The first ball that was bowled by Dattu Phadkar on a matting wicket at Dhaka Stadium on the new year's day in 1955, did not rise above the knee height. The

delivery of Fazal Mahmood that 'Fazzalled' the Australian Neil Harvey on 96, barely hit the middle of the stumps. For years together we have hardly seen a bouncer being despatched to the ropes because on this wicket bowlers rarely tried a bouncer. This was the nature of the

Dhaka Stadium wicket until one day a South African walked into the middle, not with a bat, but with his experience and expertise to chastise the sleeping track into a lively and kicking surface. Phil Russell had come from Durban, a town synonymous with the name of Mahatma Gandhi. There he prepares the wicket for years on end on which batsmen love to play shots on the hard and bouncy surface and bowlers like to bowl their armour - the bouncer. It is almost a 50-50 divide - you get the chance to play your shots and he gets the chance to demolish you.

From the matting wickets of the 50's to the slow surface of the next three-and-a-half decades and finally to the lively pitches of the late 90's - quite a transformation. The pitches in the sub-continent have always been prepared in a manner which gave some help to the slow spinners but had never been conducive to stroke-play or helped the quicker bowlers in any manner. As a result the Indians and Pakistanis produced some of the world's best known spinners. The Pakistanis were particularly lucky to have seen the bowlers like Fazal Mahmud, Mahmud Hossain, Khan Mohammad, Sarfraz Newaz, Imran Khan, Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis and lately Shoaib Akhtar and a





world record in the third final. The seven Test matches we had on this ground four on matting were all very dull and dreary encounters between bat and ball except two which were played on mats in 1959. Pakistan won their match against the West Indies by 41 runs. That was a summer worth remembering. The West Indians were a mighty sight with Rohan Kanhai, Lance Gibbs, 'Collie' Smith. 'Sony' Ramadhin, Wes Hall and the legendary Gary Sobers led by Kardar's Cambridge buddy Gerry Alexander pitted against Hanif, Imtiaz, Mathias and of course the legendary Fazal Mahmud leading from the front. He took 12 wickets - six in each innings - and totally destroyed the mighty

Caribbeans. Eight months later in October 1959 Richie Benaud led the Kangaroos including the great fast bowler Ray Lindwall and Ian Meckiff, later banned for chucking, Alan Davidson the great all-rounder, Norman O'Neil dubbed as 'Bradman of the future', Wally Grout, Colin MacDonald who later became the batsman bowled by Intikhab Alam with his first delivery in a Test match at Karachi. Also in the team was the diminutive southpaw Neil Harvey acknowledged by all as one of the best left-handers of all time. Pakistan was shattered by Grout, Harvey and Ken McKay and lost by 8 wickets.

mal 23.19. A total of 27 innings were played out of which five were incomplete and three were declared. These only point to the slowness of the wickets which were never conducive to strokeplay. I know I should not try to do it but I feel tempted to draw a small comparison to drive home my point

We all saw how the wickets behaved during all six days of play of the Independence Cup cricket. The usual uneven bounce, specially the ball keeping low at the Pavilion end was almost non-existent Batsmen were freely making their strokes as the bowlers were helped with extra bounce and speed from the wicket. In all fairness it must be said that both batsmen and bowlers were almost equally treated by the surface. That is the beauty of a true wicket.

The third final between India and Pakistan produced 630 runs in 95.5 overs at the cost of only 12 wickets. The total included as many as three centuries by Saeed Anwar, Ijaz Ahmed and Saurav Ganguly. On an average each wicket produced a healthy 52.5 runs and each over produced 6.59 runs - more than a run-a-ball which made the match most interest ing and memorable in recent

A good wicket has always been considered a prerequisite for good cricket by experts all over the world and a good beginning has been made in Dhaka. Now that the primary condition for good wicket has been met, it is now for our cricketers to grab this opportunity with both hands and improve their game. Let it not be said that our

Wadekar fills Desai's shoes?

MUMBAI, Mar 12: It is widely expected in cricket circles here that former India captain and manager Ajit Wadekar would replace Ramakant Desai in the national selection committee, reports

Selection committee chairman Desai has already submitted a letter to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) stating that he is quitting the post due to ill-health.

Though BCCI president Raj Singh Dungarpur has said that Desai is unlikely to be replaced till the end of the triangular one-day series in mid-April. The announcement of Wadekar as replacement is expected to be made during the course of the second India-Australia Test at Calcutta from March 18-22, according to BCCI sources today.

The only hitch at present is whether Wadekar would accept to be a co-selector with Central Zone's Kishen Rungta as chairman as the latter has not played any Tests but is the senior-most member after Desai in the

committee, sources said. However, there have been precedents of a non-Test player heading a national selection committee comprising some

Test players in the past. A shining example is Raj Singh himself who has not played any Test. He was at the helm of two committees in the late eighties with Test stars Bhagwat Chandrasekhar, Gundappa Viswanath, Naren Tamhane and Chetan Chauhan as co-selectors.

Umpires come under fire



NEW DELHI, Mar 12 (AFP): Mohammad Azharuddin's Indian team. already seething over an

Merwe refused to penalise Australian batsmen who showed their displeasure at umpiring decisions, even though their own Nayan Mongia was pulled up for the same offence. "It's all very weird," a team

source told the news agency on Wednesday. "I can understand the team is very angry and hurt at what is going on. A spokesman for the com-

pany producing the live telecast of the series, confirmed that the match referee had asked for tapes to "have a close look" at Chauhan's action.

Chauhan's action was reported by former Australian captain Bobby Simpson during a series against Sri Lanka last year, but he was later given the green light by a special committee of the ICC.

"We have not heard anything about the match referee asking for tapes," the team source said. "But if this is true, it only adds insult to injury.

Mongia, the Indian wicketkeeper, was fined 50 per cent of his match fees by Merwe for showing his bat to the umpire after being given out leg-before

on the fourth day of the Test at Madras.

But no action has been taken against four Australian batsmen - Mark Waugh, Paul Reiffel, Steve Waugh and Ricky Ponting - all of whom stood their ground after being given out to questionable decisions on Tuesday.

Ponting seemed to question the verdict against him in both innings. He was declared caught behind off Venkatapathy Raju in the first innings and declared leg-before to the same

But the replays left no doubt Sharp's dismissals of Ricky Ponting, who was given leg before wicket, and Stave Waugh, caught at short leg, were wrong.

Mark Waugh was also given out caught at short leg by Indian umpire Venkat after clearly missing the ball.

The Daily Telegraph also described poor Australian batting and worse umpiring in a report four suspect dismissals rock Australia.
