Japan eying Kirin Cup

TOKYO, Mar 13: In preparing for their first-ever World Cup. Japan will be able to test their strengths against one of the top teams in the world, the Czech Republic, in the Kirin Cup at home in May, reports AP.

The Japanese team has been accused of taking an easy way out with training in Australia and the Dynasty Cup this month that pitted their team against South Korea, China and Hong Kong. Japan beat both South Korea and Hong Kong, but lost 2-0 to China.

Critics say Japan need to play the better teams from Europe, South America and Africa if they hope to have a chance against Argentina and Croatia at the World Cup in June in

France. The Czech Republic have gone to the World Cup eight times as Czechoslovakia. The third team to take part in the three-nation Kirin Cup is still undecided, the Football Association of Japan said Friday.

The top team will receive 100,000 dollars. The second place team will win 50,000 dollars and the third 10,000 dol-

While Pakistan, fresh from their squared series with hosts South Africa, will be viewed as clear favourites to win the short series, they are fully aware of the batting frailties which were exposed in the third and final Test against South Africa in Port Elizabeth last week.

Zimbabwe, who won the Harare Test when the two teams last met on African soil during 1995, have just returned from a tour to New Zealand where their batting emerged as their greatest weakness.

Apart from number three Murray Goodwin, none of the top six batted with sufficient consistency and Zimbabwe coach Dave Houghton hopes for a great improvement.

"You learn a lot when you are losing and I think our guys have brought back quite a few lessons from New Zealand," Houghton said.

"They've now got to start performing and playing long innings and I'm hoping that the home crowds and grounds here in Zimbabwe will help us to fire up again."

Zimbabwe, who have named a squad of 12, could well blood two test debutants on Saturday. One-day international and left-handed batsman Dirkie Viljoen is expected to open the innings with the reliable Grant Flower while right-hander Trevor Madondo is set to follow in the footsteps of fellow black Matabeleland cricketer Henry Olonga in representing his





WELLINGTON, Mar 13 (AP): New Zealand's cricket team has been attacked for "childish" and aggressive on-field behaviour by a leading coaching official.

Coaching New Zealand president Nicki Turner, a former women's international cricketer, said players in most sports had markedly improved their conduct in recent years. However, Turner criticized

the men's cricket team for their "childish and inappropriate" language and derision of opponents this season.
