"That game is something special. For each player it's the absolute highlight to play against Brazil," said the German captain, who made his international debut against Brazil 10 years ago.



South Africa were bowled out for 264 for the second time, leaving Sri Lanka a minimum of 132 overs to reach the daunting target at 2.86 runs an

Sri Lanka were the last team to score over 300 runs to win a Test. They scored 326 for five, after being set 325, against Zimbabwe at the Sinhalese Sports Club in Colombo in January this year. In fact, Sri Lanka have

passed 300 runs only four times in the fourth innings in their previous 81 Tests. They have chased successfully just once. A win here would be Sri

Lanka's fourth overseas to add to their wins over New Zealand and Pakistan (twice) South Africa made painstaking progress on either side of

the lunch break to gradually bat themselves to a strong position.

Hansie Cronje played a typical captain's innings, 74 runs, anchoring the innings for 17 minutes over three hours.


