Johansson, a 68-year-old Swedish businessman, wants more openness in FIFA and

more power to the regional confederations. As UEFA president since 1990, he has transformed European club competitions into money-spinners, especially the prestigious Champions League.

Blatter's proposal Monday to open FIFA's doors was similar to Johansson's.

Platini said: "With Sepp Blatter, football will be in the hands of millions of people, not just three or four."

They proposed annual gatherings between FIFA, players, coaches and referees, with meetings rotating between continents. Blatter also wants to enlarge FIFA's executive committee.

Blatter said he would not tamper with the rules of soccer. At the grassroots level, he said there was a need for better financing of facilities and training areas for young players and coaches in poorer coun-

He also promised funds to help educate young players so they can look forward to a career once their playing days are

Players, Platini said, would have more say on matters such as kick-off times, transfers, competition dates and rules.

That was likely to strike a chord with many players who have responded to former Argentine captain Diego Maradona's call to form a players' union to address such matters. So far, the planned union has had trouble getting off the

"Our goal is to guide football into the 21st century by protecting its greatest asset the game itself," Blatter said.

Blatter will give up some of his day-to-day administrative duties at FIFA over the next two months to avoid a conflict of interests. But his involvement in the organisation of the World Cup finals in France will not

change. He said he already had written support from the United States, Venezuela, Guyana, Qatar, Uruguay, Libya, Algeria, Australia, Argentina, Bolivia. Brazil, Jamaica, Lebanon, and Saudi Arabia.

He said he expected strong backing from European confederations once they've had to time to reflect on his candidacy.

"If we (at FIFA) are criticised for being undemocratic, that's mistaken," he said. "But we need to the tools to implement good democracy." Havelange has made no se-

cret of his backing for Blatters. UEFA General Secretary Gerhard Ainger, in a UEFA editorial published Monday, blasted Havelange for mounting "a deplorable drama" to secure a Blatter victory.

He accused Havelange of launching an unprecedented barrage of "attacks and degrading remarks" against Johans-

The Brazilian is determined to stop Johansson taking over and has publicly supported Blatter, who has been his right hand man with the Zurichbased organisation for the past 16 years.

Even a failed attempt by Blatter fours years ago to oust Havelange seems to have been forgotten by the outgoing presi-

"It is no secret that Havelange is supporting me," said

Blatter on Monday. "Once he was in front of me, now he is behind me," joked the Swiss-German.
