



tain to be axed, England made it to 173 for three in their second innings by stumps on the penultimate day.

When the West Indies declared mid-morning at 500 for seven, it left England needing 373 to avoid an innings defeat and a 3-1 series loss.

EU-CFO feud intensifies

BRUSSELS, Mar 24: World Cup organisers on Monday refused to reserve the remaining tickets for the soccer finals for foreigners, and the European Union said it would start a legal battle to get those seats filled with non-French fans, reports

The Executive Commission of the 15-nation EU said it could fine the CFO World Cup organising committee as much as 10 per cent of all its sales for the June 10-July 12 finals if no change in ticket allocation was made.

Complaining that a large majority of the 2.5 million tickets already had been sold in the host nation, the EU Commission said the remaining 160,000 seats should go exclusively to non-French fans.

The French government has already called this discriminatory and the CFO Director General Jacques Lambert called EU headquarters Monday to say that this was unacceptable. The CFO wants to reserve the

remaining tickets on a firstcome first-served basis, treating French and foreign fans equally, said EU Commission spokesman Stefan Rating. The EC's demands "would

have meant inverse discrimination against the French and constituted a gross injustice." said Jacques Lambert, the CFO's managing director, on Monday

Rating said the Commission's demand to sell all remaining tickets to foreigners only "was a tiny discrimination compared" to the favoritism shown earlier in the selling campaign.

Now the Commission is expected to send a formal statement of objection early Tuesday, the opening shot in a legal
