Law minister on proposed CHT Bill

It's just a local govt bill, no need to amend Constitution

Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru has said that the proposed Bill on the CHT peace accord will not require any amendment to the Constitu-

Talking to UNB he said this is just a local government bill prepared within the meaning of Article 59 and 60 of the Constitution and it will be passed by Parliament in a simple major-

The Law Minister refuted BNP chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia's contention that the government is planning to amend the Constitution to legitimise the accord.

"No, the government has no

such plan since the Bill will not require any amendment to the Constitution," Khasru said. Asked whether autonomy

was granted to the CHT under the proposed Regional Council, he said the Regional Council will just be a coordinating body of the three hill district councils of Khagrachhari, Rangamati and Bandarban.

Khasru categorically said the planned Regional Council will not hurt the unitary character of the State.

He said the preamble of the peace accord clearly stated that the National Committee on the CHT and the PCJSS signed the agreement within the ambit of

the Constitution keeping allegiance to state sovereignty and territorial integrity.

The accord, he said, was signed to uphold political, social, cultural and economic rights of all citizens in the CHT and expedite socio-economic development there and preserve respective rights of all citizens of Bangladesh

The Law Minister said Article 9 of the Constitution says that the State shall encourage local government institutions. composed of representatives of the area concerned.

Vajpayee wins trust vote by narrow margin

NEW DELHI, Mar 28: Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee who compromised his party's Hindu nationalist ideology to come to power, today won a crucial parliamentary vote of confidence by a narrow margin, reports AP.

The last minute support of a southern regional party with 12 lawmakers and the abstention of two smaller groups from northern India helped Vajpay-ee's Bharatiya Janata Party-led coalition scrape through.

Two hundred and seventyfour lawmakers cast their votes in favour of Vajpayee and 261 voted against his government. The announcement of the re-

sults were accompanied by loud thumping and cheering. The wafer thin majority indicated how vulnerable the government was to pulls and pushes by its supporters. Already an ally has said its support can not be taken for



Gorai re-excavation to save Sundarbans from salinity

KUSHTIA. Mar 28: The government has taken up a 250 million US dollar plan to revive the river Gorai, a 200-mile (320-km) lifeline to the Sundarbans, the world's largest mangrove forest, officials said here on Thursday. Re-excavation work will

start in June next.

"We are planning to re-excavate the river to restore life to it during the dry season so that it can carry the vital sweet water to the Sundarbans from the Padma," Atiar Rahman, Director of Water Development Board, said. The Gorai dries up in the


