Stampede kills 2 schoolgirls at Satkania

CHITTAGONG, Mar 23: Two students of Satkania Girls High School were killed and 30 others injured in a stampede today, reports UNB.

The tragic incident occurred when about 300 to 400 girls, frightened by the sound of thunder, rushed towards the staircase of the first floor of the school building.

The victims were identified as Papiya Rani Dhar, 13, of Class VII and Sohana Begum, 14, of Class VIII.

Of the injured, six were admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital and six others to Satkania Thana Health Complex.

Nor'westers kill 7 in 3 districts

At least seven people were killed and more than 100 injured as nor'westers swept parts of the country early yes-

terday morning, reports UNB. Four deaths were reported from Chuadanga, two from Rajbari and one from Tangail.

Gas price may increase by 60pc in 2 phases

A proposal for 60 per cent gas price hike in two phases is awaiting approval of the Cabinet, reports UNB. Energy Minister Nooruddin

Khan admitted that a proposal for gas price hike is awaiting consideration by the Cabinet. "The increase will be effective by the beginning of the next

fiscal year," he said. The ministry had suggested an increase of 31 per cent in the first phase with effect from the next month.

The minister justified his proposal saying it has become inevitable because of increase in gas price in the international market

Citing an example he said the price of per thousand CFT gas is around Tk 86 in Singapore, while in Bangladesh it is only Tk 54. The ministry has proposed

an increase of 31 per cent effective from April and another 29 per cent effective from October "If the price is not increased immediately, the country

would face tremendous loss when it starts buying gas of Sangu field from Cairn," said an official. According to the contact, Cairn owns 30 per cent of gas to be produce from Sangu field.
