the ICC's Code of Conduct for players.



The tourists ended a profitable third day's play by taking three Indian second-innings wickets to set up a thrilling fi-

The Indians, ahead by 24 on the first innings, were 99 for three at close, 123 ahead with seven wickets in hand.

Navjot Sidhu gave the Indians a flying start with six fours and a six in his 44, before falling six short of a fifth successive half-century in the se-




