

**One-match ban on Ganguly**

BANGALORE, India, Mar 27: India batsman Saurav Ganguly was handed a one-match ban today by International Cricket Council (ICC) match referee Peter Van Der Merwe for showing dissent over an umpiring decision in the final Test against Australia, reports Reuters.

Ganguly must sit out the first match of a triangular limited-over series against Australia on April 1.

The suspension came under the ICC's Code of Conduct for players.

**Waugh ton tunes up tourists**

BANGALORE, India, Mar 27 (AFP): Mark Waugh hit a career-best 153 not out today as Australia's batting finally came good during the third and final Test against India here.

The Australians, soundly thrashed in the first two Tests and looking in danger of a clean sweep after India ran up 424 in their first innings, responded with 400 their highest score in the series.

The tourists ended a profitable third day's play by taking three Indian second-innings wickets to set up a thrilling finale.

The Indians, ahead by 24 on the first innings, were 99 for three at close, 123 ahead with seven wickets in hand.

Navjot Sidhu gave the Indians a flying start with six fours and a six in his 44, before falling six short of a fifth successive half-century in the series.

He fell in the leg-spin off Shane Warne, who had earlier

removed Venkat Laxman, caught in the covers for 15.

Off-spinner Gavin Robertson then had Rahul Dravid caught behind by wicketkeeper Ian Healy for four shortly before the close.

At stumps, Sachin Tendulkar was unbeaten on 27, while Mohammad Azharuddin was on four after surviving a torrid over from Michael Kasprovic.

Waugh, who came in before tea on the second day at 77-2, held his end up for five-and-a-half hours as wickets tumbled at the other end.

He hit 13 boundaries and four sixes while surpassing his previous best of 140 against England at Brisbane during the 1994-95 season.

Leg-spinner Anil Kumble ensured India a narrow lead with six for 98, taking his tally in the series to 22 wickets in five innings.

Waugh and Darren Lehmann added 106 runs for the fourth wicket. Waugh also was involved in another good partnership of 64 runs with Warne.

Warne, who scored 33 runs, later tested the Indian batsmen bowling outside the leg stump and the ball sometimes turning yards.

Waugh, resuming at 58, began the day with a second six off Venkatapathy Raju which hit the roof of the Chinnaswamy Stadium at midwicket.

He hit Raju for two more sixes. On Thursday Waugh had edged the same bowler onto his stumps without dislodging the balls.

Darren Lehmann, 35 overnight in his first Test match, reached his half-century by cutting Raju for his eighth boundary.

The stroke also brought up the century stand for the fourth wicket with Waugh, but Lehmann had little time to celebrate.

The left-hander was caught at silly point in the next over, the first in the day by 17-year-old off-spinner Harbhajan Singh.

Kumble returned after lunch to polish off the tail, leaving Waugh stranded at the other end. It was Kumble's 11th five-wicket haul in 46 Tests.

Australian wicketkeeper Ian Healy was caught behind by Nayan Mongia off Anil Kumble for just four runs.

Ricky Ponting was in all sorts of trouble against Kumble. He could only add 16 runs to the Australian total before being caught by Sachin Tendulkar at first slip off the India leggie.

Of the Australian tail-enders only Warne offered resistance before being caught by Harbhajan Singh after he went for a big hit off Venkatapathy Raju.

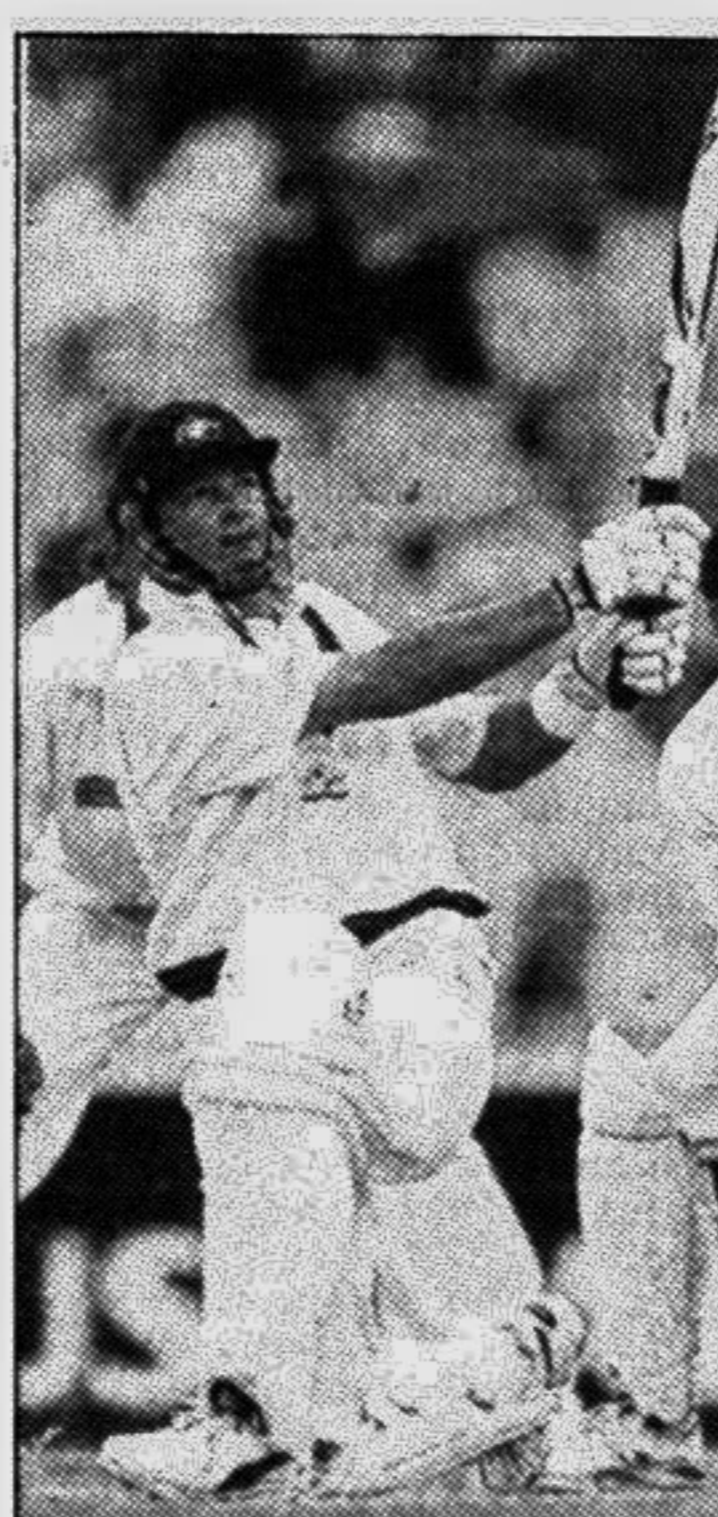

**Serena's big sister does it**

KEY BISCAIYNE, Florida, Mar 27 (Reuters, AP): The new grand slam in women's tennis, and it takes place every time Venus Williams hits an overhead.

The acrobatic shot was part of an overpowering performance Thursday by Williams, who beat Martina Hingis 6-2, 5-7, 6-2 in the semifinals at the Lipton Championships.

The upset in the showdown of 17-year-olds won't affect Hingis' No 1 ranking, but it might shuffle the balance of power on the WTA Tour. Hingis has now lost twice this year to the 11th-ranked Williams, who will break into the top 10 next week for the first time.

"I haven't arrived yet," Williams said. "I'm just coming. I'm on my way."

The final Saturday will be another all-teen affair, with Williams facing 16-year-old Anna Kournikova for the first time. Kournikova earned her first berth in a final by beating a top-10 player for the fourth day in row when she rallied past No 8 Arantxa Sanchez Vicario 3-6, 6-1, 6-3.

Kournikova, ranked 25th, earlier eliminated No 2 Lindsay Davenport, No 9 Conchita Martinez and No 4 Monica Seles.

"For sure, the youngsters are coming," Hingis said.

In the men's quarterfinals, Andre Agassi continued his resurgence by beating Jeff Tarango 6-4, 6-3. Agassi's opponent in the semifinals Friday night will be Alex Corretja, who beat qualifier Steve Campbell 6-3, 6-1.

Meanwhile, Britain's Tim Henman reached his first semifinal on American soil on Wednesday with a confident 6-2, 6-4 quarterfinal victory over Gustavo Kuerten of Brazil.

**ANZ Grindlays win handsomely**

Appalling batting followed by some diabolically poor fielding forced The Daily Star to concede a six-wicket defeat to ANZ Grindlays Bank, who brandished some quality and experienced cricketers, in a supposedly friendly cricket match played at the lush BUET ground yesterday.

Chasing an unimpressive Daily Star total of 101 in the stipulated 30 overs, resulting from a massive collapse after the third wicket, the winners scored 104 for the loss of four wickets with more than 14 overs to spare, thanks to an undefeated but not leakproof knock of 42 from middle-order bat Atique. The generous right-handed banker was dropped four times but that was due to the tired-from-writing fingers of the journalists.

Among others, opener Sabir and one down Sohail contributed with 15 runs each.

Right-arm pacer Rabeed Imam of Daily Star captured two of the four ANZ wickets while captain Morshed and offie Zia shared the other two.

Earlier, electing to bat first, which proved not to be a judicious decision, the pressmen could muster only 101 runs before they were all out in the last ball of their innings.

Middle-order bat Rabeed topped scored with 28 that included the lone over-boundary of the day and two timely hits across the rope while one down Morshed chipped in with 21. Recently-promoted (not in the batting order) Chandrashekar (15) was the other batsman to reach a double figure.

A pall of gloom fell on the Daily Star office as news of their second consecutive defeat reached Dhanmondi. Reader Subrata failed to read the line and swung mercilessly only to be stumped smartly by the bank keeper. Al-Amin forced three bankers to raise their hands in prayer as he lofted a high catch two feet away and that of one was answered with the Sports Reporter illustrating his declining form with subsequent scores of 8, 4 and one.

Star's umpire Hasan Masood was cheered by the bankers, particularly for turning a blind eye when their top-scorer Atique was caught behind in his very first ball. That was the turning point of the match.

**BCB, Badhir Krira go to polls today**

The elections of Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) and Badhir Krira Sangha will be held at the National Sports Council today from 11 am to 4 pm.

Not surprisingly, interest will mainly focus on the BCB elections where 123 out of a possible 125 councilors are likely to cast their votes. Jesore and Comilla Education Boards are not taking part in the elections.

Forty-two candidates are contesting for 29 Executive Committee posts of a federation which has been able to draw public appeal due to the improved performance of our cricketers in recent years.

A panel of the Jaty Shom-milto Parisad, is vying for all the posts which includes five vice-presidents, a general secretary and treasurer, two joint-secretaries and 20 members.

Syed Ashrafu Haque and Afzalur Rahman Sinha from the Parisad, have already been elected unopposed General Secretary and Treasurer respectively. There are seven candidates for the five vice-president posts while four are competing for two positions of Joint Secretaries. Besides, 29 candidates have filed their nominations for member posts.

In the Badhir Krira Sangsta elections, 33 candidates are competing to sit in the 19-member Executive Committee of which AM Mohiul Islam has been elected as Treasurer unopposed.

**Azhar takes 100th catch**

BANGALORE, India, Mar 27: Indian skipper Mohammad Azharuddin today became the second Indian to take 100 catches in Test cricket, reports AFP.

Azharuddin reached the mark when he caught Gavin Robertson off Anil Kumble at silly point, joining an elite club of 12 other international cricketers (not wicketkeepers), in the world.

Sunil Gavaskar is the only other Indian player to attain the feat, with 108 catches.

The other players to take 100 catches are Australians Bob Simpson, Greg Chappell, Ian Chappell, Allan Border and Mark Taylor, England's Wally Hammon, Colin Cowdrey, Ian Botham and Graham Gooch as well as Gary Sobers and Viv Richards of the West Indies.

**Lankans stem early slump**

CENTURION, South Africa, Mar 27: An unbeaten 97-run partnership between captain Arjuna Ranatunga and Roshan Mahanama enabled Sri Lanka to build a solid position on the first day of the second Test against an injury-hit South Africa at Centurion Park today, reports AFP.

With no play possible after tea because of bad light and rain, Sri Lanka were 165 for three at close of play with Ranatunga unbeaten on 40 and Mahanama 44 not out.

South Africa suffered a major blow when all-rounder Shaun Pollock limped off with a groin injury in the third over after lunch. His over had to be completed by fellow fast bowler Makhaya Ntini.
