





ST JOHN'S, Antigua, Mar 21: England were reeling at 35 for two wickets in their first innings at the end of the first day's play in the sixth and final Test against the West Indies and only a series of rainstorms prevented an even worse collapse, reports AFP.

Only 21 overs were possible on a re-laid pitch which was a clear health hazard for the batsmen.

Mike Atherton and Alec Stewart displayed enormous bravery in their opening stand

CALCUTTA, Mar 21: Mohammad Azharuddin's India crushed Australia by an innings and 219 runs in the second Test here today

to take a decisive 2-0 lead in the three-match series, reports The tourists, trailing by 400 runs in the first innings, were bowled out for 181 in their sec-

Australia's hero in defeat was their pugnacious vice-captain Steve Waugh, who defled a painful groin injury for three hours to make 33.

The third and final Test starts in Bangalore on Wednes-

India's 18th win in their last 27 home Tests ended Australia's run of nine successive series wins under Mark Taylor since 1994.

Despite that impressive record, which earned them the tag of unofficial world champions, the Australians remain vulnerable in the Indian subcontinent.

The last time Australia lost a Test series was in Pakistan in 1994. Taylor's men also suffered a seven-wicket defeat by India in a one-off Test at New Delhi in 1996.

The Australians, who lost the first Test at Madras by 179 runs, once again paid the price for woeful batting.

The tourists were skittled out for 233 and 181 on a good wicket where India amassed duced to 91 for five before Steve



Having had a confident appeal for a catch against Ponting turned down, Kumble extracted

revenge later in the over when the batsman top-edged a sweep.
The ball skied to deep square leg where Srinath ran forward and dived to hold a good catch.

Ponting made nine. Taylor, who defied the Indian bowlers for three hours, was run out for 45 by excellent work close to the wicket from Venkat Laxman and wicket-

keeper Nayan Mongia. Taylor flicked Kumble hard, but Laxman intercepted the ball well at forward short-leg and threw it back for Mongia to break the wicket before the batsman regained his crease.
