

# IO says he had no knowledge of any foreign involvement

The investigation officer in Bangabandhu Murder Case yesterday said that during investigation he was not aware of any reported foreign involvement in the gruesome killings of country's founding President Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his family members of August 15, 1975, reports UNB.

Being cross-examined by a defence lawyer, the IO as well as the 61st prosecution witness in the case, ASP Abdul Kahhar Akhand, said he had neither gone through the papers about the reported involvement of Pakistan or India or America, nor investigated about the alle-

Advocate Khan Saifur Rahman, counsel for principal accused Lt Col (dismissed) Syed Farooqur Rahman, questioned the ASP of Criminal Investigation Department throughout the day's proceedings at the special eilash of Dhaka District and Sessions Judge Court.

Khan Saifur Rahman will further examine the IO when the court of District and Sessions Judge Kazi Golam Rasul resumes this morning.

"No. I didn't read the article of Annada Shankar Roy titled 'Changeover on August 15 and Role of India' and a September 24 letter of Indira Gandhi reacting to it," said Akhand replying to a query from the defence

He also informed that he didn't investigate into the alleged involvement of the then Indian government in the incident. "I can't recall whether I was informed during the investigation that the Indian army's Eastern Command HQs at Fort William in Calcutta had issued directives for the August 15 operation," the IO said.

The workshop titled "Situation of Migrant Workers and Regional Responsibility", held at the CIRDAP auditorium, was jointly organised by two local NGOs, CCDB and SHISUK, under the initiative of CARAM-Asia (Coordination of Action Research on AIDS and Migration), experts and NGO representatives from Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Vietnam, the Netherlands and Bangladesh took part in the

The country currently produces a total of 810 mcft per day as against the demand of around 1200 mcft.

Replying to a question the minister said supply from Sangu and Salda will add only about 180 meft per day.

He said me demand for gas is increasing everyday with the coming up of a number of gasbased industries.

The anand would increase at a level of 1500 mcft per day by the year 2000. "It may be more than that as the government has plans to encourage ting up more gas based industries," he added.

Nooruddin said considering the previous success rate, the government is hoping discovery of another 10 gas fields from the remaining 13 blocks.

"If the new fields produce 100 million CFT per day on an average, the total would reach to only to 1800 mcft," said the minister.

"So, how could we think of exporting gas when we could not meet our own requirement," he posed a question.

"We've taken steps to ensure all facilities for the welfare of the freedom fighters." she told the leaders of Muktijoddha Sanghati Parishad at her office in the afternoon.

A 39-member delegation of the Parishad. led by its Chairman Col (retd) Shawkat Ali MP and vice chairman State Minister for Land Rashed Mosharraf. called on the Prime Minister to apprise her of various problems of the freedom fighters.

The freedom fighters will have the priority in getting loans from the Employment Generation Bank and in other government sectors, she said.

#### Clinton greets Hasina US President William J Bill

Clinton has extended his best wishes to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on the occasion of the twenty-seventh anniversary of Bangladesh's Independence, reports UNB.

In a message to the Prime Minister yesterday. President Clinton said, "The American people and I join you and your fellow citizens in recalling the ideals of your nation's founders that are commemorated on March 26.

The US President hoped that the year ahead would provide new opportunities to strengthen the close relations that exist between the two countries.

#### No Indian citizen entered CHT, Minister refutes allegation

The government vesterday outright rejected an opposition allegation in Parliament that Indian citizens intruded into the country during the repatriation of tribal refugees, reports No Indian citizen entered

into Bangladesh as the papers of the tribal refugees were properly verified before they returned to their homeland," Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru

His denial came while answering a supplementary of Akhtar Hamid Siddiqui (BNP-Naogaon).

Khasru, who is in charge of Special Affairs Division in Parliament, said representatives from both India and Bangladesh had prepared the list of refugees.

Later, the lists were properly verified and refugees identified by the Bangladesh authorities before their return to the three hill districts, he added. In reply to ABM Abul

Kashem (AL-Chittagong), the minister said some 64,433 tribal refugees of 12,222 families returned to their homesteads in the Chittagong Hill Tracts from camps in the Indian state of Tripura. "Now there is none to re-

turn," he told the House, adding that Tk 39,82,14,510 were spent to rehabilitate the tribal refugees in the hill districts.

The country presently produces 810 million CFT per day. The total estimated demand is around 1200 million CFT per day. Additional 160 million CFT per day would be available from Sangu offshore gas field.

#### Petroleum

Another report says, the government has no plan to reduce the prices of petroleum products in near future although the price of crude oil has gone down substantially in the international market.

According to sources in the Energy Ministry, Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation (BPC) is yet to recover the loss of Tk 450 crore it sustained during the last financial year.

The crude oil price in the international market declined sharply to 11.9 US dollar a barrel from around 20 US dollar last year.

## Rice stock sufficient, Matia tells traders

Star Report

Wholesalers of rice have urged the government to take measures to check further price hike of the commodity.

They told Agriculture and

Food Minister Matia Chowdhury on Sunday that rice price increased in the last few days because of its inadequate supply in district level markets. A team of wholesalers met the minister at her Secretariat

office. The minister had called them to know the reasons for the sudden price hike of rice. The team included some wholesalers from districts. She told the traders that the

government had sufficient stock of rice and that its import would be increased further. Matia said, there were

1,92,000 MT of rice in stock and one lakh MT is going to be imported soon in addition to import of 1.5 lakh MT earlier. Daily import of rice from India increased to 18,000 MT on Saturday from 10,000 MT earlier. The import was less a few days ago due to 'Holy Festival' in India, she told the traders. She later told The Daily Star

that the traders assured her that the price would fall with increase in supply.

The traders also told Matia that disruption in ferry service, time-consuming import procedure and rail transportation and devaluation of the Taka also caused the price hike. The minister told them that

a separate ferry ghat would be set up at Notakhola for transportation of rice and that rice trucks would get priority in ferries in other ghats. Responding to a demand from the traders, she also told them that more space would be given in trains for transporting rice from northern districts.

He said imported rice was being sold at local markets in Jessore, Khulna, and Rajshahi. "Consequently, we are getting fewer consignments from bordering districts." Abdullah added. Abdur Rahman, another
