Agri-fair concludes

According to witnesses, the pirates decamped with Tk 3.5 lakh in cash and fish products worth about Tk one lakh from the Lucky Fish Depot at mid night on March 3. Police said about 30 to 35 miscreants attacked the workers of the depot, stabbed them mercilessly and decamped with the booty. Among the injured Farooq Khan, 35, and Noor Hossain, 40, were rushed to the Patuakhali Sadar Hospital in a serious condition. A case was filed with the police.

RANGAMATI. Mar 20: There is likely to be a severe food shortage in the district during the current dry season due to the short fall in Aman production, reports UNB.

According to the local people, 50 per cent of the arable land will be out of boro cultivation in the current season as these land are under the water of the Kaptai lake. According to the agriculture department, though the production of Aman was satisfactory in the district but due to the water-logging in a vast tract of land, the production was less in comparison with the previous season and the shortfall was estimated at 4,443 metric

Dudu Mia confessed to the police that one Abdul Matin and his friends hired the ambulance on pretext that a patient would be taken to hospital. A case was filed with Ullapara police in this connection.

5 killers get life term imprisonment

PIROJPUR, Mar 20: A court here has sentenced five people to life term imprisonment for killing a man, reports UNB. The convicted are Babul, Ratan, Nabi Hossain, Moti Mollah and Mosharraf of Fulchari village in Mathbaria thana. According to the prosecution, the convicted people killed their co-villager Abdul Mannan Farazi on January 9, 1996 following previous enmity. After investigation, police submitted chargesheet against them. After examining the records and witnesses District and Sessions Judge Kabirul Islam delivered the judgement on Wednesday.

30,000 hectares of land brought under potato cultivation

CHANDPUR, Mar 20: The total acreage of potato cultivation has exceeded the target this year in the district.

According to district Agriculture Extension office sources, the target of potato cultivation in all seven thanas of the district was set at 20 thousand hectares, but total land put under potato cultivation was about 30 thousand hectares. Potato growers of the district did not face any crises of seeds. water, fertilisers and other inputs during sowing time. These favourable circumstances are

the main causes of high production of potatoes this year. Precautionary measures to combat possible outbreak of diseases of potato crops have been taken by the Agriculture Department.

Besides, Agriculture Department officials had set up about 30 demonstration plots to impart training to potato growers. Middlemen and affluent farmers who had preserved potatoes in cold storages in the district for handsome profit in lean period, were worst sufferers due to low prices of potatoes

during the last year. About 2 lakh metric tons of potatoes were produced this

Agriculture Extension officials have expressed apprehension, repeated slumps in potato prices due to bumper production may turn potato farming not viable in the district potato is now being sold at Taka 3 to 4 per kg, which is below the production cost. Meanwhile, storing of potatoes in different cold storages have already been started in the dis-

Rural people losing interest in installing Tara pump



NATORE, Mar 20: Rural people in six thanas of the district are reportedly loosing their interest in setting up Tara pump for pure drinking water and other household works as the labour cost has increased by 50 per cent.

According to Public Health Engineering Department (PHED), at least 240 Tara pumps were set up in six thanas of the district during last 1996-97 fiscal. But not a single Tara pump could be installed in the district up to March 12 of the current financial year.

Different sources said, during last financial year, the opportunists were to provide Tk 1,000 to PHED in labour cost sector to set up a Tara pump. But this year, the amount rose to Tk

Official sources said, about 143 Tara pumps are targetted to set up in the district this year. But it is apprehended, the target would not be achieved due to increase in labour cost.

GOPALGANJ, Mar 20: The target of IRRI-Boro production and other crops throughout the district may not be achieved the to various reasons.

The problems include frequent power failure, abnormal and high prices of different inputs, shortage of bullocks for tiling the land, high prices of fuel, faulty system of irrigation equipment and shortage of high yielding varieties of seeds.

Frequent power disruption in the district has been hampering production in the agricultural sector. About three thousand shallow and deep tube wells are mechanised by electricity under Gopalganj Palli Bidyut Samity.

Power failure has become a regular feature in the district. Power remains suspended round the clock, it is widelly alleged by the consumers. Power is being supplied by the Gopalganj PBS from after noon to midnight and the students are worst sufferers.

It is further alleged by the farmers, Gopalganj Palli Bidyut authority is quite indifferent about their interest.

According to an official sources, a massive programme was taken in all five thanas of the district during the current season to bring a total of about

From Our Correspondent FARIDPUR, Mar 20: About one thousand and one hundred families who became homeless by the erosion of the river Padma have been passing days in great hardship.

When contacted, the chairman of Char Bhadrasan Union Parishad Abu Kalam told this correspondent, about six thousand people, most of boys and girls of the families have been leading a sub-human life for two years without any relief materials from any quarters. They have been living on the embankments and roads raising temporary sheds causing health hazards in the area. Most of the families were marginal farmers and as such are not accustomed to sell their labour in the locality. Some young male members have left for Dhaka city and are earning their livelihood by doing oddjobs and some women members having no other sources to fall back upon secretly working as maid servants in the houses of rich families in the locality. Their existence have been threatened, the chairman claimed.

Plan to construct gas line beside Bangabandhu Bridge

SIRAJGANJ, Mar 20: The government has taken up a programme to construct gas line beside the Bangabandhu Multipurpose Jamuna Bridge with a view to transmit gas in the northern region including Sirajganj by the year 2000, reports UNB.

The preliminary work of the gas line project has begun since August fast and necessary materials are being brought under the supervision of Petrobangla. But the programme may suffer a setback as a vested quarter of the area is trying to obstruct

the programme. Concern source said, learning the news of construction of gas pipe line a vested quarter of the project area started building houses and establishments in the name of various social organisations for realising huge compensation from the government.

About 600 houses and establishments have already been built by this time and the process is on, although nobody resides in these houses.

Nursing instts on verge of closure

KURIGRAM, Mar 20: Norpayment of salary to 240 employees of 18 nursing institutes of the country has taken the institutes to the verge of closure. reports UNB.

The government had set up the nursing institutes in 18 districts in 1982 with the financial assistance of ADB and appointed 240 employees in 1992 on contract. Their services are extended

in ECNEC meeting every year. but the matter was not placed in its previous meeting, blocking the payment of their salary for last eight months. Officials concerned, how-

ever, admitted the incident and said it has been brought to the notice of the higher authorities. "A file has already been put forward to the Planning Commission to resolve the problem," said an official.

Shoal at Modhumati disrupts communication

MADARIPUR. Mar 20: The Madhumati river channel, connecting Tekerhat and Khulna, has dried up, disrupting communication between the two regions, reports UNB.

Movement of heavy river vessels has been suspended in the river following emergence of a 40-km shoal at the upstream of Madhumati.

Even though some small launches are running on the river, they cannot make halt at Goalia, Baradia, Manikda, Tala, Joynajar, Shuktoil and other ghats due to in adequate water level and emerging shoals.

With the disruption in river communication, supply of goods to Khulna, Dhaka and other parts of the country through this route remained suspended, slowing down business activities in the region.
