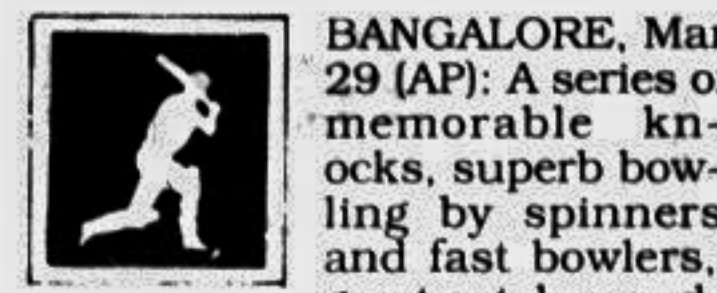

A series of superb showings



BANGALORE, Mar 29 (AP): A series of memorable knock-outs, superb bowling by spinners and fast bowlers, great catches and great electric fielding marked the just-concluded Test series between Australia and India, which the latter won.

After their triumphant series against New Zealand and South Africa, the Australians flew into the southern Indian city of Madras, sporting the tag of Test cricket's unofficial world champions.

With victories in nine Test series, the Australians nurtured hopes of winning the first series in the subcontinent. In the first Test, the visitors led by Mark Taylor, held the upper hand. Then Sachin Tendulkar stepped in with a brilliant century. The Australians lost the game by 179 runs.

On to Calcutta. The Australians were drubbed by an innings within four days. Finally to the southern garden city of Bangalore, Taylor's team faced the prospect of a crushing defeat. But they bounced back and salvaged pride. The eight-wicket victory saved them.

Looking back, Tendulkar ran up an amazing Test record: 4 and 155 not out (first Test), 79 (second) and 177 and 31 (third Test). A destroyer in the Viv Richards mold, Tendulkar logged a stunning 446 runs in the series.

Australia had their heroes too: wicketkeeper Ian Healy in the first Test, a pugacious rearguard 91 and Mark Waugh and Taylor in the last Test. Waugh's 153 not out reinforced his standing as one of the best batsmen in the world. Taylor's unconquered 102 reflected the Australian grit.

The player-of-the-match award went to fast bowlers in two of the three Tests: Javagal Srinath in Calcutta and Michael Kasprovwicz in Bangalore. Both showed great zest. Leg-spinner Anil Kumble bagged a rich haul of 23 wickets, emerging from six months in the dumps.

And what about Shane Warne, the sheikh of tweak? He bowled some outstanding spells, but his 10 wickets cost a lot of runs. In all, he sent down 167 overs, conceded 540 runs in five innings. His curbers, flippers, huge leg-breaks and the odd googly were in working order. But the Indians tackled Warne with aplomb, with steely wrists and dancing feet. By the time the Australians got acclimatised to the conditions in India, the series was over. "A pity the series ended short," said Jeff Thompson, the great fast bowler. "A couple of more Test matches, with the Australians on the way up and the Indians on the way down, it would have been thrilling."

Australia move on to the triangular one-day series, with India and Zimbabwe under the leadership of Steve Waugh.

'I may give up captaincy'

SYDNEY, Mar 29 (Sydney Morning Herald/Reuters): Mark Taylor gave a strong hint today that he may quit as Australia Test captain before the series against Pakistan in September.

But even if he does stand down as skipper, Taylor did not rule out the possibility of playing on as an opening batsman under a new captain. Speaking in the aftermath of Australia's 2-1 loss to India in a three-Test series, Taylor said he would make a decision about his future over the next few months.

"When you captain a side for four years you want to go on for ever but it is something I will have to think about," Taylor told Australian Radio from India. The burly left-hander is unhappy about the disruption caused by Australia's decision to select separate limited overs and Test sides, saying it hurt team morale and unity. "Unfortunately, the problem goes right to the top because we have two captains," said Taylor, who was axed as one-day captain and opener last December. Taylor will fly home next week, leaving Steve Waugh to captain Australia's one-day side in a triangular competition involving hosts India and Zimbabwe.

"I think I am still doing my job as an opening batsman so I might be in there (the Test team) somewhere but as a leader, I don't know," Taylor said. "I've got to understand where other people are coming from. I don't make all the decisions in Australian cricket. I make less now that I did a year ago, when I was captain of both sides. I think that feeling has gone through the side. There are too many people who are not really sure where they're going at the moment in Australian cricket."

Taylor, who has been Test captain since Allan Border's retirement in mid-1994, led the one-day team until 1997, when his batting form no longer justified his place in the shorter game. Incidentally, his unbeaten 102 on Saturday, leading Australia to an eight-wicket win — their first in India in 29 years — was at the same ground as his sole limited-over century, scored in 1996.

He said he would call for closed-door meetings with selectors, board officials and players during the off-season, to determine a more cohesive plan for the future. "We have to look at the set-up of Australian cricket," he said. "I don't think this is a setting process, having two different teams and different captains." Taylor admitted he would find it strange playing Test cricket under another captain. Asked if he would feel comfortable, he said: "I don't really know. You get a sense of ownership of the team, I suppose, having been captain for four years. I don't know how I'd go."

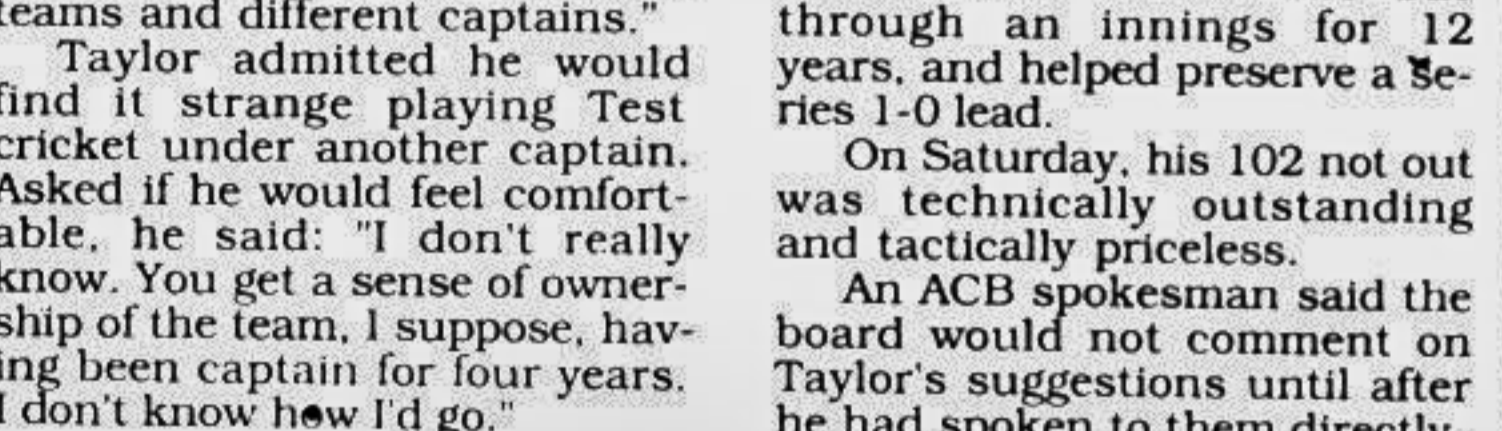
There are recent precedents for an Australian captain to stand aside in this manner. After five years as captain, Ian Chappell played under brother Greg in 1975-76 and 1979-80. And Greg Chappell played his last Australian summer under the captaincy of Kim Hughes, having led Australia from 1975-77 and 1979-83.

It would be a remarkable transition for Taylor to continue as a batsman only. For the first half of 1997, his batting form was so bad he admitted he was only worth his place in the Test team because his captaincy was contributing to their winning series in Australia and South Africa. But since his last-ditch century against England in Edgbaston, he has regained his stature as an opening batsman. While lacking the consistency of his pre-1997 years, he has in the past year scored four Test centuries, more than any other Australian batsman. Mark Waugh has scored three, Matthew Elliott three, Steve Waugh two and Ricky Pointing two.

Moreover, Taylor's centuries have come at critical times. His 112 against New Zealand in Brisbane rescued Australia from 4-52 on the first morning and set up a win in that Test match. His unbeaten 169 against South Africa in Adelaide was the first time an Australian had carried his bat through an innings for 12 years, and helped preserve a 3-1 lead. On Saturday, his 102 not out was tactically priceless.

An ACB spokesman said the board would not comment on Taylor's suggestions until after he had spoken to them directly.

FRANCE '98 SIDELINES

UNDATED, Mar 29 (AP): The President of Argentina supports England's bid to stage the World Cup in 2006. That's provided Argentina isn't bidding to host it.

The prime minister met a delegation from the English Football Association, including 1966 star Bobby Charlton, sports minister Tony Banks and bid leader Alec McGivan, on Friday. Although Argentina is thinking of making its own bid, Menem told them he would support England's bid if theirs didn't happen.
