



Lucic loses teen tussle



KEY BISCAIYNE, Florida, Mar 22 (AP): Mirjana Lucic, the youngest player at the Lipton Championships, was betrayed by a lack of experience and maturity against Anna Kournikova.

That's no surprise. After all, Kournikova is older by nine whole months.

The worldly Russian starlet won 6-4, 6-2 Saturday in a showdown of 16-year-old cover girls.

That was probably the first time in a very long time that I played somebody younger than I am," Kournikova said.

Kournikova, a semifinalist at Wimbledon last year, used her all-court game to pressure Lucic.

The result was 30 unforced errors and a 56-minute match. "I did exactly what I intended to do. I knew that I would win," Kournikova said.

Her opponent in the third round will be Monica Seles, who ended a four-month layoff by edging Maria Antonia Sanchez Lorenzo 6-4, 6-7, 6-3.

Seles took time off to be with her father, who is terminally ill with stomach cancer in Sarasota, Florida. Karolj Seles, 63, was diagnosed in February 1997.

"He has done everything for me, so I really just wanted to spend these last few months with him," she said.

In men's play three-time Lipton champion Andre Agassi continued his fast start this year by beating Nicolas Escude 6-2, 6-3 and top-ranked Pete Sampras defeated Pete Sanchez 6-1, 6-2.

Australian Open champion Petr Korda and French Open champion Gustavo Kuerten also reached the third round.

Michael Chang withdrew before his opening match due to a torn medial collateral ligament in his left knee.


Lucic and Kournikova had met only once previously, and that was in an exhibition that the Croatian won. Their match offered a glimpse of the future because both are considered potential Grand Slam winners.

Kournikova's lone losses since the beginning of 1997 have been to players in the top 15. She has climbed steadily to 25th in the rankings.

"I kind of couldn't get my rhythm," Seles said. "I haven't practiced too much in the past two months."

The Lipton champion in 1990-91, Seles is ranked fourth despite the difficulties she has endured. She plans to play the Grand Slams this year, but otherwise her tennis may be limited so she can care for her father.

"Every day when I wake up, it is very hard, because I can't do both," she said. "Obviously when I am in one place, I miss the other. So it is kind of never happy."

BCB XI take on Customs Club today

Touring Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) Eleven will take on Customs Club in their last Pool A match of the Wills Cup cricket tournament in Pakistan today at the Karachi National Stadium, reports UNB.

BCB XI are already out of the Wills Cup race losing two group matches in the three played so far.

Bangladesh lost to Habib Bank Limited by six wickets and went down to KCCA Blues by 66 runs. They earned a 116-run win over Bahawalpur team in their second engagement in Pool A.

Visiting BCB XI are likely to play two exhibition matches with local teams on March 24 and 25 before leaving for home on March 26.

Moody, Julian run amok

PERTH, Mar 22: Tom Moody and Brendon Julian launched a savage attack on Tasmania to virtually secure the Sheffield Shield title for Western Australia on Sunday, reports AP.

Moody scored 125 while Julian added 124, including 100 of just 76 balls, and then took a wicket with the last ball of the day.

After dismissing Tasmania for 285, the hosts piled on the runs, scoring 571 for a lead of 286.

At stumps on the third day, Tasmania were 92 for three, still needing 194 to make Western Australia bat again.

A draw would be enough to secure the trophy for the home side, but it looks set to wrap up a victory on day four of the five-day game.

Moody's century was his fourth in 10 Shield final innings and lifted his aggregate in Australian cricket's showpiece to 933 at 93.30.

But Julian's innings was the more spectacular and he scored 119 in the middle session for a fourth first-class hundred.

"I just batted, I wasn't trying to slog them — I just played my shots and I suppose I was lucky enough that it started to go my way," Julian said.

"It seems to be going my way at the moment and sometimes you hit a purple patch and you just have to cash in."

Aussie cricket world turned upside down

NEW DELHI, Mar 22 (AFP): Australia's reputation as the best cricket team in the world lay in tatters today as India celebrated its greatest triumph since the World Cup in 1983.

Australia's innings and 219-run defeat in the second Test at Calcutta on Saturday, which gave the hosts a decisive 2-0 lead in the three-match series, was India's biggest Test win ever.

Mark Taylor's Australians came to India with the world at their feet. Nine successive Test wins since 1994 earned them the tag of the unofficial world champions of Test cricket.

A month into the tour, however, confirmed the widely held belief that the Australians are poor tourists in the Indian subcontinent.

The last time Australia lost a Test series was in Pakistan in 1994. Taylor's men also suffered a seven-wicket defeat by India in a one-off Test in New Delhi in 1996.

But not even the most pessimistic Australian supporter could have bargained for what was to follow.

Writers covering the Indian tour reflected on the shame of Australia's defeat in the historical context. Both newspapers illustrated their dispatches with graphics detailing where the Calcutta capitulation ranked in Australia's worst Test defeats.

The all-time worst defeat was 60 years ago, an innings and 579 run loss to England at the Oval.

The Sunday Telegraph's Robert Craddock wrote: "Yet again it was a woeful batting display from a team who have batted worse this series than any Australian team for decades."

Statistics showed that five of Australia's top-order batsmen, excluding Steve Waugh, had scored 324 runs between them at 20.25 per dismissal in the first two Tests.

"For all the scorn poured on Australia's bowlers, the batsmen have been more guilty," said Craddock. "The futures of Greg Blewett and Michael Slater are under urgent review in this, the darkest hour of a bright decade for Australian cricket."

Blewett is averaging 9.7 and Slater 7.25, while skipper Mark Taylor has an average of 18.2.

Australia were thrashed by 179 runs in the first Test in Madras and in Calcutta suffered their worst defeat in 60 years.

Not since Don Bradman's team lost to England at the Oval in 1938 by an innings and 579 runs has Australia suffered such humiliation.

"We have to rethink our strategy", Taylor admitted. "Frankly, we don't have a clue as to how to stop the Indians."

The Indians basking in their 16th win in the last 27 home Tests are seeking a clean sweep when the third and final Test starts in Bangalore on Wednesday.

In 1993, India beat Graham Gooch's England and Sri Lanka by similar margins but to achieve the feat against an accomplished side like Australia was unthinkable a month ago.

It has been hard work all the way said Indian skipper Mohammad Azharuddin.

"Don't be misled by the big margins of victory, if Australia played badly it was because we did not allow them to play well. Test wins never come easy and we will have to continue the good work in Bangalore if a 3-0 feat is to be achieved."

Azharuddin, who was sacked as captain in 1996 amid poor form and a turbulent personal life, is clearly enjoying his second term at the helm.


Since taking over from Sachin Tendulkar early this year, the 34-year-old led India to victory over arch-rivals Pakistan in the Independence Cup in Bangladesh in January.

Now comes a success that Azharuddin and all India are proud of.

Former Test star Ravi Shastri said, India has never played better in a long time. "Azhar and the others have been just superb," he told AFP. "To make the Australians look like a side from Timbuctoo is very creditable."

Respected cricket critic Peter Roebuck wrote: "It isn't entirely a matter of subcontinental food or subcontinental pitches. It's too easy to make these excuses."

Leg-spin wizard Shane Warne's figures of 4-85, 1-122 and 0-147 in the three Test innings so far and the abject surrender by the top order batsmen tell their own tale.

There have been just three half-centuries by the first six Australian batsmen in the series so far, worse they have failed to cross 200 on 17 occasions.

Taylor said before the tour that he would feel the absence of the injured pace duo of Glenn McGrath and Jason Gillespie.

But scores of 328, 168, 233 and 181 on wickets where Indian batsmen have run up 418-4 and 633-5 would hardly have inspired both bowlers.

For once, the blame could not be laid on the usually treacherous Indian wickets. Both Taylor and Azharuddin admitted "there were good Test wickets" at both Madras and Calcutta.

Media gone mad down under

SYDNEY, Mar 22: Pathetic, woeful, substandard, soul-destroying... Australia's press spread no adjectives today in savaging their cricketers after one of the worst-ever Test defeats, reports AFP.

"Just one word describes our cricketers... pathetic," headlined Sydney's Sunday Telegraph in the wake of the innings and 219 run defeat against India at Calcutta. The Australians have lost the best-of-three series with a Test to play.

The rival Sunday newspaper, The Sun-Herald, wailed: "Oh, Calcutta. Our worst defeat in 60 years."

Writers covering the Indian tour reflected on the shame of Australia's defeat in the historical context. Both newspapers illustrated their dispatches with graphics detailing where the Calcutta capitulation ranked in Australia's worst Test defeats.

The all-time worst defeat was 60 years ago, an innings and 579 run loss to England at the Oval.
