India to import LNG

DUBAI, Mar 21: Practical difficulties hampering the early materialization of Indo-Iran and Indo-Oman pipeline projects seem to have compelled New Delhi to shift its focus to liquefied natural gas (LNG) imports, reports PTI.

The state owned Gas Authority of India Ltd (GAIL) has already shortlisted seven bidders to negotiate supply of LNG in tankers, Iranian news agency IRNA has said.

March 25 is the deadline for receiving offers for commercial terms from the bidders following which further negotiations will be held, GAIL sources told IRNA.

The bidders shortlisted by GAIL are Petronas (Malaysia). Rasphalan LNG Company Ltd (Qatar), Shell, Total (France), Woodside and Shevron (both from Australia) and Pertamina (Indonesia).

The decision to import LNG was prompted by the lack of

progress afflicting both Indo-Oman and Indo-Iran pipeline projects as Oman has reportedly abandoned the project owing to technical problems in laying the pipelines in sea depths, financial constraints besides gas reserves position in the country.

On the other hand, uneasy ties between New Delhi and Islamabad have clouded the prospects of undersea/overland Îran-India gas pipeline, proposed to pass through Pakistani

Moreover, political turmoil in Afghanistan stands in the way of Unocol-led consortium plan of extending to India the proposed Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan gas pipeline.

According to sources if all the LNG projects materialize. India will import over 50 mil-lion tons of LNG per annum.

In view of the absence of any new discovery of hydrocarbons in India, the country's gas production will, according to an estimate, increase from 64 million cubic metres per day (CMPD) in 1996-97 to only around 68 million CMPD by 1999-2000.

The domestic demand, however, will reach 78 million CMPD, rising to 120 CMPD in 2004-2005 and 215 million CMPD in 2009-2010.

To tide over the problem India may consider importing LNG from Iran too, say the sources.

Recently, Australia's Broken Hill Proprietary (BHP) invited state owned oil and natural gas consortium to pick an equity stake in building a liquid natural gas terminal in Iran. The BHP has also offered to export LNG from the South Pars field to India.

However, sources both in the oil and petroleum ministry and GAIL declined to divulge the details of BHP's offer and Indian response to it.

Duma adopts legislation to protect

market

MOSCOW, Mar 21: The Russian lower house of Parliament yesterday adopted legislation authorising the government to take protectionist measures to defend Russian products from strong foreign competition, reports AFP.

Under the bill, if it is proved that certain foreign products are damaging the Russian economy because of the quantities or conditions they are imported in, then the government can take steps such as imposing import quotas or special customs duties, the Interfax agency re-

It allows the government to reduce imports temporarily "to allow time to get the balance back," the agency said.

The bill was passed by the State Duma on its third and final reading. To pass into law it must now be approved by the upper house of parliament and signed by President Boris Yeltsin.

It does not specify which products will be particularly targeted by the new measures. but says it will not apply to services, intellectual property, investment and exchange controls.

The Russian government regularly complains that other countries, especially the United States and European Union members, discriminate against its exports.

US co to help make low-cost electric cars in India

By Lalit K. Jha, IANS NEW DELHI, Mar 21: Urban middle class Indians in search of personal transport now may have the choice of a low cost modern electric car to be produced locally with American knowhow.

Two prototypes of the twodoor hatchback, called Reva, were flagged off by US Ambassador to India, Richard Celeste, and Delhi Lieutenant-Governor Tejinder Khanna, at the American Embassy here.

"It is part of the US government's effort to ensure a pollution free environment," Celeste told reporters after taking a promotional drive in the new car in the embassy compound. The environment-friendly

car, said to be suitable for Indian conditions, would be produced jointly by Scooters India Ltd and Amerigon Inc of Monorovia, California. "Negotiations between Amerigon and the Indian com-

pany are at an advanced stage," Celeste said. Sales are expected to begin in the next two years. Amerigon in collaboration

with the Maini Group of Industries, Bangalore, were funded by the US Agency for International Development (USAID). The car can seat two adults

and two children. It has a top speed of 70-km per hour and has to be 'refuelled' with electric charge after every 80-km. Estimated to cost about \$5,000, Reva incorporates the latest technologies including the use of lightweight materials and a simple but extremely reliable design, say its manufacturers.

According to Lon Bell, chairman of Amerigon, the car is almost maintenance free. Initially, the electric motor powering the car would be supplied by General Electric of the US but more than half the parts would be made in India, he said. Amerigon's goal was to help its Indian partner develop a fully indigenous car, he said.

Celeste said that USAID had also assisted Amerigon carry out trials in India and the US. The US agency is also promoting technology transfer and joint ventures between other US and Indian enterprises to manufacture two and three-wheeled eco-friendly vehicles, he said. "It is also supporting the intro-duction of a small electric three-wheel fleet for ferrying tourists around the Taj Mahal area in Agra," he said.

Key Japanese House passes \$602b budget

TOKYO, Mar 21: Japan's key parliament house yesterday passed the regular budget for the next fiscal year, which the government has said was the priority in helping the country's The prototypes, made by stagnant economy get back on a recovery track, says Reuters.

Passage of the budget now means the focus will shift to what moves Tokyo may use to nudge the economy forward a bit ahead of the crucial yearend book closing at the end of March, and Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) of summit leaders in April.

The lower house of the parliament passed a 77.67 trillion yen (602 billion dollars) regular budget for the fiscal year starting on April 1, the first budget formed under a tight fiscal austerity plan that aims to cut state debt to three per cent of groups domestic product by March

The budget must be offered to the upper house for approval, but even without such approval it will be automatically implemented 30 days after passage through the lower house, since the lower house has superiority on budget matters.

Bound by law to reduce state debts, ministers had been reluctant to clearly suggest new fiscal spending and tax cuts and instead, repeated that quick passage of the 1998/99 budget was the best possible step for the economy.

Any fresh fiscal spending measures would need to be accompanied by more funding.

widely seen as impossible before the passage of the regular budget on objections from opposition parties.

Once the budget is approved by the full lower house, policymakers are expected to become clearer on what new steps Japan will take to boost its economy.

Government and ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) sources told Reuters that the cabinet was expected to approve an economic stimulus package ranging between 10 to 15 trillion yen (77.5 billion dollars to 116 billion dollars) on March

But the sources said the government was still mulling whether to include income tax cuts in the package, a longawaited blessing for financial markets and a curese for fiscal reformists, which would involve more government bond

LDP policy chief Taku Yamasaki fold Reuters this week the party would announce by the end of March a package worth over 10 trillion yen to be composed mainly of public works projects in the areas of telecommunications, the environment, education, welfare and distribution, as well as more traditional work on roads and sewerage.

Yamasaki said the package was unlikely to include income tax cuts, but that it might include smaller-scale tax rebates for costs related to education,
