OIC confce opens in Doha

ME peace process dying: Arafat

DOHA, Mar 15: Foreign ministers from the world's Muslim countries opened a meeting in Qatar today dominated by warnings that the Middle East peace process is dying, reports Reuters.

"The peace of the courageous which we have signed is today imperilled in many ways ... may even say that this agreement is almost uttering its last breath," Palestinian President Yasser Arafat said in Arabic. He was addressing the open-

ing session of the meeting of foreign ministers of the 55member Organisation of the Islamic Conference (OIC) in Qatar's capital here. The OIC groups the world's Islamic states and represents their one billion people. Arafat blamed Israel's 'arro-

gance' for the stalled Middle East peace process and called on the Islamic and Arab world to unite to confront the 'grave crisis' in the region.

"Jerusalem is calling upon you to rise as one man to salvage it. Jerusalem is as you know confronting a ferocious campaign to make it completely Jewish," Arafat said.

করার জন্য সরকার ১৫ই মার্চ, ১৯৯৮ পর্যন্ত সময় দিয়েছিল। কিন্তু বহুলোক উক্ত সুযোগ গ্রহণে অসমর্থ হয়ে সময়সীমা বৃদ্ধি করার জন্য অনুরোধ করেছেন। তাই সরকার এই সময়সীমা ৬ই এপ্রিল, ১৯৯৮ খ্রীঃ বিকাল ৫-০০ টা পর্যন্ত বৃদ্ধি করেছে। এই সময়ের মধ্যে অবৈধ সেলুলার হ্যান্ডসেটের সেংযোগ থাকুক বা না থাকুক) মালিকগণকে প্রযোজ্য শুক্ত-কর ও সেট প্রতি ৩০০/-(তিনশত) টাকা জরিমানা দিয়ে নিয়মিতকরণের বিশেষ সুযোগ দেয়া হল। এরূপ অবৈধ হ্যান্ডসেট নিয়মিতকরণের জন্য ঢাকা তক্ক ভবনের তক্কায়ন গ্রুপ-৩-এর দায়িত্বে নিয়োজিত সহকারী/ডেপ্টি কমিশনার (চট্টগ্রাম শুরু ভবনের ক্ষেত্রে সহকারী/ডেপুটি কমিশনার, প্রিভেন্টিভ)-এর নিকট উপস্থাপন করতে পারেন। এই সময়সীমা আর বৃদ্ধি করা হবে না। সময়সীমা উত্তীর্ণ হওয়ার পর চোরাচালানকৃত হ্যান্ডসেট উদ্ধারের জন্য শুদ্ধ কর্তৃপক্ষ পরিদর্শন, পরীক্ষা-নিরীক্ষা এবং তল্লাশী অভিযান পরিচালনাসহ সকল প্রকার আইনানুগ ব্যবস্থা গ্রহণ করবে। কারও নিকট এরূপ হ্যাভ্রসেট পাওয়া গেলে তার বিরুদ্ধে আইনানুগ ব্যবস্থা নেয়া হবে। তন্ধ-কর এবং জরিমানা দিয়ে নিয়মিতকরণে কেউ কোন অসুবিধার সমুখীন হলে কাস্টম হাউস, ঢাকার অতিরিক্ত কমিশনার-এর সাথে (টেলিফোন নাম্বার-৮৯১১২১, ৮৯২২২৫, ৮৯১১২৯) যোগাযোগ করতে পারেন।
