

Row over racial policy

South African cricket is about to break new ground with the expected selection of Makhaya Ntini for the first Test against Sri Lanka in Cape Town next week. Ntini, 20, would be the first player from the townships development programme launched 11 years ago - before the country's readmittance to international sport -- to make this breakthrough. He toured England and India with the national under-19 side and went to Australia this winter, playing one one-day international.

It will doubtless be hailed as another historic, heart-warming, sporting moment for the 'Rainbow Nation' but the reality is somewhat different. Those rainbow hues are fading fast in the long shadows of racism reaching out from the dark days of apartheid. Peter Deeley wries for The Electronic Telegraph on the complicated event.

Like President Mandela. Ntini is a Xhosa. Other nonwhites of mixed descent have played for South Africa and one, spinner Paul Adams, is also expected to be in the side, but Ntini would be the first black African.

FIFA sitting on the fence

The executive committee of world football's ruling body will hold another extraordinary meeting in Zurich on 8 April to discuss the question of the FIFA presidency and a possible candidature by the general secretary, Joseph Sepp Blatter, according to a release on the Internet.

The meeting will commence one day after the deadline for the submission of candidatures for the election to be held at the FIFA Congress in Paris on June 8. So far, the only candidate for the election is Lennart Johansson of Sweden.

At an extraordinary meeting of the executives at FIFA house - the first since Dr. Joao Havelange was elected president in 1974 - the outgoing Brazilian presented a legal advice on the compatibility of Blatter standing for the presidency at the same time as continuing in office as general secretary. The meeting generally accepted the finding, based upon Swiss Law and the constitutional rights of the national associations affiliated to FIFA, that the general secretary could be proposed as a presidential candidate.

In a lengthy discussion of over four and a half hours, a paper was also presented by members representing the European, African and Oceania confederations, signed by 13 members (of whom twelve were present when the document was discussed). This paper called for the general secretary to step down from his office

immediately. The committee then tried to reconcile these two positions but could not reach an agreement concerning the position of the general secretary in the even that he stood as a candidate. President Havelange asked the chairman of the FIFA legal affairs committee, David Will (Scotland), to prepare a proposal on the extent to which the general secretary's function may be restricted if he

were to be a candidate. When Will declined to do so, because he had been involved in the preparation of the UEFA/CAF/Oceania paper. Havelange closed the meeting stating that he would prepare the necessary proposals himself by the time of the next meeting on April 8.
