of the second Test in the past.

While all their frontline batsmen, except Mark Waugh, cut a sorry figure in both innings at Chennai, their strike bowler Shane Warne waslobbered by the Indian batsmen, especially Sachin Tendulkar and skipper Mohammad Azharuddin.

Warne, who was at the receiving end of Tendulkar's fire-

works in the Mumbai match too, has not really lived up to his awesome reputation on the tour so far.

The famed leg-spinner, who has played all the matches on the tour so far, could be rested for the match though he has struggled to find his rhythm. The men from down under, whose weakness in playing Indian spin was exposed both at Mumbai and Chennai, would also look forward to getting some useful practice against the slow bowlers with the Indian second string team comprising three exponents of the art — Nikhil Chopra, K N Ananthapadmanavan and Rahul Sanghvi.

The India 'A' team has a number of talented youngsters, who would be keen to prove their worth at the international level after having performed creditably at the domestic level.

Lanky medium-pacer Venkatesh Prasad, who suffered an injury after a fall in Colombo, would be under

surveillance with the selectors giving him one more chance to prove his fitness before the third Test. His ability to bag wickets and throw the ball from the deep would be keenly watched.

Punjab opener Vikram Rathore, named as skipper, has also been given another chance to redeem his international career.

However, bulk of the team members are first timers with talented Hyderabad left-hander Daniel Manohar, promising Tamil Nadu southpaw Hemang Badani, Jacob Martin of Baroda, an Delhi stumper Vijay Dahiya being given a look-in.

The in-form Devang Gandhi of Bengal, Rajeev Kumar of Bihar and Amay Khurasia of Madhya Pradesh are also expected to give solidity to the batting.

Kulamani Parida and Zakir Hussain Khan of the Railways are expected to add depth to the pace bowling department spearheaded by Prasad.

Controversy on Chcpauk rulings continues

Umpires come under fire

NEW DELHI, Mar 12 (AFP): Mohammad Azharuddin's Indian team, already seething over an umpiring row which took the gloss off Tuesday's win over Australia in the first Test, appears set for a further controversy.

South African match referee Peter Van Der Merwe has asked for a video review of Rajesh Chauhan's bowling action after the home side's 179-run win.

The off-spinner's action got the all-clear recently from the International Cricket Council (ICC).

India are also angry that Merwe refused to penalise Australian batsmen who showed their displeasure at umpiring decisions, even though their own Nayan Mongia was pulled up for the same offence.

"It's all very weird," a team source told the news agency on Wednesday. "I can understand the team is very angry and hurt at what is going on."

A spokesman for the company producing the live telecast of the series, confirmed that the match referee had asked for tapes to "have a close look" at Chauhan's action.

Chauhan's action was reported by former Australian captain Bobby Simpson during a series against Sri Lanka last year, but he was later given the green light by a special committee of the ICC.

"We have not heard anything about the match referee asking for tapes," the team source said. "But if this is true, it only adds insult to injury."

Mongia, the Indian wicket-keeper, was fined 50 per cent of his match fees by Merwe for showing his bat to the umpire after being given out leg-before

the fourth day of the Test at Madras.

No action has been taken against four Australian batsmen — Mark Waugh, Paul Reffel, Steve Waugh and Ricky Ponting — all of whom stood their ground after being given out to questionable decisions on Tuesday.

Ponting seemed to question the verdict against him in both innings. He was declared caught behind off Venkatapathy Raju in the first innings and declared leg-before to the same bowler in the second.

Merwe said a difference had to be made between "dissent and disappointment," but former Indian Test batsman Sunil Gavaskar responded strongly.

"It is silly that Mongia has been punished and another player let off," Gavaskar had said on Monday.

"It appears there are different rules for different teams. Why should only teams from the sub-continent suffer? I have often seen players from Australia, England and South Africa escape punishment."

Another former Indian cricketer and commentator, Ravi Shastri, said the ICC needs to revise its rules on the appointment of umpire and match referees.

"It's an old boys' club out there," Shastri told the news agency. "You almost get to see the same old faces as match referees."

"This Test has proved that competence rather than neutrality should be the basis for appointing umpires. George Sharp of England is clearly not a top-class umpire."

"If the best umpires are from one country, so be it. At least it won't rob the winning team of the credit they deserve."

Taylor, governed by ICC rules which prohibit teams from speaking against the umpires, said after the match, "You saw it, draw own conclusions."

But the Indians are clearly upset, even though many Australian commentators said the home side deserved its win.

Meanwhile, the overwhelming view of Australian media was that the Taylor's men's batting was as bad as the umpiring and that Australia deserved to lose even with the controversial decisions of English umpire George Sharp.

The Australian newspaper said, "Umpiring, batting a disgrace" above a story which told how Australia lost the Test through poor umpiring compounded by inept batting.

Nevertheless the accompanying commentary on Sharp's judgement was scathing, saying three of the four controversial decisions were his and two of these were "absolutely dreadful."

"This should help establish a view that, by and large, umpires around the world are not cheats, just bad umpires," the report said.

Australian right watchman Paul Reffel also looked shocked when Sharp upheld an appeal for caught by his bat and pad, although it was impossible to tell from television replays if this was justified.

But the replays left no doubt Sharp's dismissals of Ricky Ponting, who was given leg before wicket, and Steve Waugh, caught at short leg, were wrong.

Mark Waugh was also given out caught at short leg by Indian umpire Venkat after clearly missing the ball.

The Daily Telegraph also described poor Australian batting and worse umpiring in a report "four suspect dismissals rock Australia."
